"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Act, 1919, the Union of Benefices Measure, 1921, and the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting the unions (1) of the

Benefice (being a Rectory) of Easton with the Benefice (being part of the United Benefice of Hoo with Letheringham) of Letheringham, and (2) of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Monewden with the Benefice (being the remaining part of the United Benefice of Hoo with Letheringham) of Hoo, all of which Benefices are situate in the County of Suffolk and in the Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Albert, late Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Act, 1919, and the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1921, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Easton and Hoo with Letheringham duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices of Easton and Letheringham only and the terms for effecting such union:

"And whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Walter Godfrey, now Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said Benefice of Monewden with the said Benefice of Hoo, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich and therein recommended such union and the terms for effecting the same:

"And whereas the said Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich,

has signified in writing his approval of both of the aforesaid Reports :

" And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the said unions of Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Reports :

" And whereas the said Benefices of Easton and Hoo with Letheringham are now full, the Reverend Arthur George Colbeck being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Easton and the Reverend David Henry Medcalf being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Hoo with Letheringham, but the said Benefice of Monewden is now vacant :

" And whereas only one Parsonage House will be left standing or remaining within or belonging to the United Benefice of Monewden and Hoo when the unions which are herein-after recommended and proposed shall take effect, namely, the Parsonage House belonging to the said Benefice of Monewden :

" Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say :—

" 1. That a portion of the said Benefice of Hoo with Letheringham, that is to say, the Benefice of Letheringham shall be severed from the remaining portion of the said Benefice of Hoo with Letheringham and such severed portion of the said Benefice of Hoo with Letheringham, and the said Benefice of Easton, shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of ' The United Benefice of Easton and Letheringham ' but the Parishes of the said Benefices of Easton and Letheringham shall continue distinct in all respects.

" 2. That the said Benefice of Monewden and the said remaining portion of the said Benefice of Hoo with Letheringham, that is to say, the Benefice of Hoo, shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of ' The United Benefice of Monewden and Hoo ' but the Parishes of the said Benefices of Monewden and Hoo shall continue distinct in all respects.

" 3. That with the consent of the said Arthur George Colbeck (testified by his signing this Scheme) (a) if at the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme, the said Benefice of Hoo with Letheringham shall be vacant the unions shall both take effect forthwith, and (b) if at that date the said Benefice of Hoo with Letheringham shall be full then the unions shall both take effect upon the next vacation after that date of the said Benefice of Hoo with Letheringham.

" 4. That upon the unions taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Easton shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Easton and Letheringham and the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Monewden shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Monewden and Hoo, and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House situate

at Letheringham and at present belonging to the said Benefice of Hoo with Letheringham and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall be held and invested by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, as to one moiety thereof for the benefit of the United Benefice of Easton and Letheringham and as to the other moiety thereof for the benefit of the United Benefice of Monewden and Hoo.

" 5. That after the said unions have taken effect (a) the patronage of the United Benefice of Easton and Letheringham shall belong wholly to the Patron of the said Benefice of Easton and (b) the course and succession in which the respective patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice of Monewden and Hoo from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, that in every series of four successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the United Benefice after the unions the Patrons of the said Benefice of Monewden shall have the first, the second, and the third turns and the Patrons of the said Benefice of Hoo with Letheringham shall have the fourth turn.

" 6. That upon the said unions taking effect the endowments of the said Benefice of Hoo with Letheringham shall be appropriated as follows, that is to say, (a) there shall be annexed to the United Benefice of Easton and Letheringham a sum of £875 Four pounds per centum per annum Funding Stock (1960-1990) being part of a larger sum of such Stock at present held by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, on behalf of the said Benefice of Hoo with Letheringham, and (b) there shall be annexed to the United Benefice of Monewden and Hoo all other the endowments now belonging to the said Benefice of Hoo with Letheringham.

" Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923 :

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the said Rules :

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme :

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of St. Edmundsbury and Ipswich has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid :

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme :

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council :

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich.

“ And whereas the old Church has ceased to be used and is no longer required for purposes of Divine Service :

“ Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the Right Reverend Herbert Hensley, Bishop of Durham (in testimony whereof he has hereunto set his hand), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

“ Provided always that this Scheme shall not take effect until the consents and approval which by the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, are made requisite to the sale under the powers conferred by that Measure of the site of any Church shall be obtained to the sale hereby proposed of the site of the said old Parish Church of the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Stockton on Tees, and of any ground annexed or belonging thereto.

“ And provided also that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament.”

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 48th and 49th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, and of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners Measure, 1926, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for augmenting the incomes of the Archdeaconry of Huntingdon and the Archdeaconry of Wisbech, both in the Diocese of Ely :

"Whereas it appears to us to be desirable that the incomes of the said Archdeaconry of Huntingdon and of the said Archdeaconry of Wisbech should be augmented in the manner which is hereinafter recommended and proposed:

"And whereas the grants hereinafter recommended and proposed, together with any existing grant or grants now payable by us in augmentation of the incomes of the said Archdeaconries, will not have the effect of raising the annual incomes provided for such Archdeaconries out of the Common Fund created by the said Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, beyond the sum of £300 and will not raise the whole incomes of those Archdeaconries, including the income derived from any ecclesiastical office or preferment annexed thereto, beyond the sum of £1,000 per annum:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, with the consent of the Right Reverend Leonard, Bishop of Ely (testified by his having signed and sealed this Scheme) humbly recommend and propose that, subject as is hereinafter mentioned, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, be authorised to pay out of the said Common Fund by equal quarterly payments on the first day of January, the first day of April, the first day of July, and the first day of October, or on such other quarterly days as the payments now made by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, in respect of the incomes of the respective Archdeaconries are usually made in every year (first) to the Archdeacon of the said Archdeaconry of Huntingdon and to his successors in the same Archdeaconry a further yearly sum of £100, and (secondly) to the Archdeacon of the said Archdeaconry of Wisbech and to his successors in the same Archdeaconry a further yearly sum of £100, such yearly sums to take effect and be calculated as from the 1st day of January, 1927. Provided always that before any payment in respect of any of the said yearly sums shall be made by us we shall require to be satisfied that the Archdeacon who applies for the same has during the previous 12 calendar months complied with the conditions as to residence which for the time being are required by law.

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, with the consent of the Right Reverend Edward Arthur, Bishop of Ripon (testified by his having signed and sealed this Scheme), humbly recommend and propose that, subject as is hereinafter mentioned, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, be authorised to pay out of the said Common Fund by equal quarterly payments on the first day of January, the first day of April, the first day of July, and the first day of October, or on such other quarterly days as the payments now made by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, in respect of the income of the said Archdeaconry are usually made in every year, to the Archdeacon of the said Archdeaconry of Richmond and to his successors in the same Archdeaconry a further yearly sum of £100, such yearly sum to take effect and be calculated as from the 1st day of January, 1927. Provided always that before any payment in respect of the said yearly sum of £100 shall be made by us we shall require to be satisfied that the Archdeacon who applies for the same has during the previous 12 calendar months complied with the conditions as to residence which for the time being are required by law.

"And we further recommend and propose that procurations, synodals, visitation fees and induction fees or any of these fees or payments shall no longer be receivable by the Archdeacon of the said Archdeaconry, and all such fees or payments shall accordingly cease to be payable to the said Archdeacon.

"And we further recommend and propose that whenever any Archdeacon who may be entitled to receive the said yearly sum of £100 hereinbefore recommended to be paid to the said Archdeacon of Richmond shall resign or otherwise avoid his Archdeaconry, such yearly sum shall be apportionable between such Archdeacon or his representatives (as the case may be) and the Archdeacon who shall next be collated to the same Archdeaconry.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts and Measure, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Ripon.

Whereas the Agricultural Wages Committee for the area comprising the administrative county of Dorset have, in pursuance of the above Act, duly fixed minimum and overtime rates of wages for workers employed in agriculture for time work in that area and the said rates are set out in the Schedule to this Order. 2. Where a whole-time male worker is employed by the week or any longer period and the hours of work agreed between the worker and the employer in any week (excluding hours of overtime employment) are less than 51 in summer or 48 in winter, the rate of wages applicable to that worker shall be such as to secure to the worker the wages which would have been payable if the agreed hours had been 51 in summer or 48 in winter, as the case may be.

3. For the purpose of the above rates employment in summer shall be deemed to be employment during the period commencing on the second Monday in February and terminating on the last Sunday in October and employment in winter shall be deemed to be employment during the rest of the year.

4. For the purpose of the above rates, the hours of work shall not include meal times, but shall include any time during which by reason of weather conditions, an employer has prevented from working a worker who was present at the place of employment and ready to work.

5. The differential rates of wages for overtime employment shall be not less than the following minimum rates:—
