NATIONAL DEBT AND LOCAL LOANS ACT, 1887.
(50 and 51 Vict., c. 16.)

The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury give notice that pursuant to Section 13 (5) of the National Debt and Local Loans Act, 1887, They have directed the creation of £12,506,000 Local Loans Three per cent. Stock, which Stock has been issued to the National Debt Commissioners.
