The 27th our Army lay still; We were informed by General Nebem, that the Enemy passed the Time the day before; This was confirmed the 28th; We had also an account, that they encamped near Cupin, and that some of their Troops had appeared in fight of Titul; Hereupon it was resolved that the whole Army should march thither; accordingly we decamped the fame evening, but the next morning received advice from General Nohem, that he was on the 28th engaged most part of the day with the Enemy, who attackt him in his Camp near Titul, and were feveral times beaten off, but receiving fresh Reinforcements, and their whole Army coming on, he thought it advisable to retire towards our main Army, as he did, having lost 3 or 400 Men, and the Enemy as many at least; The Radziens at the same time quitted the Town; and the Turks burnt it. We understood that General Rabutin, with the Forces from Transitvania, was come to Arath; and Orders were fent him to hasten his march to us. The 30th we came to the Camp where we now are; This day we have an account, that the Ottoman Army has passed the River Theysic; Whereupon we are going to march; General Rabutin will join us to morrow, and having drawn all our Forces together, 'tis resolved to advance directly towards the Enemy, and offer

Vienna, Sept. 4. We are in expectation to hear of a great Action in Hungary; for when the last Courier came away, which was the first Instantin the morning, the Imperial Army, who had made feveral Motions to meet and join the Forces from Transilvania, were on their much, in a very good condition, and resolved to fight the Enemy, (whose defign feem'd to be upon Peter-Waradin) and 'twas thought there might be a Battle yesterday or this day. Humburgh, Sept. 14. The last Letters from Dresden inform us, that divers Persons of Quality, of the Saxon Court, were gone to Gracow, to affift at the King of Poland's Coronation; where would be a great concourse of the Gentry of that Kingdom; several of whom had offered to raise Troops for his Assistance against all those that should oppose him; They tell us also, that the Chief of the French Party kept together at Warfam, in expectation of the Prince of Conti's arrival, whom they had invited by feveral Mefsengers; There is at present no more talk of a new Election; each side is resolved to maintain their Election; so that the Sword is like to determine the Dispute.

Paris, Sept. 13. The Count de Toulouse, Admiral of France, and the Duke d'Elbeuf, who made the Campagne in Flanders, returned hither two days ago. A Veffel is come to Dunkirke who met the 5 Ships commanded by Dubart, the Prince of Couri being on board one of them, about 20 Leagues at Sea, Steering Northwards. The Bishop of Orleans, who is now called Cardinal de Coassin received last Tuesday his Cap from the French Kings Hands, in the Chapel at Versailles. 'Tis said that 20 Battalions are ordered towards
