URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL OF DENBY AND CUMBERWORTH.

PUBLIC HEALTH ACTS AMENDMENT ACT, 1907.

BY an Order dated the twenty-fourth day of August 1926, the Minister of Health has declared that, on and after the 18th day of October 1926 the following provisions of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907, shall be in force in the Urban District of Denby and Cumberworth, namely:—

Part II (streets and buildings), other than Sections 24, 27 and 31;

Part III (sanitary provisions), other than Section 51;

Part IV (infectious diseases), other than Sections 61, 66 and 67;

Part V (common lodging-houses); and

Part VI (recreation grounds).

The above provisions are declared to be in force subject, as regards Sections 30, 35, 38 and 75 to the conditions specified in the Order.

PUBLIC HEALTH ACTS AMENDMENT ACT, 1907.

PUBLIC HEALTH ACT, 1925.

BY an Order taking effect on the 1st day of October, 1926, the Minister of Health has consented to the adoption by the Urban District Council of Gosforth of section 21 (prevention of water flowing on footpath), section

22 (prevention of soil etc., being washed into streets) and section 44 (offensive trades), and the sections contained in Part V (watercourses, &c.), of the Public Health Act, 1925, and has declared the provisions of Parts VI (recreation grounds) of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907, and of the Public Health Act, 1925, respectively, to be in force in the Urban District of Gosforth.
