## From Thurfloay, January 21. to Honday, January 25. 1668.

Cheffer , Fanuary 21.

Efferday arrived at Holyhead the Mary-Yacht bits Majefties Pleafure-Boat from Dublin, with feveral of His Majefties Commiffioners of Claims and other Perfons of Quality,

Yefter day failed from the Point of Agne the John of London bound for Legarne.

Warfaw, Fan. n. Thele parts afford little wherewith to facisfie the Cutiofity of foreign Countreys, but that all interefts are privately, and with much zeal catiled on by their feveral Partifans, who have had divers private meetings upon this Subject, and that feveral Papers are given about in order to the future Election; amongft others, one of them in Latine, giving Rules to be observed in the chooling a Succelfor to the Crown, as

I. That the perion who is to fucceed, be a Prince of the Roman Gatholick Faith, and not fulpected to be any ways inclined to the Reformed Religion

-2. That he be of a Roman Kingdom or Dukedom,

-3. That he be not a Crowned head, nor a perion to be governed by others.

4. That in order to he prefervation of the Laws and Priviledges of the King om, he fland not in fear either of his own or his neighbours power.

9. That he be not defirous of the Crown, but fuch as the Kingdom may defire to raile to it for his vertues.

6. That he be a p. ríon expert, and well versed in the art of War.

7. That he be a perfon of a middle age, not charged with many Heirs and Dependants.

8. That he be Liberal, Wife, and a lover of Juffice, by which Vertues Kingdoms are best conferved.

9. That he be of a quiet and fatisfied temper, without fubrlety, which would occasion jealoufie.

10. That he have no quarrels on foot with other Countreys.

11. That he be an able perfon, and a lover of the Laws, not given to Tyranny or Oppreffion.

12. That he be a perion of Interest and Power to reftore the Kingdom to its former Greatn is and Reputation,

From Ukrania we are told, that the Collacks intend to fend their Envoye to be prefent at the future Elschion/

King Cafimir is returned hither, where he has been magnificently feasted by the Sieur Marstein Great Trealurer to the Kingdom; but intends for Marienburgh before the time appointed for the Election.

The Great Duke of Moleovy purfues his Drign for the Promotion of the young Prince his Son to the Succeffion of this Crown, and to encourage his Election, fiers the Reflicution of those Places to which the was ob i.ed by the Treaty formerly made with him ; but is much opposed, especially by the Tations, who are again drawn into the Fields with whom are joyned fome Troops lately retired form Transluania: but the Coffacks are not yet refolved to j yn with them, having made choice of one Buefeasko for their General.

Legorn; Jan. 4. The 27th inflatit attived in this Road S'r Thomas Alleri with a Squadton of E gliff Men of War, where the Fort after fome debate fabuted His Maj fly of Great Brittain's Flag with five Guns and his Admifal with 18; which were as civil y returned them with mutual fatisfaction; During his abode before the Port, he was prefented from the Great Duke of *Florence* with feveral Bullocks and Sheep, with a quantity of Wine and Finits for his refreshment. To morrow if the wind ferve, he intends to fev fail for *Genoua*.

From Florence we are informed of the artival there of three Ambaffadours from the Roman Catholick Cantens of Swifferland, intending for Rome; but were with their Leters of Civility to the Great Duke, received in his abfence (he being now diverting himfelf at one of his Countrey Houfes) by the Cardinal Leopold; by whom they were received and entertained with much demonstration of kindnefs.

A French Ship arriving here from *Alexandria*, tells us of the death of the Baffa of that place, where it was much feared left an Embargo would be put upon all Chriftian Ships riding before that Port; and that the Turks had fome imentions to make use of them for the conveyance of succors to their Army in *Candia*.

From Smirna we are advided by Letters of the 31th of November laft, of the arrival there of Sir Daniel Harvey' Ambaffadour from His Matefly of Great brittain to the Grand Segnion; with whom fately arrived also the General Ships.

They affure us that the Grand Segnior is at Lariff a Town in Achaia, between Athens and Thefsdlonica ; where he has built a Seraglio, and intends to fpend his Winter.

Rome, Fan. 5. Here lately passed by this place for Maples. an express from Milan, with the news of the death of the Marquis de Mortars their late Governour, and that the Council of state have undertaken the management of all afs fairs relating to the Government, till they can receive fatther order from the Court of Spain.

On Monday laft, the Pope fent a Courier Express to the Court of Spain, to follicite that Court to contribute their affiftance for he defence of Candia, by joyning their Gallies of Maples nd Sicily with those of Maitha, and to fit them up time' for the fervice 3 and withal, offering his affiftance towar 5 .ne fatisfaction of of Don Fuan, and the composure of all diffures in that Kingdom.

Venice, fan. 12. This week produces nothing new from Candia, to that as yet we much hilpeft the truth of what has been hitherto reported of a general Sally made by the befieged upon the Turks, which has been the longer deferred, becaule of the great expectation they have of the fuccefs of a Mine which they have wrought reaching under the Enemies line, for the fpringing whereof, they intend to imploy fome hundreds of barrels of Powder,

The General of Candia has with much gallantry, and great variety of diffies, entertained the Duke de Reanez, the Count St. Paul, with many others of the principal Fiench Officers 3 at which entertainment was prefent a Turkifh Meffenger upon fome occasions fent into the Town, who returned to the Vifier with no fmall admiration at the great plenty of all forts of Provisions in the befieged City, and the great fearcity which they find in their own camp,

We are here fitting up a confiderable Convoy, which tow wards the end f. this moneth may be in readine s to fet fail for *Candia*, on which are to be embarked f me numbers of men fit o be employed at the Oar, to be put aboard the Gal ies in the room of those that were form riy taken thence to supply the necefficies of the Town,

Vienna, Jan. 13, The last we k he Venetian Ambessador made his folemn Entry i r this City, attended accordsing to custom by a large Train of Coaches, and the next day was with the will folemnity conducted to his Audience.
