Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Transport by virtue and in exercise of the powers given to him by Section 7 of the London Traffic Act, 1924, the London Traffic (Restricted Streets) Regulations, 1925, the London Traffic (Restricted Streets) (No. 2) Regulations, 1925, the London Traffic (Restricted Streets) (No. 3) Regulations, 1925, and the London Traffic (Restricted Streets) Regulations, 1927, after consulting the London and Home Counties Traffic Advisory Committee, has relaxed the restrictions and limitations imposed by Regulation 2 of each of the said Regulations upon the occasion of the Metropolitan Police Sports to be held at Mill Hill, on Thursday, the 11th day of August, 1927, so that nothing in the said Regulations shall prevent any person who is maintaining at the date of this Notice a regular service in accordance with Section 6 of the London Traffic Act, 1924, upon the approved route numbered 104A from using on that day, after 12 noon, in any of the streets or parts thereof declared to be "restricted streets" by the London Traffic (Restricted Streets) Order, 1925, the London Traffic (Restricted Streets) (No. 2) Order, 1925, the London Traffic (Restricted Streets) (No. 3) Order, 1925, and the London Traffic (Restricted Streets) Order, 1927, and forming part of that approved route such number of omnibuses, in addition to those now used in the maintenance by him of any service or services on any approved route as may be necessary to enable him to maintain an additional service of 4 omnibuses per hour in each direction on that approved route; provided that nothing herein contained shall be deemed to affect or derogate from the powers of the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis under the provisions of Section 52 of the Metropolitan Police Act, 1839, to give directions to constables for keeping order and for preventing any obstruction of the thorough-

#### LONDON TRAFFIC ACT, 1924.

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Transport proposes to make an Order under Section 7 of the London Traffic Act, 1924, declaring the streets specified in the Schedule hereto to be restricted streets, that is to say, streets in which the plying for hire by cmnibuses ought to be prohibited or restricted either generally or during particular hours.

And notice is also hereby given that the Minister proposes to make Regulations under the same Section restricting the plying for hire by omnibuses in such streets so that it shall not be lawful for any person to use or allow to be used at any time upon any day (other than Good Friday, the day following Good Friday, Bank Holidays and days appointed by proclamation to be Bank Holidays), in any restricted street or part thereof for the purpose of plying for hire along that street or part thereof any greater number of omnibuses than might, under and in accordance with Section 6 of the said Act, and a Schedule or Schedules deposited by him under that Section with the licensing authority and in force on the 8th day of August, 1927, have been so used by him at that time, on that day, in that street or part thereof, for the purpose of maintaining

along that street or part thereof the regular service or services which were shown in such Schedule or Schedules.

The Minister has referred the matter to the London and Home Counties Traffic Advisory Committee for their advice and report.

Any person affected who desires to make representations in connection with the proposed Order or Regulations should forward such representations in writing to the Secretary, Ministry of Transport, London Traffic Branch, 7, Whitehall Gardens, S.W. 1, not later than the 22nd day of August, 1927.

# ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 8TH AUGUST, 1927.)

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

#### Application of Order.

1. The provisions of Part 1 of the Sheep (Double Dipping) Order of 1920 (Restrictions on Movement of Sheep out of a Movement Area) as applied to the Area described in the Schedule to the Order of the Minister No.

4443 dated the 25th May, 1927, as amended by Order No. 4445 dated the 8th June, 1927, shall not apply to the movement of sheep of the Kerry Hill Breed to or from the special Sales specified in the Schedule to this Order, provided that the following conditions are complied with.

Special Conditions Applicable to Sheep Moved to the Sales referred to in this Order.

- 2. All sheep exposed at the special Sales specified in the Schedule to this Order shall comply with the following conditions:—
  - (a) The sheep shall be accompanied by a Certificate of an Inspector of the Local Authority of the district from which the sheep are moved to the effect:—
    - (i) that the sheep have within 56 days before the movement been dipped twice-

under the supervision of an Inspector of the Local Authority, with an interval of not less than seven and not more than fourteen days between the dippings by a thorough immersion in a sheep dip approved for Sheep Scab by the Minister or purporting to be so approved.

(ii) that the sheep, since the second dipping, have been kept isolated from sheep which have not been so dipped, and have not been exposed in any market, fair-

ground or saleyard.

(b) Such Certificate shall on the arrival of the sheep at the said special Sales, be delivered up to the Inspector of the Ministry.

(c) The sheep may be moved from the said special Sales only if accompanied by a

licence granted by an Inspector of the Ministry, authorising movement of the sheep to any destination in Great Britain and subject to such conditions, if any, as may be specified in the licence.

(d) All sheep exposed at the said special Sales shall be kept separate from all other sheep during movement to and from the sales and whilst being exposed thereat.

In witness whereof the Official Seal of the Minister of Agriculture Fisheries is hereunto affixed this eighth day of August, nineteen hundred and twenty-seven.

#### SHEEP SCAB MOVEMENT AREAS.

The following Areas are now "Movement Areas" for the purposes of Part I of the Sheep (Double Dipping) Order of 1920:—

Inverness.—An Area comprising the islands known as the Outer Hebrides (except the islands of St. Kilda, Dune, Soay and Boreray), in the county of Inverness.

Ross and Cromarty.—An Area comprising the island of Lewis, including the smaller islands adjacent thereto, in the county of Ross and Cromarty.

Commencing at the point of intersection of the boundaries of Cheshire, Derbyshire and Yorkshire, near Saltersbrook Bridge, then in a westerly direction along the county boundary of Cheshire and Derby to Crowden Station, thence along the road via Torside, and the Devils Elbow to the point where it reaches the boundary of the borough of Glossop, thence along the eastern boundary of the said boundary, to the point where it meets the main road to Hayfield, thence in a southerly direction along that road via the Grouse Inn to Hayfield, thence continuing in a generally south-easterly direction via Chinley Head and Bole Hill to Chapel-en-le-Frith, thence in an easterly direction along the road via Laneside to the Inn at Sparrowpit, thence along the road via Perryfoot, Oxlow House and the Winnats to Castleton, thence in an easterly and southeasterly direction along the main road via Hope to Hathersage, thence by the road under the Railway from Hathersage to Grindleford, west of Hathersage Station, to Grindleford Bridge, thence in a north-easterly direction along the road from Grindleford Bridge to Sheffield, to the point where it meets the western boundary of the parish of Totley, near Fox House Inn, thence in a northerly direction along the western boundaries of the parishes of Totley and Dore, to the county boundary, thence in a generally north-easterly and northerly direction to the point of commencement.

In the county of the West Riding of Yorkshire.

The parish of Bradfield; so much of the parish of Langsett as lies to the south and west of the road from Sheffield via Langsett and Crow Edge to Hepworth, and such part of the city and county borough of Sheffield as lies to the west of the following boundary, namely:—

Commencing at the county boundary near Ringinglow, thence via Ringinglow, Andwell Lane, Blackbrook Road, Rails Road, Bingley Lane and Hopwood Lane to the city boundary.

An Area comprising:—

In the county of Lancaster.

The parishes of Tatham, Wray-with-Botton. Roeburndale, Over Wyresdale, Bleasdale and

Little Bowland; such parts of the parishes of Hornby-with-Farleton, Claughton (Lancaster Rural District) and Caton as lie to the south and east of the London Midland and Scottish Railway from Lancaster to High Bentham; so much of the parish of Quernmore as lies to the south and east of the Secondary Road No. 50 from Oak Cottage to the parish boundary south of Backwood End; so much of the parish of Ellel as lies to the east of the Secondary Road No. 50 from the parish boundary near Backwood End to the London Midland and Scottish Railway at Bay Horse Station, and east of the said railway from Bay Horse Station to the Cleveley parish boundary; so much of the parishes of Cleveley and Nether Wyresdale as lies to the east of the London Midland and Scottish Railway from Lancaster to Preston; so much of the parish of Barnacre with Bonds as lies to the east of the London Midland and Scottish Railway and north of the district road from Forge Bridge (leading past All Saints Church, via Long Lane to the Paper Mill at Oakenclough); so much of the parish of Chipping as lies to the north of the Secondary Road No. 51 (from Bailey Hey via Fiddler's Lane, Collins Hill Lane and Blackhouse Lane to Chipping village); and so much of the parish of Leagram as lies to the north of the Secondary Road No. 51 from Chipping village to Doeford Bridge.

Commencing at a point where the London Midland and Scottish Railway from Lancaster to Long Preston crosses the county boundary near High Bentham, thence south-easterly along that railway to the point where it intersects the road from Settle to Rathmell, thence in a southerly direction along that road via Rathmell, Wigglesworth, Becks Brow Bottom, Pikeber, Mere Sike, Flass Gate, Forest Becks, Holden, Bolton Peel, and Bow Lathe to Sawley; thence continuing in a south westerly direction along the road from Sawley via Foxley Bank, Grindleton, Lane Side, Lower West Clough, West Bradford, Waddington, Bashall Bridge, Backridge, and Bashall to the River Hodder; thence following the county boundary in a generally northerly direction to the point of commencement.
