At the Court at *Buckingham Palace*, the 10th day of *August*, 1927.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Minister of Health, after giving to the Incumbent and the Churchwardens of the Parish of Tooting Graveney, in the Metropolitan Borough of Wandsworth, and to the Incumbent and the Churchwardens of the Parish of Leire, in the County of Leicester, 10 days previous Notice of his intention in that behalf, did, under the provisions of the Burial Acts, 1852 and 1853, as amended by subsequent enactments, make Representations to His Majesty in Council that, for the protection of the public health, the opening of any Burial Ground in the Civil Parish of Tooting Graveney, in the said Metropolitan Borough of Wandsworth, and in the Civil Parish of Leire, in the said County of Leicester, save with the previous approval of the Minister of Health, should be prohibited, and that Burials should be discontinued therein, as hereinafter directed:

And whereas by an Order in Council of the 27th June, 1927, Notice of such Representations was given, and it was ordered that the

same should be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council on the 8th August, 1927, and such Order has been published in the London Gazette, and copies thereof have been affixed, as required by the said Act:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, as it is hereby ordered, that no new Burial Ground shall be opened in the said Civil Parishes of Tooting Graveney and Leire, save with the previous approval of the Minister of Health, and that Burials shall be discontinued therein as follows, viz. :—

TOOTING GRAVENEY.—Forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of Saint Nicholas, Tooting Graveney, in the Metropolitan Borough of Wandsworth and, except as hereinafter provided, in the Parish Churchyard as it existed prior to 1857. Provided that—(a) In any vault or walled grave now existing in the said portion of the Churchyard, burial may be allowed subject to the condition that every coffin buried in such vault or grave be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented. (b) In any earthen grave now existing in the said portion of the Churchyard, the burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin contain-
