## 4½ PER CENT. TREASURY BONDS, 1934.

Interest payable half-yearly on the 1st February and the 1st August.

ISSUE OF BONDS BY TENDER.

Minimum Price £99:6s. per cent.

A First Interest payment of £1:10s. per £100 will be made on the 1st February, 1928.

THE GOVERNOR AND COMPANY OF THE BANK OF ENGLAND give notice that they are authorised to receive tenders for the above-mentioned Bonds to be created by the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury.

The Principal and Interest of the Bonds will be chargeable on the Consolidated Fund of the United Kingdom.

The Bonds will be repaid at par on the 1st February, 1934, or on the 1st February in any one of the years 1929 to 1933 inclusive at the option of either His Majesty's Treasury or of the holder on notice having been given by His Majesty's Treasury or by the holder during the month of January in the year preceding that in which such repayment is to take place.

#### WELFARE OF WORKERS IN FACTORIES AND WORKSHOPS.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice that on the 2nd September, 1927, he made an Order under Section 7 of the Police, Factories, &c. PROPOSAL TO VARY OVERTIME RATES OF WAGES FOR CERTAIN CLASSES OF MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS.

In accordance with the Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour and dated 21st April, 1927, the Trade Board established under the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, for the Flax and Hemp Trade in Great Britain as specified in the Trade Boards (Flax and Hemp) Order, 1919, HEREBY GIVE NOTICE that they PROPOSE TO VARY the Overtime Rates for Male and Female Workers, set out in their Notice F.H. (27), dated 11th February, 1927, in their application to workers who attend only on five days a week, as shown in the Schedule set out below.

#### SCHEDULE.

PROPOSED VARIATION OF OVERTIME RATES FOR CERTAIN CLASSES OF MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS.

The Trade Board PROPOSE TO VARY the Overtime Rates for Male and Female Workers, set out in Part VII of their Notice F.H. (27), dated 11th February, 1927, in their application to workers who, in accordance with the practice of the Establishment, attend only on five days a week, by substituting the words "in respect of the first 51 minutes in excess of 8 $\frac{1}{2}$  hours" for the words "in respect of the first three-quarters of an hour in excess of 8 $\frac{1}{4}$  hours" in Proviso (ii) to Paragraph 24 of the above-mentioned Notice F.H. (27).

Pursuant to Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board will con-

sider any Objections to the above Proposal to Vary which may be lodged with them within two months from 6th September, 1927. Such objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary, Flax and Hemp Trade Board (Great Britain), 1, Whitehall Gardens, London, S.W. 1.

It is desirable that objections should state precisely and, so far as is possible, with reasons, what is objected to.

COUNTY OF CHESHIRE.

(ii) any vehicle which is being used in connection with the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said highway.

Provided that the quantity of any residual product so purchased by the Undertakers in any year shall not exceed one-third of the quantity of the like residual product which shall in that year arise directly or indirectly from the manufacture of gas by them; and

(b) purchase from other gas undertakers and elsewhere and use the materials required to work up and convert the residual products so arising from their own manufacture of gas or purchased as aforesaid:

but the Undertakers shall not manufacture chemicals exclusively from raw materials purchased from sources other than gas undertakings or in the manufacture of which the use of residual products produced by the Undertakers or purchased from other gas undertakings is merely subsidiary.

4. To provide that in the event of any meter used by a consumer of gas being tested in manner provided by regulations made by the Board of Trade under the Gas Regulation Act, 1920, and being proved to register erroneously within the meaning of the said regulations such erroneous registration shall be deemed to have first arisen during the then last preceding quarter of the year unless it be proved to have first arisen during the then current quarter. The amount of the allowance to be made or of the surcharge to be made upon the consumer by the Undertakers shall be paid by or to the Undertakers to or by the consumer as the case may be and shall be recoverable in the like manner as gas charges are recoverable by the Undertakers.

5. ## SHEEP SCAB MOVEMENT AREAS.

The following Areas are now "Movement Areas" for the purposes of Part I of the Sheep (Double Dipping) Order of 1920 :—

*Inverness.*—An Area comprising the islands known as the Outer Hebrides (*except the islands of St. Kilda, Dune, Soay and Boreray*), in the county of Inverness.

*Ross and Cromarty.*—An Area comprising the island of Lewis, including the smaller islands adjacent thereto, in the county of Ross and Cromarty.

*In the administrative county of Derby.*

Commencing at the point of intersection of the boundaries of Cheshire, Derbyshire and Yorkshire, near Saltersbrook Bridge, then in a westerly direction along the county boundary of Cheshire and Derby to Crowden Station, thence along the road via Torside, and the Devils Elbow to the point where it reaches the boundary of the borough of Glossop, thence along the eastern boundary of the said boundary, to the point where it meets the main road to Hayfield, thence in a southerly direction along that road via the Grouse Inn to Hayfield, thence continuing in a generally south-easterly direction via Chinley Head and Bole Hill to Chapel-en-le-Frith, thence in an easterly direction along the road via Laneside to the Inn at Sparrowpit, thence along the road via Perryfoot, Oxlow House and the Winnats to Castleton, thence in an easterly and south-easterly direction along the main road via Hope to Hathersage, thence by the road under the Railway from Hathersage to Grindleford, west of Hathersage Station, to Grindleford Bridge, thence in a north-easterly direction along the road from Grindleford Bridge to Sheffield, to the point where it meets the western boundary of the parish of Totley, near Fox House Inn, thence in a northerly direction along the western boundaries of the parishes of Totley and Dore, to the county boundary, thence in a generally north-easterly and northerly direction to the point of commencement.

*In the county of the West Riding of Yorkshire.*

The parish of Bradfield; so much of the parish of Langsett as lies to the south and west of the road from Sheffield via Langsett and Crow Edge to Hepworth, and such part of the city and county borough of Sheffield as lies to the west of the following boundary, namely :—

Commencing at the county boundary near Ringinglow, thence via Ringinglow, Andwell Lane, Blackbrook Road, Rails Road, Bingley Lane and Hopwood Lane to the city boundary.

An Area comprising :—

*In the county of Lancaster.*

The parishes of Tatham, Wray-with-Botton, Roeburndale, Over Wyresdale, Bleasdale and Little Bowland; such parts of the parishes of Hornby-with-Farleton, Cloughton (Lancaster

Rural District) and Caton as lie to the south and east of the London Midland and Scottish Railway from Lancaster to High Bentham; so much of the parish of Quernmore as lies to the south and east of the Secondary Road No. 50 from Oak Cottage to the parish boundary south of Backwood End; so much of the parish of Ellel as lies to the east of the Secondary Road No. 50 from the parish boundary near Backwood End to the London Midland and Scottish Railway at Bay Horse Station, and east of the said railway from Bay Horse Station to the Cleveley parish boundary; so much of the parishes of Cleveley and Nether Wyresdale as lies to the east of the London Midland and Scottish Railway from Lancaster to Preston; so much of the parish of Barnacre with Bonds as lies to the east of the London Midland and Scottish Railway and north of the district road from Forge Bridge (leading past All Saints Church, via Long Lane to the Paper Mill at Oakenclough); so much of the parish of Chipping as lies to the north of the Secondary Road No. 51 (from Bailey Hey via Fiddler's Lane, Collins Hill Lane and Blackhouse Lane to Chipping village); and so much of the parish of Leagram as lies to the north of the Secondary Road No. 51 from Chipping village to Doeford Bridge.

*In the county of the West Riding of Yorks.*

So much of the parishes of Bowland Forest Higher Division, Bowland Forest Lower Division, Easington, Slaidburn, Newton, Bentham, Clapham-cum-Newby, Austwick, Lawkland, Giggleswick, Rathmell, Wigglesworth, Gisburn Forest, Tosside, Bolton-by-Bowland, Sawley, Grindleton, West Bradford, Waddington, Bashall Eaves and Great Mitton as lies within the following boundary, namely :—

Commencing at a point where the London Midland and Scottish Railway from Lancaster to Long Preston crosses the county boundary near High Bentham, thence south-easterly along that railway to the point where it intersects the road from Settle to Rathmell, thence in a southerly direction along that road via Rathmell, Wigglesworth, Becks Brow Bottom, Pikeber, Mere Sike, Flass Gate, Forest Becks, Holden, Belton Peel, and Bow Lathe to Sawley; thence continuing in a south westerly direction along the road from Sawley via Foxley Bank, Grindleton, Lane Side, Lower West Clough, West Bradford, Waddington, Bashall Bridge, Backridge, and Bashall to the River Hodder; thence following the county boundary in a generally northerly direction to the point of commencement.

An Area comprising :—

So much of the county of Westmorland as is comprised within the following boundary, namely :—

Commencing at a point in the parish of Shap Urban where the railway runs underneath the road from Hackthorpe to Shap, thence northerly along the said railway to a point where it meets the stonewall from the Sweetholme Buildings, thence in the direction of the

stonewall through the said buildings to the point where it meets the Sweetholme road below Wilson Scar, thence along that road to its junction with the Shap-Bampton road; thence through the village of Rosgill, following the road west of the River Lowther to Bomby, Bampton, Helton and Askham, and continuing along the road as far as Pooley Bridge; thence along the eastern edge of Ullswater Lake to Sandwick and Patterdale, thence following the Kirkstone Pass as far as the Kirkstone Inn; thence taking the Troutbeck road and keeping to the road which meets the main Windermere-Kendal road at Ings; thence in an easterly direction along the main road through Staveley to the point where the railway crosses the said main road, and then along the railway to Burneside; thence following in a north-easterly direction the road to Garnett Bridge and Watchgate, thence taking the main Kendal-Shap road as far as High Borrow Bridge, and from that point going east along Borrow Beck to the point where it touches the railway at Low Borrow Bridge, thence northerly along the said railway via Tebay and Shap to the point of commencement.

The administrative county of Caernarvon.

An Area comprising:—

The administrative counties of Denbigh, Flint (*except the petty sessional division of Overton*), Merioneth and Montgomery; so much of the administrative county of Cardigan as lies to the east and north of the following boundary, namely:—

Commencing at a point where the county boundary is intersected at Lampeter by the Great Western Railway line from Llanbyther to Tregaron; thence in a northerly direction along that railway to the point where it is met by the Great Western Railway line from Aberayron; thence in a north-westerly direction along the last mentioned railway line to the point where it crosses the Afon Aeron river north of Llanerch Aeron; thence following that river to the point where it reaches the sea.

And also comprising:—

The parishes of Brompton and Rhiston and Chirbury in the administrative county of Salop.

An Area comprising:—

The administrative counties of Kent and East Sussex (including all boroughs geographically situated therein).

And also comprising:—

The city of Rochester.

The county boroughs of Brighton, Canterbury, Eastbourne and Hastings.
