At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 7th day of February, 1927.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 1st day of February, 1927, C.W. 9769/26, in the words following,

viz.:—
"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in

And whereas by Section 2 of the Officers of Royal Naval Reserve Act, 1863, it is enacted, inter alia, that the Admiralty may enrol Officers of the Reserve to the Royal Navy, under, and subject to, such Rules, Orders and Regulations as the Admiralty may, with the consent of Your Majesty in Council, from time to time establish:

'And whereas by the Naval Forces Act, 1903, it is enacted that the Admiralty shall have power to raise and maintain a Force to be called the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve, and that any Volunteer enrolled under this Act, when serving for training affoat or called out for actual service shall be deemed to be serving in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force within the meaning of the Naval and Marine

Pay and Pensions Act, 1865:

"And whereas by Your Order in Council bearing date the 16th day of December, 1925, Your Majesty was graciously pleased to institute, inter alia, revised standard rates of full pay, unemployed pay and half pay for certain Officers of Your Majesty's Naval, Marine, Naval Reserve and Naval Volunteer Reserve Forces who enter the Service or are promoted to certain ranks, as specified in paragraph 4 of Section I of the Schedule attached thereto, on or after 5th October, 1925, and to provide also that such revised rates shall be comparable with the standard rates authorised by Your Order in Council bearing date the 22nd January, 1920, and subsequent Orders in Council, and shall be subject to revision on the same dates and in the same manner:

"And whereas we are of opinion that revised standard rates of full pay and half pay, likewise subject to revision on the same dates and in the same manner, should similarly be instituted for certain Officers promoted from Warrant Rank of Your Majesty's Naval, Marine, Naval Reserve and Naval Volunteer Reserve Forces, as defined in the attached Schedule, who, immediately before promotion to Warrant or higher rank were in receipt of the revised rates of substantive pay, instituted for certain men with effect from the 5th October, 1925, and also for certain Officers of the Royal Marines and Royal Naval Reserve who enter or may be entered direct as Officers:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the regulations set forth in the attached Schedule and the revised rates of pay shown therein:

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS it is provided by subsection (2) of section thirty-six of the Finance Act, 1926, that it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council by Order to make such amendments of the forms of statements, lists and declarations contained in the Fifth Schedule to the Income Tax Act, 1918, as appear to His Majesty to be necessary to give effect to the provisions of Part IV of the said Act and that the said Schedule shall have effect as amended

by any Order so made:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in pursuance of the said enactment, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

 The amendments set out in the Schedule to this Order shall be made in the Fifth Schedule to the Income Tax Act, 1918, and the said Fifth Schedule shall have effect as amended by this Order.

2. This Order may be cited as the Income Tax (Schedule V Amendment) Order, 1927.

<sup>&</sup>quot;(3) The standard rates of full pay and half pay established by this Order shall be comparable with those established by Order in Council of the 22nd January, 1920, and shall be subject to revision at the same dates and in the same manner; likewise the current rates of full pay and half pay established by this Order shall be comparable with those established by Order in Council of the 16th December, 1925, and shall be subject to further review on or after the 1st day of July, 1927."

"III.—By every person carrying on any concern hereinafter mentioned, or his agent or officer, in the cases authorised to be charged under Schedule D.

- or, where the concern has been set up and commenced within the year of assessment, the amount of the profits of the year of assessment, or according to the average of such a period, in no case greater than one year, as the case may require, and as may be directed by the Commissioners, and the period taken, to the best of the knowledge and belief of such person, agent or officer;
- or, where the concern has been set up and commenced within the preceding year, the amount of the profits for one year from the period of the first setting up of the same."

IV.

For the words "on an average of the seven preceding years" there shall be substituted the words "for the preceding year, or, where the profits or income first arose after the sixth day of April in the preceding year, the amount of the profits or income of the year of assessment."

٧.

The following paragraph shall be substituted:—

"V.—By the Receiver of any fine paid in consideration of a demise of Lands or Tenements (except customary) to be charged under Schedule D.

The amount of such fines received within the preceding year, or, where the profits or income first arose after the sixth day of April in the preceding year, the amount received within the year of assessment."

VI.

The following paragraph shall be substituted:—

"VI.—By every Person entitled to Profits arising from Lands, Tenements, Hereditaments or Heritages, not before stated, to be charged under Schedule D.

The amount for the preceding year, or where the profits or income first arose after the sixth day of April in the preceding year, the amount of the profits or income of the year of assessment."

VII.

For the words from "upon a fair and just average" to the end of the paragraph there shall be substituted the following:

"for the preceding year;

- or, where the trade has been set up and commenced within the year of assessment, the amount of the profits or gains of the year of assessment, or according to the average of such a period, in no case greater than one year, as the case may require, and as may be directed by the Commissioners, and the period taken, to the best of the knowledge and belief of such person;
- or, where the trade has been set up and commenced within the preceding year, the amount of the profits or gains for one year from the period of the first setting up of the same."

VIII.

For the words from "upon a fair and just average" to the end of the paragraph there shall be substituted the following:

"for the preceding year;

- or, where the profession or vocation has been set up and commenced within the year of assessment, the amount of the profits, gains and emoluments of the year of assessment, or according to the average of such a period, in no case greater than one year, as the case may require, and as may be directed by the Commissioners, and the period taken, to the best of the knowledge and belief of such person;
- or, where the profession or vocation has been set up and commenced within the preceding year, the amount of the profits, gains and emoluments for one year from the period of the first setting up of the same."

X.

In (1) for the words "as far as the same can be computed, arising in the year of assessment" there shall be substituted the words "arising in the preceding year, or, where the income first arose after the sixth day of April in the preceding year, the amount arising in the year of assessment"; in (2) for the words "so far as the same can be computed, of the sums which have been, or will be, received in the United Kingdom, in the year of assessment" there shall be substituted the words "of the sums which have been received in the United Kingdom in the preceding year, or, where the income was first received after the sixth day of April in the preceding year, the amount so received in the year of assessment."

XI.

In (1) for the words "on an average of the three preceding years" there shall be substituted the words "in the preceding year, or, where the income first arose after the sixth day of April in the preceding year, the amount arising in the year of assessment"; in (2) the word "annually" shall be omitted, and for the words "on an average of the three preceding years" there shall be substituted the words "in the preceding year, or, where the income was first received after the sixth day of April in the preceding year, the amount received in the year of assessment."

XII.

For the words from "thereof" to the end there shall be substituted the words "arising in the year of assessment, or according to the average of the period, in no case greater than one year, directed to to be taken by the Commissioners on a statement of the nature of such profits or gains, and the grounds on which the amount has been computed, and the period taken, to the best of the knowledge and belief of such person."

WHEREAS by the Representation of the People Acts, 1918 to 1926, power is conferred on His Majesty to make provision for various matters by Order in Council:

And whereas by the Representation of the People Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") His Majesty was pleased by Order in Council to make provision for various matters under those Acts:

And whereas by Section 40 (2) of the Representation of the People Act, 1918, any Order in Council made thereunder may be revoked or varied as occasion requires by any subsequent Order in Council:

And whereas by the Representation of the People (Economy Provisions) Act, 1926, provision is made for one register only of electors

to be made in each year in England and Wales and in Scotland:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon Him by the Acts and of all other powers enabling Him in that behalf is pleased by and with the advice of His Privy Council to order, and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

- 1. The following paragraph shall be substituted for the second paragraph of Rule 4 of the Order (which relates to claims by outvoters).
  - "The last day for claims by any person to vote at any polling place under the said Rule 24 shall be as respects constituencies in England and Wales, the eighteenth day of August, as respects constituencies in Scotland, the third day of September, and as respects constituencies in Northern Ireland, the eighteenth day of September."
- 2. In paragraph 4 (b) of Rule 25 of the Order (which relates to documents to be sent

to the Clerk of the Crown) the words "the Secretary of State" shall be substituted for the words "the Minister of Health (or in Scotland the Secretary for Scotland, or in Ireland the Local Government Board for Ireland)."

- 3. The following paragraph shall be substituted for the second paragraph of Rule 38 of the Order (which relates to the summary of electors):—" This rule shall apply only to England and Wales and Northern Ireland."
- 4. Throughout the Order references to Northern Ireland shall be substituted for references to Ireland.
- 5. The following amendments shall be made in the Forms in Schedule I to the Order:—

(1) In Form A under heading I—

the words in Parts II and III "but a man not yet 21 years old is of full age if he was serving in the Great War at any time after he had attained the age of 19 years" shall be omitted;

the words "of full age" shall be inserted in Part III after the word "person";

the words in Instruction No. 1 "or to the rate collector or assistant over seer" shall be omitted; and

the words in Instruction No. 4 "six months" shall be altered to "three months";

(2) In the forms of claim to be registered under heading II the following shall be substituted for so much of the respective forms as follows after the Declaration of the claimant:—

#### (In man's claim.)

\* The qualifying period is the three months ending 1st June. In the case of a man discharged from H.M. Forces during the said three months, or of a naval or military voter claiming in respect of premises (or land) in his actual occupation, the period is one month ending on the day mentioned.

Section 7 (2) of the Act of 1918 as amended by the Act of 1926 provides:-" Residence in a house or the occupation of a house shall not be deemed to be interrupted for the purposes of this Act by reason only of permission being given, by letting or otherwise, for the occupation of the house as a furnished house by some other person for part of the qualifying period not exceeding two months in the whole, or where the occupation of the person giving the permission commenced more than six months before the last day of the qualifying period, for not more than four months in the whole during that period of six months." Section 1 (1) of the Act of 1921 as amended by the Act of 1926 provides:—"The residence of a person in any premises shall not be deemed to have been interrupted for the purposes of the Representation of the People Acts, 1918 to 1920, by reason only of the fact that that person has been absent from the premises during part of the qualifying period not exceeding two months at any one time, or if the residence commenced more than six months before the last day of the qualifying period, during a part of those six months not exceeding four months at any one time, in the performance of any duty arising from or incidental to any office, service or employment held or undertaken by him." The foregoing express provisions are not to affect the general principles governing the interpretation of the expression "residence."

N.B.—Any false declaration made by a person for the purpose of this claim will render such person liable to a penalty.

#### (In Woman's claim.)

\* The qualifying period is the three months ending 1st June. In the case of a claim in respect of premises (or land) in the actual occupation of a naval or military voter or of a man discharged from H.M. Forces during the said three months, the period is one month ending on the day mentioned.

† The age must be stated. If 30 years or more, say "thirty years"; if 21 years but not 30, say "twenty-one years."

Section 7 (2) of the Act of 1918 as amended by the Act of 1926 provides:-" Residence in a house or the occupation of a house shall not be deemed to be interrupted for the purposes of this Act by reason only of permission being given, by letting or otherwise, for the occupation of the house as a furnished house by some other person for part of the qualifying period not exceeding two months in the whole, or where the occupation of the person giving the permission commenced more than six months before the last day of the qualifying period, for not more than four months in the whole during that period of six months." WHEREAS by certain Letters Patent bearing date at Westminster the tenth day of March, 1925, provision is made for the Government of the Colony of Cyprus:

And whereas by the said Letters Patent full power is reserved to His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors with the advice of His or Their Privy Council from time to time to make all such laws as may appear to Him or Them necessary for the peace, order, and good government of the said Colony:

And whereas it is necessary to make further provision relating to Customs Excise and Revenue in the said Colony and for that purpose to amend the Laws of the said Colony in the manner and to the extent hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf in Him vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:-

1. This Order may be cited as the Cyprus (Customs Excise and Revenue) Order in Council, 1927, and shall be construed and read with the Laws of the Colony referred to in the succeeding Articles.

- 2. The Customs, Excise, and Revenue Law, 1899, shall be read as if the First Schedule hereafter set forth were the First Schedule to the said Law.
- 3. The Customs, Excise, and Revenue Law, 1899, shall be read as if the Second Schedule hereafter set forth were the Second Schedule to the said Law.
- 4. The Customs, Excise, and Revenue (No. 2) Law, 1926, First and Second Schedules, are hereby repealed, and the proviso to section 5 of the said Law is hereby repealed with effect from the date of the coming into operation of the said Law.

5. The Customs, Excise, and Revenue Law, 1899, shall be read as if the Third Schedule hereafter set forth were the Third Schedule to the said Law.

6. The Customs, Excise, and Revenue Law,

1926, Third Schedule, is hereby repealed.
7. This Order shall be published in the Cyprus Gazette and shall thereupon come into operation, and the Governor shall give directions for the publication of this Order at such places and in such manner and for such time or times as he thinks proper for giving due publicity thereto within the Colony.

#### THIRD SCHEDULE.

#### Table of Exemptions.

1. All goods imported for the Government of Cyprus to be used in the public service and duly certified as so imported by the Colonial Secretary.

2. All Military Stores imported by His Majesty's War Department and duly certified as such by the Officer to whom they are con-

signed.

3. All articles of Military equipment imported by and for the use of any Officer of His

Majesty's land forces.

- 4. Goods and Stores of every description supplied under contract with His Majesty's War Department for the public use of His Majesty's land forces, duly certified as such by the principal Commissariat Officer, such certificate to be countersigned by the Colonial Secretary.
- 5. Uniforms of Public Officers and professional robes of Legal or Judicial Officers in the employment of His Majesty's Government, provided that such uniforms or robes are introduced for the personal use only of such officers, and have been duly authorised.

6. Professional robes of Advocates entitled

to practise in Cyprus.

7. Authorised uniforms of Foreign Consuls and Consular Officers and national flags imported for their use.

Authorised uniforms of any Foreign Government to be worn by persons entitled to

wear them.

Government medals and decorations to be worn by person resident in Cyprus.

- 8. Fire-arms for the personal use of Officers of His Majesty's Naval and Military Forces serving in Cyprus.
- 9. Paving stones imported by Municipal Councils in the Island to be used for the paving of streets within the Municipal limits, and duly certified as so imported by the President and Cashier of any Municipal Council.
- 10. Street lamps and their fittings imported by Municipal Councils in the Island to be used in the lighting of Streets within the Municipal limits, and duly certified as so imported by the President and the Cashier of any Municipal Council.
- 11. Casks and vats, and staves and hoops for use in constructing casks and vats.
- 12. Microscopes and all microscopical and other apparatus or appliances for purposes of scientific investigation and research.
- 13. Gymnastic apparatus, mathematical and generally all other instruments used in

schools for educational purposes, which are imported for the use of schools.

- 14. Animals and livestock, atlases maps, anchors and chains (ships'), bark, boats, charcoal, church furniture, and articles intended to be used in the building and fitting up of churches and mosques, and vestments and other articles necessarily used for religious services and certified to be so intended or used, as the case may be, by the proper ecclesiastical authority, empty casks, fresh fish, gold bullion and specie, ice, lime, medicines and medical appliances, pitch and tar, printed books, sawdust, silk-worms' eggs, sponges taken by licensed boats, printing paper, whether white or coloured, printing ink, printers' type, and printing materials, sulphur, chopped straw, cotton seed, fodder for cattle and all mechanical appliances for use in manufacture and examination of wine; sulphur syringes, tombstones and memorial tablets, and tools and implements used in handicrafts.
- 15. Machinery and parts of machinery, their fittings, connections and gearings, Windmills and other apparatus for raising water, winnowing, threshing, and other machines, tools and implements used in agriculture, their parts, connections and gearings, chemical manures and fertilisers.
- 16. The Governor may in certain cases order admission free of duty of goods sent for use in Consular Offices.
- Demijohns sealed on exportation may be admitted duty free on re-importation after identification; Hospital appliances or equipment certified under the hand of the Chief Medical Officer to be imported for the use of any Hospital; postage stamps—used or unused -other than those of Cyprus; empty cardboard boxes and labels which the Chief Collector of Customs is satisfied are for use in connection with the raising of silk-worm eggs in Cyprus; iron piping which the Governor is satisfied is for work of public utility, and imported by or on behalf of any Public Municipal or Local Body or Authority; pig iron; dutiable articles and articles sent away for the purpose of alteration or repair provided (1) that by such alteration or repair the specific identity of the article in question has not been substantially lost, (2) that prior to exportation such articles shall have been produced to the Customs for the purpose of identification on re-importation, (3) or that the Chief Collector of Customs is satisfied that the articles are the same, and (4) that the reimportation takes place within one year from the date of exportation; disinfectants and insecticides; bona fide baggage belonging to and accompanying a passenger, or arriving within two months prior to or after the arrival of such passenger; resin; crude petroleum when imported as fuel for oil engines; appliances and equipment for any Municipal Poor House certified by the Commissioner of the District as specially imported for the purpose.
  - 18. Flax seed.
- 19. Seeds for sowing purposes (including seed-potatoes, bulbs, plants and cuttings).
- 20. Accessories for Municipal slaughter houses.

#### PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, and of the Act of the 37th and 38th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 63, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 20th day of January, 1927, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

- "We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, and of the Act of the 37th and 38th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 63, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme with respect to the Archdeaconries and Rural Deaneries in the Diocese of Wakefield:
- "Whereas there are within the said Diocese of Wakefield two Archdeaconries, to wit, the Archdeaconry of Halifax and the Archdeaconry of Huddersfield:
- "And whereas the Right Reverend George Rodney, Bishop of the said Diocese of Wakefield, has represented to us that it is desirable to make certain new arrangements (being the arrangements hereinafter recommended and proposed) with respect to the said Archdeaconry of Halifax and to the said Archdeaconry of Huddersfield, and to the Rural Deaneries within those Archdeaconries:
- "And whereas we are of opinion that the new arrangements now proposed by the said George Rodney, Bishop of Wakefield, may properly be carried into effect:
- "Now, therefore, with the consent of the said George Rodney, Bishop of Wakefield (in testimony whereof he has to this Scheme set his hand and his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that as from the day on which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette, and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, first, the name of the said Arch-deaconry of Halifax shall be altered so that such Archdeaconry shall henceforth be called The Archdeaconry of Pontefract '; secondly, the name of the said Archdeaconry of Huddersfield shall be altered so that such Archdeaconry shall henceforth be called 'The Archdeaconry of Halifax'; and thirdly, each of the said new Archdeaconries of Halifax and Pontefract shall comprise and consist of those Rural Deaneries, the names of which are set down in order under its name and are numbered consecutively in the Schedule to this Scheme annexed, and that the name which in such Schedule is given to any Rural Deanery shall be the name thereof,

and that every Parish or Cure or Church the

name of which is set down in numbered order under the name of any Rural Deanery in the first column of the said Schedule shall belong to and be a part of the Rural Deanery and of the Archdeaconry under the name of which it so appears as aforesaid and shall be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of the Rural Dean and Archdeacon thereof and shall not any longer belong to or be a part of any other Rural Deanery or of any other Archdeaconry,

or be subject to the jurisdiction or authority of any other Rural Dean or of any other Archdeacon.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other matter or thing with respect to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, under or by virtue of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Brislington Parishes (Transfer) Measure, 1926, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme with respect to certain matters in connection with the transfer to the Diocese of Bristol of the Parishes of Brislington, Saint Luke, and Brislington, Saint Anne:

- "Whereas by virtue of the said Measure the Parishes of Brislington, Saint Luke, and Brislington, Saint Anne, were as from the first day of May, 1926, transferred from the Diocese of Bath and Wells to the Diocese of Bristol and included in the Archdeaconry of Bristol and in the Rural Deanery of Bedminster:
- "And whereas it is provided by the third section of the said Measure that at any time within 12 months after the first day of May, 1926, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, may lay before Your Majesty in Council for confirmation a Scheme for all or any of the matters hereinafter mentioned and generally for making such provisions and arrangements as may be necessary for carrying into complete effect the provisions of the said Measure:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that the Chancellor, Bishop's Secretary, Registrar, Apparitor General, Sealer or Record-Keeper of the Diocese or Bishopric of Bristol and the Registrar and any other officer of the Archdeaconry of Bristol shall respectively on the first day of January and the first day of July in every year, so long as the present Chancellor, Bishop's Secretary, Registrar, Apparitor General, Sealer or Record-Keeper of the Diocese or Bishopric of Bath and Wells or the Registrar or other officer of the Archdeaconry of Bath who was appointed to his Office before the first day of May, 1926, shall continue to hold such office, pay to such Chancellor, Bishop's Secretary, Registrar, Apparitor General, Sealer or Record-Keeper of the Diocese or Bishopric of Bath and Wells or such Registrar or other officer of the Arch-deaconry of Bath one half of the net fees received by such accounting officer during the six months preceding the said first day of January or first day of July (as the case may be) for work done by such accounting officer in the exercise of his office (or by any other officer who may by usage or otherwise perform the duties of such office) in or in relation to the said Parishes of Brislington, Saint Luke, and Brislington, Saint Anne, such fees to be calculated upon the scale of fees which shall be in force within the Diocese of Bristol or the Archdeaconry of Bristol (as the case may be) and in computing such net fees there shall be deducted from the gross fees so received as aforesaid the out-of-pocket expenses incurred in relation to the matters in respect of which the fees have been received, such out-of-pocket expenses in the case of the Bishop's Secretary and Registrar being deemed to be one-half part of the gross fees.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette.

- "We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Bothenhampton and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Walditch and certain alterations of the boundaries of the Parishes of the Benefices of Bridport, Walditch, Symondsbury, Bothenhampton, Shipton Gorge with Burton Bradstock and Allington, all of which Benefices are situate in the County of Dorset and in the Diocese of Salisbury:
- "Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend St. Clair George Alfred, Bishop of Salisbury, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Bothenhampton and Walditch and certain alterations of boundaries affecting the Parishes of the said Benefices of Bridport, Walditch, Symondsbury, Bothenhampton, Shipton Gorge with Burton Bradstock, and Allington, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Salisbury and therein recommended the said union of Benefices and alterations of boundaries and the terms for effecting the same, and the said Bishop of Salisbury signified in writing his approval of the said Report:
- "And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the said Union and alterations of boundaries based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:
- "And whereas the said Benefice of Bothenhampton is now full, the Reverend Nembhard Thwaites being the present Incumbent thereof, and the said Benefice of Walditch is at present vacant:
- "And whereas the said Nembhard Thwaites has consented to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, if and when the union which is hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take effect:
- "And whereas only one Parsonage House will be left standing or remaining within or belonging to the United Benefice when the union which is hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take effect namely the Parsonage House belonging to the said Benefice of Bothenhampton:
- "And whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to each of the said two Benefices of Bothenhampton and Walditch now belongs to one and the same Patron:

- "Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said St. Clair George Alfred, Bishop of Salisbury (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—
- "1. That the said Benefice of Bothenhampton and the said Benefice of Walditch shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Bothenhampton with Walditch' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.
- "2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the said Nembhard Thwaites if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Bothenhampton shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.
- "3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Bothenhampton shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.
- "4. That with the consents of the said Nembhard Thwaites, now Incumbent of the said Benefice of Bothenhampton as aforesaid, of the Reverend Canon Joseph William Coulter, now Incumbent of the said Benefice of Bridport, of the Reverend Charles Francis Long Sweet, now Incumbent of the said Benefice of Symondsbury, of the Reverend George Albert Duncan Beckingsale, now Incumbent of the said Benefice of Allington, and of the Reverend Harold William Wheeler, now Incumbent of the Benefice of Shipton Gorge with Burton Bradstock (in testimony whereof they have signed this Scheme), upon the day of the date of the publication in the date of the publication in the Gazette of any Order of Your London Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme: following areas contiguous Parish of Bridport shall  $\mathbf{the}$ areas contiguous the said Parish of Bridport snau total Ecclesiastical purposes become and be annexed to and form part of the said Parish of Bridport, namely (a) a part of the Parish of Walditch containing approximately two acres and lying to the west of the middle of the Bridport Branch Line of the Great Western Railway, which said part is delineated and set forth upon the Map or Plan hereto annexed and is thereon coloured brown; (b) a part of the said Parish of Symondsbury containing the houses known as Fives Court Row and an area of approximately an acre and a half and lying to the east of the River Brit, which said part is delineated and set forth upon the said Map or Plan and is thereon coloured yellow; (c) a further part of the said Parish of Symondsbury including Bridport Harbour, West Cliff Terrace, and Cliff Cottage and containing an area of approximately 200 acres, which said part is delineated and set forth upon the said Map or Plan and is thereon coloured blue; (d)a part of the said Parish of Bothenhampton containing approximately 250 acres and lying to the south west of the middle of the road leading from Marsh Barn to Bridport over the Railway Bridge at Wanderwell and to the west of the middle of the Bridport Branch Line of

- the Great Western Railway, which said part is delineated and set forth upon the said Map or Plan and is thereon coloured pink; and (e) a part of the said Parish of Shipton Gorge with Burton Bradstock containing approximately 170 acres lying to the east of Bridport Harbour, which said part is delineated and set forth upon the said Map or Plan and is thereon coloured purple, and (B) a certain area contiguous to the said Parish of Allington shall for all ecclesiastical purposes become and be annexed to and form part of the said Parish of Allington, namely a part of the said Parish of Symondsbury containing an area of approximately 18 acres lying to the south of the southern extremity of the said Parish of Allington (but excluding Hope Lodge and two cottages adjoining and Saint Michael's Foundry) which said part is delineated and set forth upon the said Map or Plan and is thereon coloured green.
- " 5. That upon the alterations of boundaries referred to in Clause 4 of this Scheme taking effect (a) there shall be severed from the said Benefice of Symondsbury and annexed to the said Benefice of Bridport all those Tithe Rent Charges indicated in the First Schedule hereto annexed (b) there shall be severed from the said Benefice of Bothenhampton and annexed to the said Benefice of Bridport all those Tithe Rent Charges indicated in the Second Schedule hereto annexed (c) there shall be severed from the said Benefice of Shipton Gorge with Burton Bradstock and annexed to the said Benefice of Bridport all those Tithe Rent Charges indicated in the Third Schedule hereto annexed and (d) there shall be severed from the said Benefice of Symondsbury and annexed to the said Benefice of Allington all those Tithe Rent Charges indicated in the Fourth Schedule hereto annexed.
- "Provided always that the transfers hereinbefore proposed of Tithe Rent Charges shall include all Capital sums of money stocks annuities and other real and personal property (if any) being the produce of the sale redemption or other conversion of all or any of such Tithe Rent Charges.
- "And provided also that if upon such alterations of boundaries taking effect a pension under the provisions of the Incumbents' Resignation Acts shall still be payable out of the revenues of the said Benefice of Shipton Gorge with Burton Bradstock to the Reverend Frederick Thomas Harrison (a former Incumbent of the said Benefice of Shipton Gorge with Burton Bradstock) then the transfer of the Tithe Rent Charge hereinbefore proposed to be severed from the said Benefice of Shipton Gorge with Burton Bradstock and annexed to the said Benefice of Bridport shall not take effect until the cessation of such pension.
- "And provided further that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament.

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Salisbury has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid: And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the union of Benefices and alterations of Boundaries therein recommended shall be effected to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Salisbury.

"There is in the County of Stafford and Diocese of Lichfield the Benefice of Cauldon the Parish whereof contains a population of 464 or thereabouts with accommodation in the Parish Church of Cauldon for 170 persons. (Verged Green)

"The Net Annual Value of the said Benefice of Cauldon is at present £300 or thereabouts.

"There is also in the same County and Diocese the Benefice of Alton the Parish whereof contains a population of 2,313 or thereabouts with accommodation in the Parish Church for 300 persons. (Verged Red).

"The Net Annual Value of the said Benefice of Alton is £287 or thereabouts.

"Certain portions of the said Benefice of Alton known locally as Cauldon Low and Wardlow (shown on the Ordnance Sheets hereinafter mentioned) situated in and being the North Easternmost part of the Parish of Alton with a population of 420 or thereabouts are distant about 4½ miles from the Church of Alton and about 1½ miles from the Church of Cauldon. The children attending the School at Cauldon Low in the said Parish of Alton more frequently attend the Church of Cauldon than the Church of Alton.

"That it appears to me and I do hereby represent to your Grace that under the provisions of the said Pluralities Act, 1838, the said portions of the said Benefice of Alton more particularly delineated on the Ordnance Sheets for Stafford a copy of which is annexed to the hereinafter mentioned Scheme appended to this Representation and thereon coloured Blue and verged Red may be advantageously separated therefrom and be annexed to the said Parish of Cauldon to which they are contiguous.

"That I am the Patron of the said Benefice of Cauldon and the Reverend Lionel Edward Patrick Erith is the present Incumbent

thereof

"That the Most Honourable Charles Henry Alexander (Sixth) Marquess of Anglesey and Lieutenant-General Sir Philip Walhouse Chetwode as Guardians of the Infant Earl of Shrewsbury and Talbot are Patrons of the Benefice of Alton and the Reverend William James Betson is the present Incumbent thereof.

'That pursuant to the directions contained in the 26th Section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, I, the said Lord Bishop, have drawn up a Scheme in Writing annexed to this Representation describing the mode in which it appears to me that the alteration above proposed may best be effected and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect of Ecclesiastical jurisdiction and in respect to Patronage and rights to Pews may be made with justice to all parties interested and I do hereby submit the same to your Grace together with the Consents in Writing of the Patrons of the said Benefices of Cauldon and Alton and also the Consents of the Incumbents of the said Benefices to the intent that if your Grace shall on full consideration and enquiry be satisfied with such Scheme you may certify the same and such Consents aforesaid to His Majesty in Council."

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:—

#### " THE SCHEME.

"It is proposed to separate from the Benefice of Alton and annex to the Benefice of Cauldon all that part of the said Benefice situate in and being the North Easternmost part of the Parish of Alton which is more par-

ticularly delineated upon the Ordnance Sheets hereinbefore referred to and comprised within the area thereon coloured Blue and verged

"That the Incumbent of Cauldon shall have sole and exclusive Cure of Souls within such portions so to be separated from the said Bene-

fice and annexed to Cauldon.

"That the Inhabitants of such portions shall be entitled to accommodation in the Parish Church of Cauldon but shall cease to be entitled to any right or accommodation in the Parish Church of Alton except nevertheless any person or persons (if any) possessing a legal right by Faculty or otherwise to any Pew or Sitting in the said Church and who may not be willing to relinquish and give up

the same.
"That the Inhabitants of the aforesaid to have Marriages Baptisms Churchings and Burials solemnized and performed in the Parish Church of Cauldon as they might have

had in the Church of Alton.
"That all Fees due in respect of the last mentioned paragraph arising from the said portions so to be separated from the Benefice of Alton shall henceforth belong to the Incumbent of the Benefice of Cauldon.

"That no alteration shall be made in the Patronage of the said Benefices or either of

them.

"That no alteration shall be made in the Tithe Rent Charge arising from the aforesaid portions of and belonging to the Benefice of Alton.

"We, The Right Reverend John Augustine, Lord Bishop of Lichfield, Patron of the Benefice of Cauldon in the County of Stafford (if the same was now vacant). The Reverend Lionel Edward Patrick Erith, Incumbent of the same Benefice. The Most Honourable Charles Henry Alexander (Sixth) Marquess of Anglesey and Lieutenant-General Sir Philip Walhouse Chetwode, Patrons of the Benefice of Alton (if the same was now vacant) and The Reverend William James Betson the Incumbent of the same Benefice, do hereby respectively signify to your Grace our several Consents to the Scheme above proposed and set forth and to every matter and thing therein contained.

## ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 11TH FEBRUARY, 1927.)

LANCASHIRE (BOROUGHS) (CONTROL OF DOGS) ORDER OF 1927.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1925, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

#### Power to make Regulations.

1.—(1) The Local Authorities of the Districts specified in the Schedule to this Order may, in accordance with the provisions of this Order, make Regulations with a view to the prevention of worrying of cattle (including sheep) for requiring that dogs or any class of dogs shall, during all or any of the hours between sunset and sunrise be kept by the owners thereof under control in manner prescribed by the Regulations.

(2) The Regulations may apply to the whole or any part of the Districts, and may exempt any class of dogs either generally or under prescribed conditions.

#### Confirmation of Regulations.

2.—(1) Regulations made under this Order shall not take effect unless and until they have been submitted to and confirmed by the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries.

(2) A copy of any Regulations made by a Local Authority under this Order, signed and certified by the Clerk of that Local Authority to be a true copy and to have been duly confirmed shall be evidence, until the contrary is proved, in all legal proceedings of the due making, confirmation and existence of the Regulations, without further or other proof.

### Seizure of Dogs where Regulations are Contravened.

3. Any dog in respect of which an offence is being committed against a Regulation made

under this Order may be seized and treated as a stray dog under the powers conferred by Section three of the Dogs Act, 1906.

Extension of Definition in Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

4. Dogs shall be animals for the purposes of the following sections of the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894 (namely):-

Section forty-three (powers of police);

Section forty-four (powers of inspectors); and also for the purposes of all other sections of the said Act containing provisions relative to or consequent on the provisions of those sections and this Order, including such sections as relate to offences and legal proceedings.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

5. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

6. This Order may be cited as the Lanca-SHIRE (BOROUGHS) (CONTROL OF DOGS) ORDER of 1927.

The following Areas are now "Movement Areas" for the purposes of Part I of the Sheep (Double Dipping) Order of 1920:—

Inverness.—(1) An Area comprising the islands known as the Outer Hebrides (except the islands of St. Kilda, Dune, Soay and Boreray), in the county of Inverness.
