Privy Council Office, 10th May, 1927. EXPLOSIVES ACT, 1875.

Notice is hereby given that, after the expiration of forty days from the date hereof, it is proposed to submit to His Majesty in Council, in pursuance of the above mentioned Act, the draft of an Order in Council, declaring di-nitro-phenol, di-nitro-phenolates, and mixtures of di-nitro-phenol with other substances, to be explosives, except under certain conditions.

And notice is hereby further given that, in accordance with the provisions of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, copies of the proposed draft Order in Council can be obtained by any public body, within forty days of the date of this notice, at the Privy Council Office, Whitehall.
