BUXTON CORPORATION.

NOTICE is hereby given that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the Session 1927 by the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Buxton (hereinafter called "the Corporation" and "the Borough" respectively) for an Act and that the following will be the principal subject matters of the Bill for such Act:—

1. Empowering the Corporation to purchase by agreement the Buxton Gardens and the undertaking of the Buxton Gardens Company Limited; confirmation of agreement for purchase; vesting of gardens and undertaking in Corporation; provisions as to consideration money and substitution of Corporation securities for debenture stock of Company; winding up of Company.

2. Empowering the Corporation to carry on maintain and improve the Buxton Gardens and the undertaking transferred to them; management of undertaking by joint committee of Corporation and Company prior to date of transfer; provision of entertainments etc. in Buxton Gardens by Corporation and general provisions as to conduct of Buxton Gardens undertaking including powers of leasing undertaking or part thereof, powers as to maintenance, repair and improvement of buildings etc.; construction of wintergardens, pavilions and other buildings; charges for admission to gardens and buildings; issue of season and other tickets.

3. The enactment of further provisions with regard to public parks, recreation grounds, gardens (including Buxton Gardens) open spaces and buildings of the Corporation; the erection of Public Halls and other buildings by the Corporation; the provision of entertainments by them or by other persons therein respectively; the establishment of information

bureaus; power to advertise the Borough and its attractions; the making of byelaws; the appointment of officers; and the application of revenue and payment of expenses.

4. The enactment of further provisions with regard to the electricity undertaking of the Corporation including provisions as to the sale by the Corporation of electrical fittings and the wiring of houses by them; the provision and maintenance of showrooms; the giving of exhibitions and demonstrations; the laying down of electric lines etc. in streets not dedicated to public use; prohibiting the use for lighting purposes of electricity supplied for power; as to the maximum power that may be demanded; further powers as to the entry on premises supplied with electricity; erroneous meters; power to construct substations under streets; power to make byelaws as to apparatus and fittings; power to recover expenses of re-connecting premises and to discontinue supplying electricity under certain circumstances; authority to provide renewal and contingency funds.

5. The enactment of further provisions with regard to the water undertaking of the Corporation and the supply of water by them, including provisions as to the rate for the supply of water for washing motor cars etc.; penalties for interference with valves fittings etc.; maintenance of common pipes; repair of communication pipes; the recovery of water rates half-yearly in advance and the collection of water rates with the general rate or other rate levied by the Corporation.

6. The enactment of provisions with regard to streets, buildings, sewers, drains, streams and watercourses; infectious disease, sanitary matters, food, slaughterhouses; touting and hawking in certain streets of the borough, police matters (including matters relating to traffic in streets) and generally with regard to the good rule and government of the borough.

7. Authorising the Corporation to close to vehicles the street known as "The Crescent" between specified hours, or in the alternative authorising them to make regulations as to the route to be observed between certain hours by vehicles within a specified distance of The Crescent.

8. The enactment of further provisions as to the acquisition of land by the Corporation for the benefit of the borough and the inhabitants thereof; empowering the Corporation to purchase dwellinghouses for their employees, and other buildings.

9. Provisions as to the recovery of rates from persons removing from the borough.

10. The borrowing of money by the Corporation for the purposes of the Bill and other financial matters including provisions dealing with the application of the various revenues of the Corporation, the establishment of a consolidated loans fund, the use of loans funds, sinking funds, reserve funds and other funds by the Corporation instead of borrowing; the provision of working balances for current expenses; the formation of reserve and depreciation funds, the payment of all receipts into and of all expenses out of the borough district or general rate fund; audit of accounts by professional auditors and authorisation of certain specified expenses.
