

astical Commissioners, further represent that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said Church of Saint Barnabas, New Whittington, situate as aforesaid, and that the fees or dues to be received in respect of the publication of banns and of the solemnization or performance of marriages, churchings and burials should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being: provided always that, so long as the Reverend Ellis Arthur Crompton, Clerk in Holy Orders, the present Rector or Incumbent of the Rectory of the said Parish of Whittington, shall continue to be such Rector or Incumbent, all the fees or dues which may be received in respect of such publication, solemnization or performance at the said Church of Saint Barnabas, New Whittington, situate as aforesaid, shall be paid over by the Minister thereof to the said Ellis Arthur Crompton.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration and to make such Order with respect thereto as to Your Majesty, in Your Royal Wisdom, shall seem meet.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Saint Barnabas, New Whittington, being:—

"All that part of the Parish of Whittington, in the County of Derby and in the Diocese of Southwell, which is bounded upon the north, upon the north east and upon the east by the Parish of Staveley, upon the south east and upon the south by the Parish of Brimington, both in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the west and upon the north west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Brimington from the said Parish of Whittington at the point where such boundary reaches the southern side of Station Lane opposite to the middle of the footpath leading to Whittington Green, and extending thence first northward across Station Lane to a point in the middle of the southern end of the said footpath and then first northward and then north westward along the middle of such footpath for a distance of 28 chains or thereabouts to the point at the southern side of the roadway leading to Whittington Green where such footpath meets the footpath leading into High Street, and extending thence north eastward along the middle of the last mentioned footpath for a distance of 17 chains or thereabouts to the point where it crosses the middle of Sickley Brook, and extending thence northward along the middle of the said stream for a distance of 6 chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the southern side of High Street, and extending thence north eastward in a straight line diagonally across High Street for a distance of 14 yards or thereabouts to the point on its northern side at the southern end of the fence forming the western boundary of the house and premises known as Number 1, High Street, and extending thence first north westward and then in various directions along the last mentioned fence and along the fences forming the

western boundaries of the closes numbered 243, 243a and 231 and the south western boundaries of the closes numbered 224, 225, 215 and 214 upon the Ordnance Survey Map of the Civil Parish of Whittington published in the year 1916 on the scale of 25 inches to a mile, and also upon the map or plan annexed to this Representation, for a distance of 60 chains or thereabouts to the point where the fence forming the south western boundary of the said close numbered 214 crosses the middle of the footpath leading from Whittington towards West Handley, and extending thence north eastward along the middle of the last mentioned footpath for a distance of 32 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Whittington from the said Parish of Staveley."

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Southwell.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 5th day of May, 1927, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called 'the said Benefice') of Tilsworth, in the County of Bedford and in the Diocese of Saint Albans:
