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Leghorn, September 2. N. S.

THE last week arrived here an English Ship the *Prince Georg.*, Capt. *Samuel Skimmer*, from *England*. The *Peace*, Capt. *Garland*, and the *success*, Capt. *Wilson*, are come in from *Alexandria*.

Voice, Sept. 6. The Letters from *Dalmatia* inform us, That the Turks have drawn most of their Forces from those Parts, and sent them to *Hungary*, to strengthen the Army which the Sultan commands in Person. In the *Morea* there seems to be no disposition to undertake any considerable Enterprize on either side; The Enemies Forces are said not to be above 14 or 15000 strong on that Frontier; and the Venetians content themselves with securing the Pass, at the *Isthmus of Corinth*. The Fleet, by our last advices, was still at *Andres*.

Warsaw, Sept. 3. The King of *Poland* continues at *Cracow*, and many of the Nobility are gone thither to assist at his Coronation, appointed for the 15th of this month; after which he intends to march with his Forces directly to this Place; where the Deputies of the late Diet that are in the French Interest keep together, being supported by the Authority of the Primare; They appear resolv'd to maintain what they have done. But want the Presence of the Prince of *Coni*, whom they impatiently expect; and in all likelihood their Party will be broke and dispersed before he arrives: 'Tis discourst that the General of *Lithuania* is falling off from them; If this be true, it will very much change Affairs to their disadvantage. Commissioners are sent to the Army, to adjust and pay their Arrears, which gives them great Satisfaction.

Madrid, Sept. 4. The King of *Spain* continues his Resolution of going this month to *Zaragoza*; for which great Preparations are made; His Catholic Majesty was somewhat indispos'd two or three days ago, but is very well again. The Cessation of Arms in *Catalonia* expired the first of this month; and 'tis said the French Troops intend to march towards *Zaragoza*.

Corunna, Sept. 14. On the 12th Instant, came into this Port the *Weymouth* Man of War, Capt. *Juniper* Commander, and brought in a Ship laden with Wine, which he found on the Coast, without any Person on board her; and yesterday came in the Spanish-Expedition Packet-Boat from *Falmouth*, having in her Voyage hither retaken a Scotch Vessel of 250 Tuns and 12 Guns.

Vienna, Sept. 7. By the last Letters from *Hungary* the Turkish Army, which was said to be compos'd of above 70000 Men, march'd towards *Peter-Waradin*, and 'twas believed they would Besiege that Place; for which reason Prince *Eugene* had sent two Regiments of Foot to reinforce the Garison, and was moving that way with the whole Imperial Army. The Bishop of *Raab* went hence this week for *Cracow*, to be present at the King of *Poland's* Coronation.

Mentz, Sept. 15. On the 10th Instant 7 Battalions, of the Forces commanded by the Margrave of *Bareith*, joined Prince *Lewis* of *Baden's* Army, which is Encamped before *Ebernbourg*; The same day 6 pieces of Cannon for Battery arrived there from this Place; and 9 more the day following; The Pioneers have been 3 days at work in making the Lines of Circumvallation; and we hear this day that the Germans have begun to Batter the Place with Cannon and Mortars. The French Army commanded by Marechal *Choiseul*, marched yesterday nearer to *Ebernbourg*, and their Camp is now about 4 hours march from thence.

Hamburg, Sept. 17. The last Letters from *Poland* give a better account of the Elector of *Saxony's* Affairs then we had by two or three Posts before; Most of the principal Nobility were come to attend him at his Coronation, and when that Solemnity was perform'd, 'twas not doubted but he would soon oblige the Party that oppos'd him to leave *Warsaw*; The Commissioners had begun to pay the Army, and there appeared so good a disposition among the Troops in favour of the Elector, that there was reason to believe they would in few days declare for his Election.

Paris, Sept. 16. We have no News of the Prince of *Coni*, since what was brought by a Vessel to *Dunkirke*, who left *du Barr's* Squadron on the 7th, about 12 Leagues at Sea; since his departure two Expreses are arrived from *Poland*, to press his hastning thither, where his Presence is very necessary to encourage and support his Friends. Letters from *Barcelona* of the 5th say, the Duke de *Vendosme* had pass'd the River *Lobregat*, and that his Army advances towards *Tarragona*. They write from *Brest* that only 7 Ships of Monsieur *Chasseaufort's* Squadron lay ready to sail, the rest being disarm'd.

Brussels, Sept. 18. The Elector of *Bavaria* came the 16th to *Antwerp*, from his Camp near *Bruges*, where he met the Prince de *Vaudemont*, and Don *Quiros*, one of the Spanish Plenipotentiaries for the Treaty of Peace; The latter afterwards returned to the *Hague*. The several Armies continue in their former Camps.
