#### WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION ACT, 1925.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice that on the 30th April, 1927, he made an Order under Section 43 (3) of the above Act, amending the descriptions of the diseases or injuries described in the Schedule to the Order of 26th February, 1918, as subcutaneous cellulitis over the patella (miner's beat knee) and acute bursitis over the elbow (miner's beat elbow), to read as follows:—

Subcutaneous cellulitis or acute bursitis arising at or about the knee (Beat Knee);

Subcutaneous cellulitis or acute bursitis over the elbow (Beat Elbow).

#### WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION ACT, 1925.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice that on the 30th April, 1927, he made a Scheme of Compensation under Section 47 of the Workmen's Compensation Act, 1925, to provide for the payment of compensation in the case of death or total disablement of a workman caused by silicosis or by silicosis accompanied by tuberculosis in the Metal Grinding Industries.

The Scheme, which may be cited as The Metal Grinding Industries (Silicosis) Scheme, 1927, will come into force on the 1st July, 1927. It applies to all workmen employed at any time on or after that date in the following processes:—(i) grinding of metals, that is the abrasion, by aid of mechanical power, of any metal, or article of metal, or part of any article of metal, by means of a grindstone, including any hacking or rodding of the grindstone; (ii) any work incidental to any grinding of metals as aforesaid, and glazing, when such work or glazing is carried on in the same room as such grinding; and (iii) racing of any grindstone for the purpose of grinding of metals as aforesaid.

The Home Secretary gives notice that in pursuance of Section 2 (1) of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920, he has made an Order authorising the employment on two day-shifts of male young persons of 16 years of age and over in all machine processes at the works of Messrs. J. Holroyd and Company Limited, Perseverance Works, Milnrow, Rochdale, subject to the conditions that a worker shall not be employed in the afternoon shift in consecutive weeks and that suitable cloakroom and messroom accommodation shall be provided.

The Home Secretary gives notice that in pursuance of Section 2 (1) of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920, he has made an Order authorising the employment on two day-shifts of women of 18 and young persons of 16 years of age and over in willowing and sorting cotton waste at the works of The International Cotton Waste Company Limited, York Mills, Guide Bridge, Manchester, subject to the conditions that a worker shall not be employed in the afternoon shift in consecutive weeks and that suitable cloakroom accommodation and adequate means of boiling water shall be provided.
