THE last week arrived here an English Ship the Prince George, Capt. Samuel Skinner, from England. The Peace, Capt. Garland, and the Success, Capt. Wilson, are come in from Alexandria.

Voice, Sept. 6. The Letters from Dalmatia inform us, That the Turks have drawn most of their Forces from those Parts, and sent them to Bingary, to strengthen the Army which the Sulm commands in Person. In the Morea there sens to be no disposition to undertake any confilerable Enterprize on either fide; The Enemies brees are faid not to be above 1 4 or 15000 strong on that Frontier; and the Venetians content demselves with securing the Pass, at the 1sthmus of Crinth. The Fleet, by our last advices, was fill at Andres.

Warfaw, Sept 3. The King of Poland continues at Cracere, and many of the Nobility are gone thither to affift at his Coronation, appointed for the 13th of this month; after which he intends to when this Forces directly to this Place; where the Deputies of the late Diet that are in the French Interest keep together, being supported by the Authority of the Primate; They appear resolved to maintain what they have done, But want the Presence of the Prince of Comi. whom they impartently expect; and in all likelibood their Party will be broke and dispersed be-fre he arrives: 'Tis discoursed that the General of Lithuania is falling off from them; If this be me, it will very much change Affairs to their difadvantage. Comn issioners are fent to the Army, madjult and pay their Arrears, which gives them great Satisfaction.

Madrid, Sept. 4. The King of Spain continues his Resolution of going this month to Zaragofa; for which great Preparations are made; His Catholick Majesty was somewhat indisposed two or three days ago, but is very well again. Collation of Arms in Catalonia expired the first of thismouth; and 'tis fail the French Troops in-Rnd to march towards Taragona.

Carama, Sept, 14. On the 12th Instant, came into this Port the Weymouth Man of War, Capt. Imper Commander, and brought in a Ship laden with Wine, which he found on the Coast, with outany Person on board her; and yesterday came in the Spanish-Expenition Packet-Boat from Falmuch, having in her Voyage hither retaken a Scorch Vessel of 250 Tuns and 12 Guns.

Vienna, Seps. 7. By the last Letters from Hungary the Turkith Army, which was faid to be composed of above 70000 Men, march'd towards Peter-Waradin, and 'twas believed they would Beliege that Place; for which reason Prince Eugene had sent two Regiments of Foot to reinsorce the Garison, and was moving that way with the whole Imperial Army. The Bishop of Raab went hence this week for Cracow, to be present at the King of Poland's Coronation.

Mentz, Sept. 15. On the 10th Instant 7 Battalions, of the Forces commanded by the Margrave of Bareith, joined Prince Lewis of Baden's Army, which is Encamped before Ebernbourg; The same day 6 pieces of Cannon for Battery arrived there from this Place; and 9 more the day following; The Pioneers have been 3 days at work in making the Lines of Circumvallation; and we hear this day that the Germans have begun to Batter the Place with Cannon and Mortars. The French Army commanded by Mareschal Choiseul, marched yesterday nearer to Ebernhourg, and their Camp is now about 4 hours march from

Hamburgh, Sept. 17. The last Letters from Poland give a better account of the Elector of Saxouy's Affairs then we had by two or three Posts before; Most of the Principal Nobility were come to attend him at his Coronation, and when that Solemnity was perform'd, 'twas not doubted but he would soon oblige the Party that opposed him to leave Warfaw; The Commissioners had begun to pay the Army, and there appeared for good a disposition among the Troops in favour of the Elector, that there was reason to believe

they would in few days declare for his Election.

Paris, Sept. 16. We have no News of the
Prince of Conti, fince what was brought by a Veilel to Dunkirke, who left du Bart's Squadron on the 7th, about 12 Leagues at Sea; fince his departure two Expreiles are arrived from Poland, to press his hastning thither, where his Presence is very necessary to encourage and support his Friends. Letters from Barcelona of the 5th say, the Duke de Vendosme had pissed the River Lobrega:, and that his Army advances towards Tarragona. They write from Brest that only 7 Ships of Monsieur Chasteaurenaut's Squadron lay ready

to fail, the rest being disarmed.

Bruffells, Sept. 18. The Elector of Bavaria came the 16th to Antwerp, from his Camp near Bruges, where he met the Prince de Vaudemont, and Don Quiros, one of the Spanish Plenipotentiaties for the Treaty of Peace; The latter afterwards re-turned to the Hague. The feveral Armies continue in their former Camps.
