MINISTRY OF HEALTH. Public Health Act, 1925.

By an Order dated 14th February, 1927, the Minister of Health has consented (1) to the adoption of Section 21 (prevention of water flowing on footpath), Section 22 (preventing soil &c., from being washed into streets), Section 44 (offensive trades) and the Sections contained in Part V (water-courses &c.,) of the above Act by the Urban District Council of Barrowford; (2) to the adoption of the said Sections 21 and 22 and the Sections contained in Part V of the Act by the Urban District Councils of Felixstowe and Urmston; and (3) to the adoption of the said Sections 21, 22 and 44 of the Act by the Urban District Council of Hessle.

AGRICULTURAL WAGES (REGULATION) ACT, 1924.
