The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 23rd day of November, 1926, N. 3610/26, in the words following,

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Your Majesty's Order in Council bearing date the 28th day of June, 1926, certain rates of pay and allowances were laid down for Pensioned Chief Petty Officers and Petty Officers of Your Majesty's Navy who are, or may be, employed as Instructors to Your Majesty's Naval Volunteer Reserve:

"And whereas we consider it desirable that Pensioned Non-commissioned Officers of Your Majesty's Royal Marine Force should be eligible for employment as such Instructors:

We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to authorise us with effect as from 28th September, 1926, to employ, at our discretion, Pensioned Non-Commissioned Officers of the Royal Marines as Instructors to the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve, Pensioned Colour Sergeants, R.M., being entered as Chief Petty Officers of Your Majesty's Navy, and Pensioned Sergeants, R.M., as Petty Officers of Your Majesty's Navy, under the same conditions of service and with the same rates of pay and allowances as Pensioners of Your Majesty's Navy similarly employed.
'' The

Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

Majesty, having taken the Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

THEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and

32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 11th day of November, 1926, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called 'the said Benefice') of Lymm, in the County of Chester and in the Diocese of Chester:

"Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right

"Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Lymm is vested for an estate in fee simple without incumbrances in William Arthur Dewhurst, of Summerhill, Stanley.

Perth, Scotland, Esquire:

"And whereas the said William Arthur Dewhurst is desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Lymm, now vested in him as aforesaid, should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop of Chester for the

time being:

"And whereas the Right Reverend Henry Luke, now Bishop of Chester, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary he, the said Henry Luke, Bishop of Chester, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Lymm which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the Cure of Souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in

the Parish of Lymm:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said William Arthur Dewhurst (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Henry Luke, Bishop of Chester (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Lymm, now vested in him, the said William Arthur Dewhurst, as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said Henry Luke, Bishop of Chester, and his successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Henry Luke, Bishop of Chester, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been

approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar

of the said Diocese of Chester.

Council bearing date the Seventeenth day of May, 1920, and known as "The Uganda Order in Council, 1920," His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, was pleased to constitute the office of Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Uganda Protectorate, and amongst other things to provide for the appointment of a Deputy to the said Governor and Commander-in-Chief in the events therein specified, and was further pleased to reserve to Himself, His heirs and successors power, with the advice of His or Their Privy Council, at any time to revoke, alter or amend the said Order:

And whereas it is expedient to make other provisions than in the said recited Order in Council are contained with regard to the powers to be exercised by the Deputy to the said

Governor and Commander-in-Chief:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers on that behalf by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

I. This Order may be cited as "The Uganda Order in Council, 1926."

II. Article XIX. of the Uganda Order in Council, 1920, is, as from the coming into operation of this Order, hereby revoked, without prejudice to anything lawfully done thereunder, and in place thereof the following Article shall be substituted and take effect:—

"XIX. In the event of the Governor having occasion at any time to be temporarily absent for a short period from the seat of Government, or, in the exercise or discharge of any powers or duties conferred or imposed upon him by His Majesty, or through one of His Majesty's Principal Sec-

retaries of State, to visit any territories adjacent to or near to the Protectorate homay by an instrument under the Public Seal of the Protectorate appoint any person to be his Deputy within any part of the Protectorate, during such temporary absence, and in that capacity to exercise, perform and execute for and on behalf of the Governor during such absence but no longer, all such powers and authorities vested in the Governor as shall in and by such instrument be specified and limited, but no others.

Every such Deputy shall conform to and observe all such instructions as the Governor shall from time to time address to him for his guidance. Provided, nevertheless, that by the appointment of a Deputy as aforesaid the power and authority of the Governor shall not be abridged, altered, or in any way affected otherwise than His Majesty may at any time hereafter think proper to direct."

* III. This Order shall be read and proclaimed within the Uganda Protectorate and shall thereupon commence and come into operation.

IV. His Majesty, His heirs and successors, in Council may at any time revoke, alter, or

amend this Order.

And the Right Honourable Leopold Stennett Amery, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 17th December, 1926, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889. and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £40,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 20th December, 1926, to Friday, the 24th December, 1926, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date

on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London

Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms, which may be obtained from the Chief

Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

By virtue of the Act 13 and 14 Victoria, chapter 7, intituled "An Act for consolidating the Office of the Registrar of Metropolitan Public Carriages with the Offices of Commissioners of Police of the Metropolis and making other provisions in regard to the Consolidated Offices."

I, WILLIAM THOMAS FRANCIS HORWOOD, Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, do hereby APPOINT Standings for Hackney Carriages at the following places, and do make the following Regulations with regard to the Boundaries for the same, viz.:—

16th November, 1926

Eccleston Bridge, Eccleston Square, Elizabeth Bridge, Buckingham Palace Road, Ebury Bridge, Sutherland Terrace and Sutherland Street, S.W., in twelve portions. One hundred and eighty-four Hackney carriages.

First Portion.—Six carriages on North side of Eccleston Bridge, commencing at a point 9 feet East of Cab entrance to Victoria Station and extending Eastward, by kerb, as far as necessary for six carriages.

Front of vehicles toward the West.

Second Portion.—Six carriages at Eccleston Square, North side commencing at a point 10 feet East of Refuge at junction with Gillingham Street and extending Eastward, by kerb of pavement along the garden enclosure, as far as necessary for six carriages.

Front of vehicles toward the West.

Third Portion.—Two carriages at Eccleston Square, East side, commencing at a point 15 feet South of the stone setts at junction with the North side of Eccleston Square and extending Southward, by kerb of pavement along the garden enclosure, as far as necessary for two carriages.

Eighth Portion.—Forty carriages on South side of Ebury Bridge and Sutherland Terrace, commencing at a point 10 yards East of Refuge at junction with Buckingham Palace Road and extending Eastward, by kerb, to the lamp standard situate on South side of roadway at a point in line with No. 30, Sutherland Terrace, the cabs to keep clear of the Water Trough.

Ninth Portion.—In Sutherland Street, ten carriages to stand in the centre of roadway, commencing at a point in line with the party wall of Nos. 21/23, and extending Eastward to a point in line with the doorway of No. 12, Sutherland Street.

THE TRADE BOARDS (MILK DISTRIBUTIVE) 1926. SPECIAL ORDER, DECEMBER 4, 1926, MADE BY THE MINISTER OF LABOUR, UNDER SECTIONS 1 AND 2 OF THE TRADE BOARDS ACT, 1918 (8 & 9 GEO. 5, c. 32), ALTERING THE DESCRIPTION OF THE MILK DISTRIBUTIVE TRADE CONTAINED IN THE APPENDIX TO THE TRADE BOARDS (MILK DISTRIBUTIVE) ORDER, 1920.

Whereas the Minister of Labour (hereinafter referred to as the Minister), by a Special Order, called the Trade Boards (Milk Distributive) Order, 1920, (a) dated the ninth day of January, 1920, applied the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, (b) to the trade specified in the Appendix to the said Special Order;

And whereas it is provided by Sub-section 1 of Section 2 of the Trade Boards Act, 1918,

And whereas the Minister is of opinion that it is desirable to vary the said Special Order by altering the description of the trade

Now, therefore, the Minister, by virtue of the powers conferred on him by the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, and of any other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes a Special Order varying the said Special Order:-

1. There shall be inserted in paragraph 2(a) (iv) of the Appendix to the Trade Boards (Milk Distributive) Order, 1920:—

after the word "pasteurizing" the words "homogenizing, sterilizing

2. The following new paragraph shall be added to the Appendix to the said Order after paragraph 2, that is to say:-

3. This Order may be cited as the Trade Boards (Milk Distributive) Order, 1926.

COUNTY OF WILTS.

(i) Any vehicle which is being used for the purposes of agriculture in connection with land adjoining or lying near to the said roads or for the conveyance or haulage of timber felled upon such land;

(ii) Any vehicle which is being used for the conveyance of goods or merchandise to or from any house, building or other premises situate on or adjacent to the said

roads; or

(iii) Any vehicle which is being used in connection with the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said roads, or the laying, alteration or repair in or near to the said roads of any sewer or of any main pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity.

(2) This Article shall come into operation on the thirteenth day of December, nineteen hundred and twenty-six.

Where a whole-time male worker is employed by the week or any longer period and the hours of work agreed between the worker and the employer in any week (excluding hours of overtime employment) are less than 51 the rate of wages applicable to that worker shall be such as to secure to the worker the wages
