

And whereas it is further enacted in the Act aforesaid that "the powers of the Commissioners shall continue in force until the end of the year nineteen hundred and twenty-seven and no longer: Provided that His Majesty in Council may, on the application of the Commissioners, continue their powers for such further period as His Majesty may think fit, but not beyond the end of the year nineteen hundred and twenty-eight":

And whereas The University of London Commissioners have made application to His Majesty in Council for the continuation of their powers under the said Act:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the powers of The University of London Commissioners shall continue until the end of the year nineteen hundred and twenty-eight.

WHEREAS by the Maintenance Orders (Facilities for Enforcement) Act, 1920, provision has been made for the enforcement in England and Ireland of maintenance orders made by a Court in any part of His Majesty's Dominions outside the United Kingdom to which the said Act extends:

And whereas by the said Act it is amongst other things provided that where His Majesty is satisfied that reciprocal provisions have been made by the Legislature of any part of His Majesty's Dominions outside the United Kingdom for the enforcement within that part of maintenance orders made by Courts within England and Ireland, His Majesty may by Order in Council extend the said Act to that part, and thereupon that part shall become a part of His Majesty's Dominions to which the said Act extends:

And whereas on the 6th day of December, 1922, the Irish Free State was established under the provisions of an Act of Parliament shortly entitled the Irish Free State Constitution Act, 1922 (Session 2):

And whereas His Majesty is satisfied that the Legislature of the part of His Majesty's Dominions outside the United Kingdom, hereinafter mentioned, has made reciprocal provisions for the enforcement within that part of maintenance orders made by Courts within England and Ireland:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers by the above recited Act in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The Maintenance Orders (Facilities for Enforcement) Act, 1920, shall apply to the part of His Majesty's Dominions outside the United Kingdom hereunder mentioned:—

The Territory for the Seat of Government of the Commonwealth of Australia.

2. Nothing in this Order shall affect the making, registration, confirmation or enforcement in the Irish Free State of any maintenance order as defined in sections 10 and 11 of the said Act.

And the Right Honourable Leopold Charles Stennett Amery, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 5th and 6th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 108, and of the Act of the 21st and 22nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 57, which Acts are known as "The Ecclesiastical Leasing Acts," duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 23rd day of June, 1927, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 5th and 6th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 108, and of the Act of the 21st and 22nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 57, which Acts are known as 'The Ecclesiastical Leasing Acts,' have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme relating to the Benefice of Wilsford, in the County of Lincoln and in the Diocese of Lincoln:

"Whereas the annual value of the said Benefice of Wilsford has been improved under and by virtue of certain leases of the stone quarries on the Glebe lands belonging to the said Benefice and the sale of a portion of such Glebe lands, which leases and sale were carried out under the authority of the said Acts, with the concurrence of us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, by former Incumbents and by the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Wilsford:

"And whereas the moneys, being the net proceeds of the said leases and sale have been invested by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, in accordance with the provision in that behalf contained in the said Acts, and the investments so made include a sum of £3,129 11s. 3d. India £3 per centum Stock:

"And whereas the improvement in the annual value of the said Benefice arising from or by means of the said leases and sale exceeds the annual sum of £180 and after the appropriation hereinafter recommended to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, for the benefit of our Common Fund, of such portion as is hereinafter mentioned of the improved value which has arisen as aforesaid, the average annual income of the said Benefice will still be considerably in excess of the sum of £300, although the population of the Parish is less than 1000:
