

## MINISTRY OF HEALTH.

## PUBLIC HEALTH ACT, 1925.

By an Order dated 20th October, 1926, the Minister of Health has consented (1) to the adoption of Section 21 (prevention of water flowing on footpath), Section 22 (preventing soil &c., from being washed into streets), Section 44 (offensive trades), and the Sections contained in Part V (watercourses &c.) of the above Act by the Town Councils of Newport (Isle of Wight) and Wrexham, and the Urban District Councils of East Dereham and Wealdstone; (2) to the adoption of the said Sections 21, 22 and 44 of the Act by the Town Council of Beverley, and the Urban District Councils of Barnoldswick and Witham; (3) to the adoption of the said Sections 21 and 44 of the Act by the Urban District Council of East and West Molesey; and (4) to the adoption of the said Section 44 of the Act by the Town Council of Liskeard.

 THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACTS,  
1888 AND 1894.

Whereas in pursuance of Section 54 of the Local Government Act, 1888, a representation has been made to the Minister of Health by the Council of the City of New Sarum that it is desirable that, by a Provisional Order under the said Act:—

(a) the boundary of the said City should be altered so as to include within the City:—

(1) part of the Parish of Bemerton in the Rural District of Wilton:

(2) part of the Parish of Stratford-sub-Castle in the Rural District of Salisbury:

(3) part of the Parish of Laverstock and Ford in the Rural District of Salisbury:

(4) part of the Parish of West Harnham in the Rural District of Salisbury: and that

(b) the remainder of the Parish of West Harnham should be added to the Parish of Netherhampton in the Rural District of Wilton:

And whereas a Provisional Order issued under the said Act may be made for any of the purposes mentioned in Sections 54 and 59 of the said Act, and may also amend any Local and Personal Act:

And whereas under Section 297 of the Public Health Act, 1875, any Act confirming any Provisional Order made in pursuance of any of the Sanitary Acts, or of that Act, may be repealed, altered or amended by Provisional Order made by the Minister of Health and confirmed by Parliament:

And whereas it is proposed that a Provisional Order should be made by the Minister of Health for carrying into effect the proposal contained in the said representation, or such other proposal as he may deem expedient, and that such Order should, so far as seems necessary or proper for the purpose thereof, provide for the matters specified in Section 54 or

Section 59 of the Local Government Act, 1888, and Section 54 of the Local Government Act, 1894, or some of them, and should, so far as appears to be necessary, amend the provisions of the Local Acts in force in the City or in any area to be affected by such Order, and of the Acts confirming Provisional Orders made under the Sanitary Acts or the Public Health Act, 1875, and relating to the City or any area to be affected, or of some of such Acts:

Taylor, Esq., M.Inst.C.E., M.I.M.E., one of the Inspectors of the Ministry of Health, will attend at The Council House, Salisbury, on Wednesday, the Seventeenth day of November, 1926, at Ten o'clock in the forenoon, to hold a Local Inquiry into the subject-matter of the said proposal and all other matters relating thereto:

And notice is hereby further given that any person interested may attend at such Inquiry and be heard with reference to the said proposal and the other matters aforesaid.

 THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACTS,  
1888 AND 1894.

And whereas under Section 297 of the Public Health Act, 1875, any Act confirming any Provisional Order made in pursuance of any of the Sanitary Acts, or of that Act, may be repealed, altered or amended by Provisional Order made by the Minister of Health and confirmed by Parliament:

And whereas it is proposed that a Provisional Order should be made by the Minister of Health for carrying into effect the proposal contained in the said representation, or such other proposal as he may deem expedient, and that such Order should, so far as seems necessary or proper for the purpose thereof, provide for the matters specified in Section 54 or Section 59 of the Local Government Act, 1888, and Section 54 of the Local Government Act, 1894, or some of them, and should, so far as appears to be necessary, amend the provisions of the Local Acts in force in the Borough or in any area to be affected by such Order, and of the Acts confirming Provisional Orders
