

Confirmation of lines of pipes and ancillary works in parish of Hawksworth in rural district of Wharfedale and in urban district of Burley-in-Wharfedale and now used for obtaining a supply of water in bulk from Burley-in-Wharfedale Urban District Council.

Agreements between Company, Burley-in-Wharfedale Urban District Council, Wharfedale Rural District Council and owners, &c. with respect to such lines of pipes and conveyance of water thereby and supply of water by contracting parties to each other.

Acquisition &c. by agreement of lands, easements, &c.

Additional capital: Confirmation of issued share capital and other financial provisions.

Rates and charges; Supply to public institutions &c.; Modification of Section 35 of Waterworks Clauses Act, 1847; Penalties &c.

Incorporation, extension, amendment of Acts, &c.

Plans and sections showing the lines situations and levels of the works to be authorised or sanctioned and confirmed by the Bill, the plans showing also the lands and other property in which those works will be constructed or are situate and the lands which may be taken compulsorily or in respect of which easements may be acquired as aforesaid under the powers of the Bill, together with a book of reference to such plans containing the names of the owners and lessees or reputed owners and lessees and of the occupiers of such lands and other property will on or before the 30th day of November be deposited for public inspection with the Clerk of the Peace for the West Riding of the County of York at his office at the County Hall, Wakefield, and on or before the same day a copy of so much of the said plans and sections and book of reference as relates to each of the areas hereinafter mentioned will be deposited for public inspection as follows (that is to say)—

So far as relates to the urban district of Burley-in-Wharfedale with the Clerk to the Council of that district at his office at Burley-in-Wharfedale; and

So far as relates to the said parish of Hawksworth in the rural district of Wharfedale with the Clerk to the Council of that district at his office at Boroughgate, Otley and with the Chairman of the Parish Meeting of Hawksworth at his residence at Sunnyside Farm, Hawksworth.

On and after the 21st December, 1926, a copy of the Bill may be inspected and copies may be obtained at the price of three shillings per copy at the offices of the under-mentioned Solicitors and Parliamentary Agents.

A Notice stating the objects of the intended Act, has been or will be published in full in the Wharfedale and Airedale Observer of the 19th and 26th November, 1926.

WEST CHESHIRE WATER BOARD.

NOTICE is hereby given that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the ensuing Session by the West Cheshire Water Board (hereinafter referred to as "the Board") for an Act for all or some of the following purposes (that is to say):—

To empower the Board to purchase and to require the Hoylake and West Kirby Urban District Council (hereinafter referred to as "the Hoylake Council") to sell under and in pursuance of the provisions of section 90 of the Hoylake and West Kirby Urban District Council Act 1925 the part of their water undertaking defined hereunder (hereinafter called the "North Wirral undertaking") for the price or consideration and on the terms and conditions to be prescribed by the Bill, and to provide for the transfer of the North Wirral undertaking on such day as may be agreed between the Board and the Hoylake Council or on such day as may be prescribed by the Bill, and to vest the North Wirral undertaking in the Board under and by virtue of the intended Act.

In this Notice "the North Wirral undertaking" means the part of the water undertaking of the Hoylake Council situate in the Wirral Rural District (except the Newton Estate as defined in the Sixth Schedule to the Hoylake and West Kirby Urban District Council Act 1925 and the 10 inch rising main from the Newton Pumping Station of the Hoylake Council to the urban district of Hoylake and West Kirby) and all the rights, powers and privileges vested in the Hoylake Council within the rural district of Wirral in relation to the supply of water, including mains, pipes, meters and apparatus laid by the Hoylake Council within the said rural district after the passing of the intended Act but prior to the date of transfer to the Board.

To sanction and confirm any contracts or agreements made or which may be made between the Board and the Hoylake Council for and in relation to such purchase and to provide for the application of the purchase money by the Hoylake Council.

To provide for the cesser of the powers and obligations of the Hoylake Council to supply water within the area to which the North Wirral undertaking relates and in any area proposed by the Bill to be included within the limits of supply of the Board, and to make provision in regard to incidental matters in connection with the proposed transfer and the exercise by the Board of the rights, powers, privileges and authorities of the Hoylake Council.

To provide for the laying by the Hoylake Council through a portion of the extended limits of supply of the Board of mains, pipes and apparatus for certain purposes.

To empower the Board to make, maintain, alter, enlarge and use certain water works in and through the urban district of Ellesmere Port and Whitby and the rural districts of Chester, Runcorn, Tarvin and Wirral, in the county of Chester, including:—

(a) A pumping station and well in the parish of Mouldsworth, in the rural district of Tarvin, and aqueducts or lines of pipes
