FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT, 1901.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice, in pursuance of Section 80 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, that he proposes to make new Regulations under Section 79 of the Act, in substitution for the Regulations dated 27th July, 1925, for the lifting by hand of heavy weights in the manufacture, dyeing or finishing of woollen or worsted textiles

ing of woollen or worsted textiles.

Copies of the Regulations proposed to be made may be obtained on application to the Chief Inspector of Factories, Home Office, London, S.W. 1.

Objections to the draft Regulations by or on behalf of any persons affected by the Regulations must be sent to the Secretary of State, Home Office, London, S.W. 1, within 30 days from the date of this notice. Every such objection must be in writing and must state (a) the draft Regulations or portions of draft Regulations objected to; (b) the specific grounds of objection; and (c) the omissions, additions or modifications asked for.
