THE LONDON TRAFFIC (RESTRICTED STREETS) REGULATIONS, 1927.

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Transport, by virtue and in exercise of the powers given to him by Section 7 of the London Traffic Act, 1924, the London Traffic (Restricted Streets) Regulations, 1925, the London Traffic (Restricted Streets) (No. 2) Regulations, 1925, the London Traffic (Restricted Streets) (No. 3) Regulations, 1925, and the London Traffic (Restricted Streets) Regulations, 1927, after consulting the London and Home Counties Traffic Advisory Committee, has relaxed the restrictions and limitations imposed by Regulation 2 of each of the said Regulations upon the occasion of the August Bank Holiday Period so that nothing in the said Regulations shall prevent any person who is maintaining at the date of this Notice a regular service in accordance with Section 6 of the London Traffic Act, 1924, upon the approved routes numbered 14B and 511 from using on Saturday, the 30th day of July, 1927, and Tuesday, the 2nd day of August, 1927, for the purpose of maintaining a regular service on either of those Routes, in any of the streets or parts thereof declared

to be "restricted streets" by the London Traffic (Restricted Streets) Order, 1925, the London Traffic (Restricted Streets) (No. 2) Order, 1925, the London Traffic (Restricted Streets) (No. 3) Order, 1925, and the London Traffic (Restricted Streets) Order, 1927, and forming part of those routes one omnibus in addition to those now used in the maintenance by him of any service or services on any approved route; provided that nothing herein contained shall be deemed to affect or derogate from the powers of the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis under the provisions of Section 52 of the Metropolitan Police Act, 1839, to give directions to constables for keeping order and for preventing any obstruction of the thoroughfares.

AGRICULTURAL WAGES (REGULATION) ACT, 1924.

Whereas the Agricultural Wages Committee for the area comprising the administrative counties of East Suffolk and West Suffolk which for the purposes of the Agricultural Wages (Regulation) Act, 1924, shall be deemed to include the county borough of Ipswich have in pursuance of the above Act duly fixed minimum rates of wages for male workers employed in agriculture for time work during the Corn Harvest in 1927 in that area and the said rates are set out in the Schedule to this Order. Now the Agricultural Wages Board in pursuance of the said Act and for the purpose of carrying out the decision of the said Committee, hereby order that the provisions contained in the Schedule to this Order shall become effective from the 1st day of August, 1927.

SCHEDULE.

1. *Farms of at least 60 acres of corn.*

The rate of wages payable for the employment of a male worker on the corn harvest on a farm comprising at least 60 acres of corn shall be,

(a) In the case of a worker who is employed by an employer throughout the period of corn harvest on the farm on harvest work not less than the minimum rate of wages applicable to a worker of his age under the Orders of the Agricultural Wages Board for the time being in force, and in addition the worker shall be entitled (as part of his wages, and in lieu of the overtime rates of wages otherwise applicable), on the completion of such period to the sum mentioned in the following table:—
