LLANFROTHERN DRAINAGE AREA  
(MERIONETHSHIRE).

Notice is hereby given, that the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries has prepared a draft Order under the Land Drainage Act, 1918, constituting certain lands drained by the River Glaslyn or by the tributaries or drains connected therewith in the County of Merioneth, a separate Drainage District under the Land Drainage Acts, 1861 and 1918.

MIDDLE LEVEL COMMISSIONERS.

*Alteration of Acts.*
