A PROCLAMATION.

GEORGE R.I.

WHEREAS by the Royal and Parliamentary Titles Act, 1927, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for Us by Our Royal Proclamation under the Great Seal of the Realm issued within six months after the passing of the said Act to make such alteration in the style and titles at present appertaining to the Crown as to Us may seem fit:

And whereas Our present style and titles are, in the Latin tongue, "Georgius V. Dei Gratia Britanniarum et terrarum transmarinarum quae in ditione sunt Britannica Rex, Fidei Defensor, Indiae Imperator", and in the English tongue, "George V. by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India":

And whereas We have received a recommendation from the representatives of Our Governments in Conference assembled that Our style and titles should be altered as in manner hereinafter appearing:

We have thought fit, and We do hereby appoint and declare, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, that henceforth so far as conveniently may be, on all occasions and in all instruments wherein Our style and titles are used, the following alteration shall be made in the style and titles at present appertaining to the Crown, that is to say, in the Latin

tongue, for the word "Britanniarum" there shall be substituted the words "Magnae Britanniae, Hiberniae", and in the English tongue, for the words "the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of" the words "Great Britain, Ireland and".

Given at Our Court at *Buckingham Palace*, this Thirteenth day of May, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven, and in the Eighteenth year of Our Reign.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 27th day of April, 1927, (G.H.), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 20 of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that the Admiralty shall, from time to time, continue or appoint such Officers, Clerks and Servants for the purposes of the Hospital and Schools as seem fit, and may (subject to the approval of Your Majesty in Council) fix the salaries of such Officers and Clerks:

“ And whereas by Section 8 of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1872, it is enacted that the provisions of Section 20 of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1865, so far as the same relate to salaries, shall extend to pecuniary benefits of any kind:

“ And whereas by Her late Majesty's Order in Council dated the 20th day of April, 1880, it is provided, *inter alia*, that the complement of the Royal Hospital School, Greenwich, shall include a Chaplain:

“ And whereas by Your Majesty's Order in Council dated the 11th day of June, 1920, it is provided that any Naval Officer so appointed is to receive the full pay and allowances of his rank, the difference between an amount equal to his half pay and his total emoluments being borne by the Funds of Greenwich Hospital:

“ And whereas we are of opinion that an additional Junior Chaplain should be appointed from the Active List of the Royal Navy to the Royal Hospital School, Greenwich; that the service of the Chaplain so appointed should reckon for all purposes as though it were service in an ordinary Naval appointment; and further that the full cost of the appointment should be a charge upon the funds of Greenwich Hospital:

“ We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the appointment to the Royal Hospital School, Greenwich, of an additional Chaplain from the Active List of the Royal Navy, as from the 8th day of January, 1926, and further to direct that the Funds of Greenwich Hospital shall be charged with the following expenses:—

(1) The full pay and allowances of the Officer actually appointed during the period of his service in the appointment.

(2) An outfit gratuity of £50 in respect of the entry of an additional Chaplain on the Active List of the Royal Navy in consequence of the appointment; and

(3) A contribution to Navy Votes during the currency of the appointment at the rate of £180 per annum in respect of the Officer's right to count his service therein for increase of retired pay or gratuity on final retirement or withdrawal from the Royal Navy.

“ The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in such of these proposals as require their sanction.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by Section 5 of the Merchant Shipping (Mercantile Marine Fund) Act, 1898 (hereinafter referred to as “ the said

Section ”), it is, amongst other things, enacted as follows:—

“ 5.—(1) On and after the commencement of this Act, the general lighthouse authorities shall levy light dues with respect to the voyages made by ships or by way of periodical payment, and not with respect to the lights which a ship passes or from which it derives benefit, and the dues so levied shall take the place of the dues now levied by those authorities.

“ (2) The scale and rules set out in the Second Schedule to this Act shall have effect for the purpose of the levying of light dues in pursuance of this Act, but Her Majesty may, by Order in Council, alter, either generally or with respect to particular classes of cases, the scale or rules and the exemptions therefrom.”

And whereas from time to time divers Orders in Council have been made in pursuance of the said Section:

And whereas it has been made to appear to His Majesty that the Scale and Rules set out in the Second Schedule to the said recited Act should be further altered in manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Him by the said Section, and by and with the advice of His Privy Council, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Merchant Shipping (Light Dues) Order, 1927, and shall have effect from the date of its publication in the *London Gazette*.

2. Each of the dues authorised to be levied in accordance with the Scale set out in the Second Schedule to the said recited Act shall be subject to an increase of thirty-five per cent. for the purpose of the levying of light dues in pursuance of the said recited Act.

3. The payments referred to in the proviso to Rule (1) and in the proviso to Rule (7) of the Rules set out in the Second Schedule to the said recited Act shall also be subject to an increase of thirty-five per cent.

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of

Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called ‘ the said Benefice ’) of Saint Mary, Jackfield, in the County of Salop and in the Diocese of Hereford:

“ Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Saint Mary, Jackfield, is vested alternately in Major Charles Edward Jenkins, of Brooksbank, Cadnam, in the County of Southampton, and in the Rector or Incumbent for the time being of the Rectory of the Parish of Broseley, in the said County of Salop and in the said Diocese of Hereford:

“ And whereas the said Charles Edward Jenkins and the Reverend Charles Strathnairn Jackson, now Rector or Incumbent of the said Rectory of the Parish of Broseley, are desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Saint Mary, Jackfield, should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop of Hereford for the time being:

“ And whereas the Right Reverend Martin Linton, now Bishop of Hereford, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary he, the said Martin Linton, Bishop of Hereford, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

“ And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Saint Mary, Jackfield, which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the Cure of Souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the New Parish of Saint Mary, Jackfield:

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Charles Edward Jenkins and with the consent of the said Charles Strathnairn Jackson, acting as such Rector or Incumbent as aforesaid (in testimony whereof they have signed and sealed this Scheme) and with the consent of the said Martin Linton, Bishop of Hereford (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Saint Mary, Jackfield, shall be transferred to the said Martin Linton, Bishop of Hereford, and his successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said

Martin Linton, Bishop of Hereford, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Hereford.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 17th day of March, 1927, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Folke, the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of North Wootton, the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Haydon, and a portion of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Long Burton with Holnest and also for effecting the union of the residue of the said Benefice of Long Burton with Holnest with the Benefice of Wootton Glanville, all of which Benefices are situate in the County of Dorset and in the Diocese of Salisbury:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend St. Clair George Alfred, Bishop of Salisbury, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon certain unions of Benefices in the said Diocese of Salisbury, duly made their Reports to the said Bishop of Salisbury and therein recommended inter alia (1) the union of the said Benefices of Folke, North Wootton, Haydon and a portion of the said Benefice of Long Burton with Holnest and (2) the union of the residue of the said Benefice of Long Burton with Holnest with the said Benefice of Wootton Glanville and the terms for effecting such unions (together with certain alterations of boundaries) and the said Bishop of Salisbury signified in writing his approval of such Reports:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the said unions of Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Reports:

"And whereas the said Benefices of Haydon, Long Burton with Holnest and Wootton Glanville are now full, the Reverend John Delahaize Ouvry being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Haydon, the Reverend Robert Cooper Fugard being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Long Burton with Holnest and the Reverend John Oswald Thompson being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Wootton Glanville and the said Benefices of Folke and North Wootton are at present vacant:

"And whereas the said John Delahaize Ouvry is now also Incumbent of the Benefice of Goathill in the said County of Dorset and in the Diocese of Bath and Wells:

"And whereas only one Parsonage House will be left standing or remaining within or belonging to the United Benefice of Wootton Glanville with Holnest when the unions which are hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take effect namely the Parsonage House belonging to the said Benefice of Wootton Glanville:

Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said St. Clair George Alfred, Bishop of Salisbury (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That a portion of the said Benefice of Long Burton with Holnest, that is to say, so much of the Parish of the said Benefice of Long Burton with Holnest as is comprised within the Civil Parish of Holnest, shall be severed from the said Benefice and Parish of Long Burton with Holnest and that such severed portion and the said Benefice and Parish of Wootton Glanville shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls and one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Measure provided under the style of 'The United Benefice of Wootton Glanville with Holnest' and that such United Benefice shall be included in and form part of the Archdeaconry of Sherborne and of the Rural Deanery of Cerne.

"2. That the said Benefice of Long Burton (after the severance referred to in Clause 1 of this Scheme) and the said Benefices of Folke, North Wootton and Haydon shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Folke with Long Burton, North Wootton and Haydon' but the Parishes of the said Benefices of Folke, Long Burton, North Wootton and Haydon shall continue distinct in all respects.

"3. That the Church of the Parish of Wootton Glanville shall be the Parish Church of the United Parish of Wootton Glanville with Holnest and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of Wootton Glanville shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for such United Parish.

"4. That with the consents of the said John Delahaize Ouvry and the said John Oswald Thompson (testified by their signing this

Scheme), if upon the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme the said Benefice of Long Burton with Holnest shall be vacant the unions referred to in Clause 1 and Clause 2 of this Scheme shall forthwith take effect, and if upon that day the said Benefice of Long Burton with Holnest shall not be vacant then (A) such unions shall take effect immediately upon the next vacation after that day of the said Benefice of Long Burton with Holnest and in either case the said John Delahaize Ouvry if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Haydon or of the United Benefice hereinafter mentioned of Folke with North Wootton and Haydon shall become and be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of Folke with Long Burton, North Wootton and Haydon and the said John Oswald Thompson if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Wootton Glanville shall become and be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of Wootton Glanville with Holnest and, (B) the said three Benefices of Folke, North Wootton and Haydon shall thereupon and until the union of the said four Benefices of Folke, Long Burton, North Wootton and Haydon takes effect as aforesaid be united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Folke with North Wootton and Haydon' and the said John Delahaize Ouvry if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Haydon shall become and be the first Incumbent of such United Benefice, but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

" 5. That upon the taking effect of the union referred to in Clause 1 of this Scheme the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Wootton Glanville shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Wootton Glanville with Holnest and upon and after the taking effect of the union either of the said three Benefices of Folke, North Wootton and Haydon or of the said four Benefices of Folke, Long Burton, North Wootton and Haydon the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Folke shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice but if the said John Delahaize Ouvry shall become the first Incumbent of such United Benefice then for the period only of his Incumbency the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Haydon shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

" 6. That a Curate at a stipend of £250 per annum be appointed to assist the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Folke, Long Burton, North Wootton and Haydon in performing the duties of the United Benefice, this recommendation and proposal being made to the intent that the Bishop of Salisbury shall have the power of requiring the appointment of such Curate in accordance with and subject to the conditions and provisions of Subsection (b) of Section 18 of the said Measure.

" 7. That upon the taking effect of the union referred to in Clause 1 of this Scheme a portion of the endowments of the said Benefice of Long Burton with Holnest that is to say all those Tithe Rent Charges commuted at

£110 now or formerly arising within the Civil Parish of Holnest and payable to the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Long Burton with Holnest and all capital sums of money, stocks, annuities and other real and personal property representing or being the produce of any sale, redemption or other conversion of any or all of such Tithe Rent Charges shall be severed from the said Benefice of Long Burton with Holnest and be annexed to the United Benefice of Wootton Glanville with Holnest.

" 8. That after the said unions have taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the said United Benefices from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say (a) in the case of the United Benefice of Wootton Glanville with Holnest in every series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to such United Benefice after the union the Patron of the said Benefice of Wootton Glanville shall have the first and third turns and the Patron of the said Benefice of Long Burton shall have the second turn (b) in the case of the United Benefice of Folke with North Wootton and Haydon the Patronage shall be exercised alternately the Patrons of the said Benefice of Folke having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate turn of presentation and the Patron of the said Benefices of North Wootton and Haydon having the right upon the second presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate turn thereafter and (c) in the case of the United Benefice of Folke with Long Burton, North Wootton and Haydon in every series of five successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to such United Benefice after the union the Patrons of the said Benefice of Folke shall have two turns, the Patron of the said Benefices of North Wootton and Haydon shall have two turns and the Patron of the said Benefice of Long Burton shall have one turn, and if under any of the provisions of this Scheme an Incumbent nominated or presented by the Patron of the said Benefices of North Wootton and Haydon shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice the order in which such series of five turns shall be exercised shall be as follows, that is to say, the first and third turns after the union shall belong to the Patrons of the said Benefice of Folke, the second and fifth turns to the Patron of the said Benefices of North Wootton and Haydon and the fourth turn to the Patron of the said Benefice of Long Burton, but if under any of the provisions of this Scheme an Incumbent nominated or presented by either of the Patrons of the said Benefice of Folke shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice the order in which such series of five turns shall be exercised shall be as follows, that is to say, the first and third turns after the union shall belong to the Patron of the said Benefices of North Wootton and Haydon, the second and fifth turns to the Patrons of the said Benefice of Folke and the fourth turn to the Patron of the said Benefice of Long Burton. Provided always that as between the Patrons of the said Benefice of Folke any turn of presentation or nomination under this Scheme either to the United Benefice of Folke

with North Wootton and Haydon or to the United Benefice of Folke with Long Burton, North Wootton and Haydon shall be exercised in the same order and succession as that in which such Patrons are now entitled to present or nominate to the said Benefice of Folke.

" 9. That upon the taking effect of the union referred to in Clause 1 of this Scheme all that detached portion of the Parish of the said Benefice of Haydon (being part of the Civil Parish of Holnest and situate to the east of such Civil Parish) which lies contiguous to the Parishes of the said Benefices of Long Burton with Holnest and Wootton Glanville shall be annexed to the United Benefice and Parish of Wootton Glanville with Holnest for all ecclesiastical purposes. Provided always that no part of the endowments of the said Benefice of Haydon shall be disannexed by reason of such transfer of territory.

" Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Salisbury has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

" Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Arthur Cayley, Bishop of Gloucester, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the re-arrangement of certain Benefices in the said Diocese of Gloucester (including the said two Benefices of Alderley with Tresham and Hillesley) duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Gloucester and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices of Alderley with Tresham and Hillesley and the terms for effecting such union, and the said Bishop of Gloucester signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

" And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

" And whereas both of the said Benefices of Alderley with Tresham and Hillesley are now full, the Reverend Daniel Yarrton Mills being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Alderley with Tresham and the Reverend Arthur Hassall being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Hillesley:

" Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Arthur Cayley, Bishop of Gloucester (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

" 1. That the said Benefice of Alderley with Tresham and the said Benefice of Hillesley shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Alderley with Hillesley' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

" 2. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith; and if one only of the said two Benefices shall be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the other of the said two Benefices; and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of that one of the said two Benefices which shall last be avoided after the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

" We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for constituting a separate District for spiritual purposes to be taken partly out of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Matthias, Sneinton, partly out of the New Parish (sometime District) of Saint Paul, Carlton in the Willows, and partly out of the Parish of Colwick, all in the County of Nottingham and in the Diocese of Southwell:

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said New Parish of Saint Matthias, Sneinton, the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Carlton in the Willows, and the said Parish of Colwick are Cures wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it appears to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said New Parish of Saint Matthias, Sneinton, of the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Carlton in the Willows, and of the said Parish of Colwick which are hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate District in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate District any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purposes of Divine Worship:

"And whereas under the provisions of an Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the 30th day of May, 1924, and published in the London Gazette on the same day the Benefice of Saint Mary, Nottingham, and a portion of the Benefice of Saint Paul, Nottingham, both in the said County and Diocese, were united into one Benefice and the Benefice of Saint Catharine, Nottingham, in the same County and Diocese, and the remaining portion of the said Benefice of Saint Paul, Nottingham, were also united into one Benefice; and it was by the same Order provided, amongst other things, that a part amounting to £172 per annum of the annual payment formerly made by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Saint Paul, Nottingham, should be held and accumulated by us towards the endowment of the District to be assigned to the proposed new Church of Saint Cyprian, Nottingham, towards the cost of the erection of which Church the net proceeds of the sale or sales which have been effected of the materials and site of the Church of Saint Paul, Nottingham, are to be applied:

"And whereas we have agreed to make and pay out of the Common Fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act a grant of £178 per annum to the Minister of the said proposed separate District so soon as a Minister shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein mentioned Act and to his successors:

"And whereas the said grant of the said yearly sum of £178 will, after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111:

"And whereas the Southwell Diocesan Finance Association have conveyed to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, (1) a plot of land containing 2988 square yards or thereabouts as the site for the proposed Church of Saint Cyprian, Sneinton, and (2) another plot of land adjoining the above mentioned plot and containing 1712 square yards or thereabouts, upon which a house and premises intended as a Parsonage House has been

erected out of moneys provided by the said Southwell Diocesan Finance Association, as part of the endowment for the said proposed separate District:

"And whereas the conveyances of the site for the said proposed Church of Saint Cyprian, Sneinton, and of the site of the house intended as the Parsonage House for the said proposed District have been made upon the understanding that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District and, when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas the said Southwell Diocesan Finance Association have nominated to us the Bishop of Southwell for the time being as the person to whom they desire that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish should be assigned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Bernard Oliver Francis, now Bishop of Southwell (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said New Parish of Saint Matthias, Sneinton, of the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Carlton in the Willows, and of the said Parish of Colwick, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint Cyprian, Sneinton':

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said District so recommended to be constituted and, when such District shall have become a New Parish as aforesaid, then of such New Parish and of the nomination of an Incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid, be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Bernard Oliver Francis, Bishop of Southwell, and his successors for ever.

"And we further recommend that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending or proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The Schedule to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Cyprian, Sneinton, comprising:—

"All those contiguous portions of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Matthias, Sneinton, of the New Parish (sometime District) of Saint Paul, Carlton in the Willows, and of the Parish of Colwick, all in

the County of Nottingham and in the Diocese of Southwell, which are comprised within and are bounded by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the New Parish of Saint Christopher, Sneinton, in the said County and Diocese, from the said New Parish of Saint Matthias, Sneinton, at the centre of the bridge which carries the Nottingham Suburban Line of the London and North Eastern Railway across the road called Sneinton Dale, and extending thence northward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of $37\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries Carlton Road across such line of railway, and extending thence north eastward along the middle of Carlton Road for a distance of $3\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Thorneywood Lane, and extending thence northward along the middle of Thorneywood Lane (thereby following in part the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Matthias, Sneinton; from the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Carlton in the Willows) for a distance of 37 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the middle of the course of the proposed new road running into Standhill Road, and extending thence first eastward and then north eastward along the middle of the course of the said proposed new road for a distance of 21 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Standhill Road, and extending thence south eastward along the middle of Standhill Road for a distance of 6 yards or thereabouts to a point opposite to the middle of the footpath leading into Foxhill Road, and extending thence north eastward to and along the middle of such footpath for a distance of 19 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Foxhill Road, and extending thence first eastward and then south eastward along the middle of Foxhill Road for a distance of 26 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called First Avenue, and extending thence south westward along the middle of First Avenue for a distance of 8 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the middle of the footpath leading into Hooton Road, and extending thence first southward to and along and then south westward along the middle of the last mentioned footpath for a distance of 9 chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches Hooton Road, and extending thence first south westward and then southward along the middle of Hooton Road for a distance of 7 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called Carlton Hill, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Carlton Hill for a distance of $2\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to a point due north of the northern end of the fence forming the boundary between the United Methodist Church and the house and premises known as Hawthorn Cottage, and extending thence in a straight line almost due south for a distance of $13\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the point upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Carlton in the Willows, from the said Parish of Colwick where the fence forming the southern boundary of the Carlton Brick Works meets the fence which divides the close numbered 4 upon the Ordnance Survey Map of the Civil Parish of Colwick published in the year 1914 on the scale of 25 inches to a mile and upon the map or plan annexed to this

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 16th and 17th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 50, and of the Act of the 23rd and 24th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 124, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of so much as is hereinafter mentioned of the ownership of the Advowson or right of Patronage of and presentation to the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Codnor and Loscoe, situate in the County of Derby and in the Diocese of Southwell, by way of exchange for so much as is hereinafter mentioned of the Advowson or right of Patronage of and presentation to the Benefice (being a District) of Saint Luke, Loscoe, situate in the same County and Diocese:

“ Whereas under the provisions of the 21st section of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 37, the right of Patronage and presentation to each of the said Benefices of Codnor and Loscoe, and Saint Luke, Loscoe, is at present exercised alternately by Your Majesty and Your Successors and by the Bishop of Southwell for the time being:

“ And whereas it has been proposed to us that the Patronage of the said two Benefices of Codnor and Loscoe, and Saint Luke, Loscoe, should be assigned and transferred by way of exchange in the manner which is hereinafter recommended and proposed:

“ And whereas we have made due inquiry and calculation as to the circumstances and relative value of the said two Benefices and of the Patronage thereof respectively, and we do hereby certify to Your Majesty in Council that the circumstances and present values of the said two Benefices are as set forth in the Schedule hereunto annexed:

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Bernard Oliver Francis, now Bishop of Southwell, as the alternate Patron of the said Benefice of Codnor and Loscoe (in testimony of which consent he has signed this Scheme and has affixed thereto his Epis-

CARDIGANSHIRE (CONTROL OF DOGS) ORDER OF 1927.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1925, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Power to make Regulations.

1.—(1) The Local Authority of the District specified in the Schedule to this Order may, in accordance with the provisions of this Order, make Regulations, with a view to the prevention of worrying of cattle (including sheep) for requiring that dogs or any class of dogs shall, during all or any of the hours between sunset and sunrise, be kept by the owners thereof under control in manner prescribed by the Regulations.

(2) The Regulations may apply to the whole or any part of the District, and may exempt any class of dogs either generally or under prescribed conditions.

Confirmation of Regulations.

2.—(1) Regulations made under this Order shall not take effect unless and until they have been submitted to and confirmed by the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries.

(2) A copy of any Regulations made by the Local Authority under this Order, signed and certified by the Clerk of that Local Authority to be a true copy and to have been duly confirmed shall be evidence, until the contrary is proved, in all legal proceedings of the due making, confirmation and existence of the Regulations, without further or other proof.

Seizure of Dogs where Regulations are contravened.

3. Any dog in respect of which an offence is being committed against a Regulation made

under this Order may be seized and treated as a stray dog under the powers conferred by Section three of the Dogs Act, 1906.

Extension of Definition in Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

4. Dogs shall be animals for the purposes of the following sections of the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894 (namely):—

Section forty-three (powers of police);
Section forty-four (powers of inspectors);
and also for the purposes of all other sections of the said Act containing provisions relative to or consequent on the provisions of those sections and this Order, including such sections as relate to offences and legal proceedings.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

5. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.
