from the said Chapelry of Illingworth crosses the middle of Clough Lane near its junction with the road leading past the western side of the tumulus known as Ring Camp, and extending thence first eastward and then north eastward along the middle of Clough Lane for a distance of 27 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Moor End Road, and extending thence first eastward, then south eastward and then south westward along the middle of Moor End Road for a distance of 461 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the footpath leading past the western end of Ramsden Wood into the road connecting Mount Tabor and Mount Pellon, and extending thence first south eastward and then southward along the middle of the said footpath for a distance of 10 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Chapelry of Illingworth from the said New Parish of Mount Pellon.

"II. And also all that portion of the said Chapelry of Luddenden which is bounded upon the east partly by the said Chapelry of Illingworth and partly by the New Parish of Saint John, Ovenden, in the said County and Diccese, upon the north east by the last named New Parish, upon the north by the New Parish of Oxenhope, in the said County of York and in the Diocese of Bradford, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the west and upon the south west by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Oxenhope from the said Chapelry of Luddenden at the point in the middle of Fly Flat Reservoir where the boundaries of the Civil Parish of Oxenhope, the Civil Parish of Midgley and the Civil Parish of Halifax all meet, and extending thence south eastward and in a straight line for a distance of 1 mile and 32 chains or thereabouts to a point west of the house known as Haigh Cote in the middle of the ford across the stream which flows into the Northern end of Haigh Cote Dam, and extending thence southward and in a straight line (thereby crossing the south western corner of Leadbeater Dam and Castle Carr Road) for a distance of 1 mile and 7 chains or there-abouts to the centre of Caty Well Bridge which carries Saltonstall Lane across Caty Well Brook, and extending thence south eastward along the middle of Saltonstall Lane for a distance of 15 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road leading to Wainstalls House, and extending thence south eastward and in a straight line for a distance of 35 chains or thereabouts to the point where the road leading from the house known as Upper Shaw Booth into Spanefield Lane is joined by the footpath leading from the houses known as Sandy Ford, and extending thence south westward along the middle of the last mentioned road for a distance of 2 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Spanefield Lane, and extending thence south eastward along the middle of Spanefield Lane for a distance of 21 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Stocks Lane, and extending thence south westward along the middle of Stocks Lane for a distance of 8 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the middle of the road leading to the Sentry Edge Quarries, and extending thence in a straight line due south east (thereby crossing the said quarries) for a distance of 14 chains or thereabouts to the

boundary which divides the said Chapelry of Luddenden from the said Chapelry of Illingworth.

" THE SECOND SCHEDULE.

"The territory to be dissevered from the said New Parish of Mount Pellon and to be annexed to the New Parish of Saint George, Ovenden, in the said County of York and in the said Diocese of Wakefield, being:---

All that portion of the said New Parish of Mount Pellon which is bounded upon the north east partly by the said Chapelry of Illingworth and partly by the said New Parish of Saint George, Ovenden, upon the east by the last named New Parish and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south, upon the south west, and upon the west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint George, Ovenden, from the said New Parish of Mount Pellon at the junction of Shroggs Road with Hebble Lane, and extending thence first north westward, then westward and then again north westward along the middle of Hebble Lane for a distance of 441 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Wood Lane and the road called Scar Head, and extending thence first north westward and then north eastward along the middle of Scar Head for a distance of 16 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Boy Lane upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Mount Pellon from the said Chapelry of Illingworth."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme or Representation have been transmitted to the Fatrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such Scheme or Representation and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent thereto:

And whereas the said Scheme or Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme or Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Wakefield.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th
