ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF  
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (IN-  
FECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1927  
(No. 21).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1925, and of every other power

enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

*Contraction of Certain Infected Area.*

1. The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1927 (No. 17) shall be read and have effect as if the Area described in the Schedule to this Order were substituted for the Infected Area described in the Schedule to that Order.

*Revocation of Certain Order.*

2. The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Montague Street (Birmingham) Pig Market) Order of 1927 is hereby revoked.

*Commencement.*

3. This Order shall come into operation on the twelfth day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty-seven.

*Short Title.*

4. This Order may be cited as the FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1927 (No. 21).

In witness whereof the Official Seal of the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries is hereunto affixed this fifth day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty-seven.
