The following Address of the Ministers and Elders of the Church of Scotland, convened in General Assembly, having been forwarded by His Grace the Lord High Commissioner to the Secretary of State for Scotland for presentation to The King, has been presented

accordingly to His Majesty, who was pleased to receive the same very graciously.

To The KING's Most Excellent Majesty.

May it please Your Majesty,

We, your Majesty's most devoted and loyal subjects, the Ministers and Elders of the Church of Scotland, convened in General Assembly have received with much appreciation and deepest gratitude the most gracious letter of Your Majesty which has been presented to us through His Grace the Lord High Commissioner.

We value greatly your Majesty's assurance of interest in the work of the Church of Scotland and your resolution to maintain her rights and privileges.

That you have favourably commented on our efforts to extend the Kingdom of God has encouraged us much, and we assure your Majesty that no labour will be spared by us to realize more fully the Rule of Christ over all lives and interests committed to our care.

Deeply exercised over the divisions of our Presbyterianism in Scotland, we are eagerly engaged in negotiations to secure such a Union between our own Church and the United Free Church of Scotland as will contribute more largely to that concord and brotherhood which your Majesty desiderates, and we trust that ere long now these negotiations will be brought to full fruition.

We have noted with much admiration and satisfaction the triumphal progress of the Duke and Duchess of York in their visit to the British Dominions of the Commonwealth of Australia and of New Zealand; and we express

the hope that their visit may be fraught with much profit to the people of these Dominions; and that divine protection may be granted to them on their homeward journey.

We were specially gratified by your Majesty's appointment as your Representative to the General Assembly of His Grace the Earl of Stair, D.S.O., an Elder and devoted member of our Church, and the head of a family which has for many generations been associated with the interests of the Scottish Church.

We pray that Almighty God may richly bless your Majesty, Queen Mary, and all the Members of your Royal House, and graciously add many more years to your beneficent and glorious reign.

UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE ACTS,
1920-1926.

REFERENCES TO THE HIGH COURT OF JUSTICE UNDER SECTION 10 (1) OF THE UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE ACT, 1920.

Pursuant to paragraph 6 of the Unemployment Insurance (Determination of Questions) Regulations, 1920, the Minister of Labour

hereby gives notice of his intention to refer to the High Court for decision the following questions that have arisen in applications made to him for his decision under Section 10 of the Unemployment Insurance Act, 1920, namely, whether the employment of a person in

(a) grading and packing tomatoes; bunching chrysanthemums; and occasionally picking tomatoes and trimming plants;

(b) the cultivation of tomato plants and chrysanthemums; grading, weighing, and packing tomatoes; and packing chrysanthemums;

(c) grading and packing tomatoes, trimming tomato plants, and bunching chrysanthemums;

(d) trimming, grading, and bunching flowers;

(e) trimming, grading, bunching, packing and occasionally cutting flowers;

(f) organising and superintending work in the packing sheds and occasionally assisting in the actual packing, the produce dealt with consisting of cucumbers, tomatoes, grapes, plants, ferns, and palms;

is or is not employment within the meaning of the Unemployment Insurance Act, 1920.

Under Rules 5 and 18 of the Rules of the Supreme Court for regulating appeals and references to the High Court under the Unemployment Insurance Act, 1920, Section 10, any person who claims to be affected by the decisions to be given in the above mentioned cases may apply to the Judge for leave to intervene.

The cases have been set down in the High Court, and will be heard in the near future.
