

At the Court at *Buckingham Palace*, the 25th day of *July*, 1927.

## PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

**WHEREAS** a majority of the whole Council of the City of Ripon in the County of York did on the 27th day of September, 1926, agree to petition, and the Council of the said City thereupon petitioned, His Majesty under and in pursuance of the provisions of Section 30 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, as amended by Section 2 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1893, for the division of the City of Ripon into Wards:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased by His Order in Council of the 5th day of November, 1926, to refer the said Petition to a Committee of the Lords of His Privy Council:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased by His Order in Council of the 14th day of December, 1926, to fix the number of Wards into which the City of Ripon should be henceforth divided and to order and direct that the number of the said Wards should be four:

And whereas on the 6th day of January, 1927, the Right Honourable Sir Austen Chamberlain, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, did appoint Charles Matthew Knowles, Esquire, LL.B., Barrister-at-Law, to be a Commissioner for determining the boundaries of and for apportioning the Councillors among the Wards of the City of Ripon:

And whereas the said Commissioner has accordingly prepared the following Scheme, dated the 28th June, 1927:—

" Scheme for the division of the City of Ripon into Wards and determining the Boundaries of the Wards and apportioning the Councillors among the said Wards in pursuance of Orders in Council of 5th November, 1926, and 14th December, 1926.

## " CITY OF RIPON.

## " I.—BOUNDARIES OF WARDS.

" *Northgate Ward.*

" A line commencing at the junction of the City boundary with the fence forming the northern boundary of field 464 shown on O.S. plan CXIX.6. edition of 1909, thence eastward following the line of the said fence to its junction with the fence forming the western boundary of field 463 on the said plan thence northward following the said fence to its junction with the fence forming the northern boundary of field 463 thence northward to a point opposite the said junction in the centre of Kirkby Road, thence south-eastward along the centre of Kirkby Road, Blossomgate and Westgate, to the Market Place, thence northward along the line of the frontage of the Buildings on the West Side of the Market Place to Fishergate and along the centre of Fishergate and North Street to the junction with Princess Road, thence eastward along the centre of Princess Road to the junction with Magdalens Road, thence northward along the centre of Magdalens Road to the junction with North Road thence north-eastward along the centre of North Road to the intersection of the City Boundary with

Hutton Bank thence following the City Boundary northward, westward and south-eastward to the point of commencement aforesaid.

" *Skellgate Ward.*

" A line commencing on the City Boundary at its junction with Greystone Lane, thence south-westward along the centre of Greystone Lane to the junction with Quarry Moor Lane, thence north-eastward along the centre of Quarry Moor Lane to the junction with Bondgate Back Lane (now called Southgate), thence northward along the centre of Southgate and Heckler Lane to a point in the centre of the River Skell thence eastward along the centre of the River Skell to a point in the centre of Bondgate Bridge thence northward along the centre of King Street and Bedern Bank to the junction with Kirkgate thence westward along the centre of Kirkgate and following the line of the frontage of the Buildings on the South Side of Market Place to the junction with the boundary of Northgate Ward thence westward following the Southern boundary of Northgate Ward hereinbefore defined to its junction with the City Boundary, thence following the line of the City Boundary westward, southward, eastward and northward to the point of commencement aforesaid.

" *Allhallowgate Ward.*

" A line commencing at a point on the City Boundary in the centre of the River Ure opposite the end of the fence dividing fields 218 and 219 shown on O.S. plan CXIX.7. edition of 1909; thence south-westward along the line of the said fence to its junction with the fence dividing fields 219 and 206 on the said plan thence north-westward following the line of the said fence to its junction with the fence dividing fields 220 and 206 on the said plan thence westward following the line of the said fence and of the fence dividing fields 221 and 205 on the said plan to the Western Boundary of the London and North Eastern Railway (Leeds and Hartlepool Section); thence northward following the Western Boundary of the said Railway to its junction with the fence dividing fields 224 and 225 on the said plan; thence westward following the said fence to its junction with the fence dividing fields 225 and 228 on the said plan; thence southward following the line of the said fence to its junction with the fence dividing fields 226 and 228 on the said plan; thence westward along the line of the said fence to its junction with Priest Lane; thence westward to a point in the centre of Priest Lane aforesaid; thence northward along the centre of Priest Lane to the junction with Residence Lane; thence westward along the centre of Residence Lane to the junction with St. Marygate; thence southward along the centre of St. Marygate to the junction with Minster Road thence westward along the centre of Minster Road to the boundary of Skellgate Ward hereinbefore defined, thence westward following the said boundary to its junction with the boundary of Northgate Ward hereinbefore defined thence northward, south-eastward, northward, north-westward and north-eastward following the said boundary to its junction with the City boundary thence southward following the City boundary to the point of commencement aforesaid.
