MERCHANDISE MARKS ACT, 1926.

With reference to the notices which were
published in the London, Edinburgh and Bel-
fast Gazettes of the 25th March regarding
references made by the Board of Trade to the
Standing Committee under the Merchandise
Marks Act, 1926, in respect of the following
classes and descriptions of goods:—

(1) The following descriptions of im-
ported steel:—

(a) plates, rails, joists, angles, channels,
sectional material of all descriptions, cast-
ings, forgings, rounds, squares, flats,
hexagons, hoops, hot and cold rolled strip;

(b) the following descriptions of im-
ported wrought iron:—

bars, hoops, sections, plates and
sheets.

(2) Imported gold and silver leaf;

and in the said Gazettes of the 13th May in
respect of imported woven labels of textile
materials, the Board of Trade hereby give
notice in accordance with the provisions of
Section 2, Subsection (7) of the Act that
reports have been made by the Committee in
respect of the aforesaid classes and descriptions
of goods.

FARM AND GARDEN SEEDS.

PROPOSED EXEMPTION FROM SECTION 1.

The Board of Trade, having considered re-
presentations which have been made to them
by persons appearing to the Board to have a
substantial interest in the matter, hereby give
notice of their intention to direct, in pursuance
of the powers conferred upon them by Section
1, Subsection (3), of the Merchandise Marks
Act, 1926, and after consultation with the
Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, the
Secretary of State for the Home Department,
