WHEREAS by the Cyprus (Annexation) Orders in Council 1914 and 1917, provision was made for the acquisition of British nationality by certain Ottoman subjects:

And whereas it is desirable to make further provision for the acquisition of British nationality by former Ottoman Nationals resident in Egypt who opt for British nationality under the Egyptian Nationality Law of the 26th of May, 1926:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The Cyprus (Annexation) Amendment Order in Council, 1917, is hereby amended in the following respects:—

(I) By the addition at the end of Article 1 thereof of the following Sub-Article:—

“(iii) Any former Ottoman national who shall have opted for British nationality under Article 4 of the Egyptian Law of Nationality (Décret-Loi sur la Nationalité Egyptienne) of the 26th of May 1926 and who

(a) shall satisfy the Governor that he has validly exercised such option, and

(b) shall return to Cyprus within six months from the 31st of May, 1927, and

(c) shall apply after his return to Cyprus to the Governor before the expiration of nine months from the said 31st of May, 1927, for a Certificate of British Nationality under this Order, and

(d) shall make a declaration in such form as the Governor may direct that he intends forthwith to become ordinarily resident in Cyprus, and

(e) shall have taken the Oath of Allegiance as hereinafter directed.”

Provided that any such person shall acquire British nationality as from the date of the Certificate granted to him under this Order.

(II) By the addition at the end of Article 2 thereof of the following Sub-Article:—

“(iii) A Certificate of British Nationality shall be granted to any person coming within Article 1 (iii) of this Order who shall have complied with the conditions laid down in paragraphs (a) (b) (c) (d) and (e) thereof.”

(III) By the insertion in Article 4 (ii) thereof after the words “Article 2 (ii)” of the words “and Article 2 (iii).”

2. This Order may be cited as the Cyprus (Annexation) Amendment Order in Council, 1927, and shall be read as one with the Cyprus (Annexation) Orders in Council, 1914 and 1917, and the said Orders may be cited as the Cyprus (Annexation) Orders in Council, 1914 to 1927.

“ And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Saint Mary Magdalen, Stoke Bishop, which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the Cure of Souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the New Parish of Saint Mary Magdalen, Stoke Bishop :

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Maurice Erskine Hoets, being the person whose consent as Patron is required by the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts and of the Act of the 1st and 2nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 106, (in testimony of which consent he has signed and sealed this Scheme) and with the consent of the said George, Bishop of Bristol (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Saint Mary Magdalen, Stoke Bishop, shall be transferred to the said George, Bishop of Bristol, and his successors in the same Bishopric and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said George, Bishop of Bristol, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting an alteration of the boundaries of the Parish of the Benefice of Broadwell with Adlestrop by the annexation thereto of a contiguous portion of the Parish of the Benefice of Stow on the Wold, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Gloucester and in the Diocese of Gloucester:

“ Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Arthur Cayley, Bishop of Gloucester, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report (inter alia) upon an alteration of the

boundaries of the Parishes of the said two Benefices of Broadwell with Adlestrop and Stow on the Wold, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Gloucester and therein recommended the transfer to the said Parish of Broadwell with Adlestrop of a portion of the said Parish of Stow on the Wold, and the said Bishop of Gloucester signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the said alteration of boundaries based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas both of the said Benefices of Broadwell with Adlestrop and Stow on the Wold are now full, the Reverend Francis Grenville Cholmondeley being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Broadwell with Adlestrop and the Reverend John Thomas Evans being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Stow on the Wold:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Arthur Cayley, Bishop of Gloucester (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), and with the consents of the said Francis Grenville Cholmondeley and the said John Thomas Evans (testified by their signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"That upon the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme a portion of the Parish of the said Benefice of Stow on the Wold, that is to say, so much of the said Parish as is contained within the Civil Parish of Donnington and lies to the east of the middle of the road leading from Stow on the Wold past Weasel Barn and Ganborough House to Evesham shall become and be annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of the said Benefice of Broadwell with Adlestrop but that no alteration in the Patronage or endowments of either of the said Benefices of Broadwell with Adlestrop or Stow on the Wold shall be made by reason of such alteration of boundaries.

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Gloucester has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the alteration of boundaries therein recommended shall be effected to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Gloucester.

UNIVERSITY OF OXFORD.

STATUTE APPROVED BY CONGREGATION ON
TUESDAY, MAY 10, 1927.

Whereas it is expedient to provide for the possibility of remedying cases of hardship which may arise under Sectio I. § 1. cl. 2 of Titulus IV of the Statutes of the University of Oxford: Now the said University in exercise of the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, and of all other powers enabling it,
ENACTS, SUBJECT TO THE APPROVAL OF HIS MAJESTY IN COUNCIL, AS FOLLOWS.

In Statt. Tit. IV. Sect. I. § 1. cl. 2, at the end of the clause the following words shall be added:—

"Provided that in any case where a vote of the Visitatorial Board has from any cause failed to be taken within the period hereinbefore specified, if the Hebdomadal Council is satisfied that hardship has been caused to the Professor, Reader, or other University Teacher concerned by the failure to take such vote, it may be taken at any date before the day on which his office would terminate under this clause."

The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that at a Trial of the Pyx begun at Goldsmiths' Hall, in the City of London, on the 1st March and concluded on the 4th May, 1927, the following Verdicts of the Pyx Jury were delivered to the King's Remembrancer, viz. :—

TRIAL OF THE PYX OF THE LONDON MINT.

VERDICT.

WE, whose names are hereunder written, having been sworn on the first day of March One thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven before the King's Remembrancer, at Goldsmiths' Hall, in the City of London, have made the assays and trials of His Majesty's silver coins in the Pyx of the Royal Mint in London, which, according to accounts produced by the Officers of the Mint, were coined in the said Mint from the first day of January One thousand nine hundred and twenty-six to the thirty-first day of December One thousand nine hundred and twenty-six, both days inclusive. We found that there were no gold coins in the said Pyx and we ascertained that the number of coins, of silver, in each packet produced to us, corresponded with the number which the Officers of the Mint represented it to contain. We took Two coins from each of such packets of silver coins, making altogether 50 half-crowns, 38 florins, 172 shillings, 120 sixpences, 1 fourpence, 25 threepences, 1 twopence, and 1 penny, and weighed each of the said silver coins separately, and ascertained that they were within the remedy as to weight prescribed in the First Schedule to the Coinage Act 1870, as amended by the Coinage Act 1891. We found that the amount of variation from the standard of weight specified in the said First Schedule to the Coinage Act 1870 as so amended was plus eight thousandths of an ounce (+008 oz.) on the whole of such coins. We then melted the said silver coins so taken out and weighed into an ingot, and assayed such ingot, comparing it with the standard Trial Plate made of pure silver (as prescribed by the Coinage Act 1920) produced by the Board of Trade, so as to ascertain whether the metal was within the remedy as to fineness prescribed in the First Schedule to the Coinage Act 1870 as amended by the Coinage Acts 1891 and 1920, and we found that the amount of variation from the standard of fineness specified in the First Schedule to the Coinage Act 1870 as so amended was minus one hundred and fifty-two hundred-thousandths (or -00152), and that, therefore, the said metal was within the prescribed remedy as to fineness. We weighed the residue of the said silver coins in bulk, and we ascertained that they were within the remedy as to weight. We then took from such residue 2 half-crowns, 2 florins, 2 shillings, 2 sixpences, and 2 threepences, and weighed and assayed them separately, and we found that such half-crowns weighed respectively, the first 217·621 grains, the second 218·280 grains; that such florins weighed respectively, the first 174·716 grains, the second 173·808 grains; that such shillings weighed respectively, the

first 87·551 grains, the second 87·108 grains; that such sixpences weighed respectively, the first 43·501 grains, the second 43·572 grains; and that such threepences weighed respectively, the first 21·817 grains, the second 21·729 grains. We then assayed the said 2 half-crowns, the said 2 florins, the said 2 shillings, the said 2 sixpences, and the said 2 threepences separately and we found the millesimal fineness of such half-crowns to be the first 498·5, the second 496·9; of such florins to be the first 496·6, the second 495·7, of such shillings to be the first 497·2, the second 496·0; of such sixpences to be the first 500·0, the second 501·9, and of such threepences to be the first 499·3, the second 502·6.

TRIAL OF THE PYX OF THE PERTH BRANCH MINT.

VERDICT.

WE, whose names are hereunder written, having been sworn on the first day of March One thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven, before the King's Remembrancer, at Goldsmiths' Hall, in the City of London, have made the assays and trials of His Majesty's gold coins in the Pyx of the Branch Mint at Perth in the State of Western Australia, which, according to accounts produced by the Officers of the Mint, were coined in the said Branch Mint from the 1st day of January One thousand nine hundred and twenty-six to the 31st day of December One thousand nine hundred and twenty-six, both days inclusive. We ascertained that the number of coins in each packet produced to us corresponded with the number which the Officers of the Mint represented it to contain, and we took 5 coins from each of such packets of gold coins, amounting altogether to 95 sovereigns or twenty-shilling pieces, and we weighed each of the said coins separately, and ascertained that they were within the remedy as to weight prescribed in the First Schedule to the Coinage Act, 1870, as amended by the Coinage Act, 1891. We found that the amount of variation from the standard of weight specified in the said First Schedule to the said Act as so amended was nil on the whole of such coins. We then melted the said gold coins so taken out and weighed into an ingot, and assayed such ingot, comparing it with the standard gold Trial Plate produced by the Board of Trade, so as to ascertain whether the metal was within the remedy as to fineness prescribed in the said First Schedule to

the said Act amended as aforesaid, and we found that the amount of variation thereof from the standard of fineness specified in the said First Schedule to the said Act as so amended was plus eight hundred-thousandths (or +00008), and that, therefore, the said metal was within the prescribed remedy as to fineness. We weighed the residue of the said gold coins in bulk, and we ascertained that they were within the remedy as to weight. We then took from such residue 3 sovereigns and weighed and assayed them separately, and we found that such sovereigns weighed respectively, the first 123.258 grains, the second 123.298 grains, the third 123.217 grains.

We then assayed the said 3 sovereigns separately, and we found the millesimal fineness of such sovereigns to be, the first 916.70, the second 916.81, the third 916.71 respectively.

TRIAL OF THE PYX OF THE PRETORIA BRANCH MINT.

VERDICT.

WE, whose names are hereunder written, having been sworn on the first day of March One thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven, before the King's Remembrancer, at Goldsmiths' Hall, in the City of London, have made the assays and trials of His Majesty's gold coins in the Pyx of the Branch Mint at Pretoria in the Union of South Africa, which, according to accounts produced by the Officers of the Mint, were coined in the said Branch Mint from the 1st day of January One thousand nine hundred and twenty-six to the 31st day of December One thousand nine hundred and twenty-six, both days inclusive. We ascertained that the number of coins in each packet produced to us corresponded with the number which the Officers of the Mint represented it to contain, and we took one coin from each of such packets of gold coins, amounting altogether to 112 sovereigns or twenty-shilling pieces, and to nine half-sovereigns or ten-shilling pieces, and we weighed each of the said coins separately, and ascertained that they were within the remedy as to weight prescribed in the First Schedule to the Coinage Act, 1870, as amended by the Coinage Act, 1891. We found that the amount of variation from the standard of weight specified in the said First Schedule to the said Act as so amended was minus two-

thousandths of an ounce (-002 oz.) on the whole of such coins.
