Foreign Office, S.W. 1, 17th January, 1927.

By an exchange of notes dated November 22nd and 29th, 1926, between the Mexican Minister for Foreign Affairs and His Britannic Majesty's Minister at Mexico, it has been agreed that the denunciation by the Mexican Government of the Treaty of Friendship, Commerce and Navigation, signed at Mexico on November 27th, 1888, which denunciation was notified to His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs by the Mexican Minister in London on December 22nd, 1925, shall be suspended for six months from December 22nd, 1926.

The Treaty will therefore not terminate until June 22nd, 1927.
