UNIVERSITIES OF OXFORD AND CAMBRIDGE ACT, 1923.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's

Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 17th June, 1927, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £35,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 20th June, 1927, to Saturday, the 25th June, 1927, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms, which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

WELFARE OF WORKERS IN FACTORIES AND WORKSHOPS.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice that, in pursuance of the powers conferred on him by Section 7 of the Police, Factories, etc. (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act, 1916, of making orders for securing the welfare of the workers employed in factories and workshops, he proposes to make an order to apply to all factories and workshops in England and Wales (excluding Norfolk and Suffolk) in which the gutting, salting and packing of herring are carried on.

Copies of the draft order may be obtained on application to the Chief Inspector of Factories, Home Office, Whitehall, London, S.W. 1.

Any objection to the proposed Order must be sent to the Secretary of State at the Home Office, Whitehall, London, S.W. 1, within 30 days after the date of this notice. The objection must be in writing and must state:—

- (a) the requirements in the draft Order objected to;
- (b) the specific grounds of objection; and
- (c) the modifications asked for.

Where an objection is made jointly on behalf of a number of occupiers, the names of the occupiers and their addresses must be stated, or, if the objection is made by an association of occupiers on behalf of its members, the number of the members affected by the Order.

APPOINTMENT OF STANDING FOR HACKNEY CARRIAGES.

By virtue of the Act 13 and 14 Victoria, Chapter 7, intituled "An Act for Consolidating the Office of the Registrar of Metropolitan Public Carriages with the Office of Commissioners of Police of the Metropolis, and making other Provisions in regard to the Consolidated Offices."

I, WILLIAM THOMAS FRANCIS HORWOOD, Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, do hereby APPOINT a Standing for eighteen Hackney Carriages at Clapham Common, South Side, and The Polygon, S.W., in three portions, and do make the following Regulations with regard to the Boundaries for the same, viz. :—

First Portion.—Eleven Carriages at Clapham Common, South Side, North-west side of roadway, commencing eleven yards South-west of Cab Shelter, extending, by kerb, as far as necessary for eleven carriages.

Front of vehicles toward the North-east.

NOTE.—A space of ten feet to be left clear between the third and fourth carriages, opposite the footpath crossing the Triangle.

Second Portion.—Two Carriages on West side of Triangle, East side of roadway, commencing five feet North of the Cattle Trough, extending, by kerb, as far as necessary for two carriages.

Front of vehicles toward the South.

Third Portion.—Five Carriages at the South end of the Polygon, extending, by kerb, as far as necessary for five carriages.

Front of vehicles toward the South.

The first portion of the Standing to be fed exclusively by carriages from the second portion, and the second portion from the third portion.

Provided that no Hackney Carriage shall be suffered to stand across any Street or Thoroughfare, or opposite the end of any Street or Carriageway, or upon any place where Foot Passengers usually cross the Carriageway.
