TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918.

PAPER BAG TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

PROPOSAL TO VARY GENERAL MINIMUM TIME RATES AND OVERTIME RATES FOR FEMALE WORKERS FOR PERIODS DEPENDENT UPON THE COST OF LIVING INDEX FIGURE.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated respectively 31st October, 1918, 1st August, 1922 and 1st April, 1926, the Trade Board established under the Trade Boards Acts 1909 and 1918 in Great Britain for the branches of trade specified in the Trade Boards (Paper Bag) Order, 1919, HEREBY GIVE NOTICE that they PROPOSE TO VARY the General Minimum Time Rates and Overtime Rates for Female Workers at present set out in Part II and Part IV respectively of the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice P. (13) dated 16th January, 1926, the proposed variations being as set out in the Schedule below.

SCHEDULE.

PART I.

PROPOSED VARIATION OF GENERAL MINIMUM TIME RATES FOR FEMALE WORKERS.

- (1) *Proposed General Minimum Time Rates for Female Workers who have completed certain periods of employment.*

The Trade Board PROPOSE to VARY the General Minimum Time Rates contained in Section I of Part II of the Trade Board's Notice P. (13) by providing that the rates set out in this Section shall apply only to female workers (including homeworkers) who have completed the appropriate period of employment specified in Paragraph (5) of this Schedule.

- (2) *Proposed Variation of General Minimum Time Rates for Learners.*

(a) The Trade Board PROPOSE to VARY the General Minimum Time Rates for learners contained in Section II of Part II of the Trade Board's Notice P. (13) by providing that the rates contained in that Section shall apply only to learners (as defined in Paragraph (4) of this Schedule) in whose case the conditions set out in subparagraph (b) of this Paragraph are being complied with.

(b) The Proposed General Minimum Time Rates set out in sub-Paragraph (a) of this Paragraph shall apply only to learners as
