TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. 4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

POST OFFICE REGISTER REGULATIONS, 1925.—AMENDMENT OF REGULATION 13.

The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury have in conjunction with the Postmaster General made the following Provisional Regulations dated the 14th September, 1927, under the Act 5 and 6 Geo. V, c. 93 amending Regulation 13 of the Post Office Register Regulations, 1925, dated August 7th, 1925 (S.R. & O. 1925 No. 788).

(1) The following shall be substituted for paragraph (1) of Regulation 13 of the Post Office Register Regulations, 1925 :—

" (1) Subject to the terms of the prospectus relating to the issue of any stock on the register and subject as hereinafter provided, the holder of any stock or securities

on the books of the Bank of England or of the Bank of Ireland may, if the stock or securities is or are of a description corresponding to any stock of that issue, exchange that stock or those securities for stock on the register of a corresponding amount and description:

"Provided that no person shall be entitled to exchange in any one calendar year stock or securities of any one description of a nominal amount exceeding one thousand pounds, unless the stock or securities is or are the property of a friendly society entitled under section thirty-nine of the Income Tax Act, 1918, to exemption from income tax."

(2) In the application of these Regulations to applications for exchanges in the period up to the 31st December, 1927, no regard shall be paid to exchanges made before the date of these Regulations.

(3) The Post Office Register Regulations made on the 15th day of July, 1927, are hereby revoked.

(4) These Regulations may be cited as the Post Office Register (No. 2) Regulations, 1927.

CIVIL SERVICE.

THE CIVIL SERVICE (APPROVED ASSOCIATIONS) REGULATIONS, 1927, DATED AUGUST 30, 1927, MADE BY THE TREASURY IN PURSUANCE OF THE TRADE DISPUTES AND TRADE UNIONS ACT, 1927 (17 & 18 GEO. 5. C. 22).

In pursuance of the requirements of section 5 of the Trade Disputes and Trade Unions Act, 1927, and by virtue of the powers conferred on them by Article 6 of the Order in Council dated the 22nd day of July, 1920, regulating the conditions of service in His Majesty's civil establishments, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby make the following regulations, that is to say:—

1. Subject as hereinafter provided, no established civil servant shall after the 31st day of December, 1927, be a member, delegate, or representative, of any organisation of which the primary object is to influence or affect the remuneration and conditions of employment of its members unless a certificate (in these regulations referred to as a "certificate of approval") is in force certifying that the organisation is an approved association:

Provided that—

(a) any person who on the 29th day of July, 1927, was an established civil servant may remain a member of any trade union or organisation, not composed wholly or mainly of persons employed by or under the Crown, notwithstanding that it is not an approved association, if he had at that date

been a member of the trade union or organisation for more than six months and under the rules thereof there had on the 4th day of April, 1927, accrued or begun to accrue to him a right to any future payment during incapacity, or by way of superannuation, or on the death of himself or his wife, or as provision for his children; and

(b) any person employed by or under the Crown on the 29th day of July, 1927, who thereafter becomes an established civil servant may remain, so long as he is not appointed to a position of supervision or management, a member of any trade union or organisation, not composed wholly or mainly of persons employed by or under the Crown, notwithstanding that it is not an approved association, if on the date when he became an established civil servant he was a member of the trade union or organisation, and under the rules thereof there had at that date accrued or begun to accrue to him a right to any future payment during incapacity, or by way of superannuation, or on the death of himself or his wife, or as provision for his children; and

(c) a person who in addition to being an established civil servant is, apart from his service as such, also engaged in some other occupation, may be a member, delegate, or representative, of any trade union or organisation of which the primary object is to influence or affect the remuneration and conditions of employment of persons engaged in that employment or occupation notwithstanding that the trade union or organisation is not an approved association.

2. Any organisation of which the primary object is to influence or affect the remuneration and conditions of employment of its members shall, if it complies with the requirements of these regulations, be entitled to a certificate of approval so long as the Treasury is satisfied that the organisation fulfils the conditions set out in Part I of the Schedule to these regulations.

3.—(1) Application for the grant of a certificate of approval in respect of any organisation may be made in writing addressed to the Chief Registrar of Friendly Societies, and every such application shall be accompanied by a declaration, signed by the president or other person for the time being presiding over the governing body of the organisation and by the secretary thereof, in the form set out in Part II of the Schedule to these regulations.

(2) It shall be the duty of the Chief Registrar of Friendly Societies to forward to the Treasury every application and declaration received by him under the foregoing provisions of this regulation, together with his report thereon.

4. A certificate of approval shall not be granted in respect of any organisation, and any certificate of approval granted in respect of an approved association may be cancelled, unless the following requirements are complied with, that is to say:—

(a) the organisation must furnish to the Chief Registrar of Friendly Societies, in such manner and at such times as he may require, such documents and information as may be required by him for the purpose of enabling

him to report to the Treasury whether, in his opinion, the organisation fulfils the conditions set out in Part I of the Schedule to these regulations :

(b) if any change is made or occurs in the constitution, objects or rules of the organisation or in any matter upon which information has in accordance with these regulations been furnished to the Chief Registrar of Friendly Societies, the secretary of the organisation must, if the change affects or may affect any matter specified in the conditions set out in Part I of the Schedule to these regulations, within seven days after the change is made give notice thereof in writing to the Chief Registrar of Friendly Societies :

(c) a declaration in the form set out in Part II of the Schedule to these regulations, signed by the president or other person for the time being presiding over the governing body of any approved association and by the secretary thereof, must, so long as the association continues to fulfil the conditions set out in Part I of the Schedule to these regulations, be sent to the Chief Registrar of Friendly Societies together with any notice sent under the last preceding paragraph of this regulation and at such other times, if any, as such a declaration may be required by the Chief Registrar of Friendly Societies.

5. Every certificate of approval shall be in the form set out in Part III of the Schedule to these regulations and shall continue in force until cancelled by the Treasury, but any such certificate shall be cancelled if at any time the Treasury is not satisfied that the organisation in respect of which it was granted fulfils the conditions set out in Part I of the Schedule to these regulations.

6. In these regulations the following expressions have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them, that is to say :—

“ Approved association ” means an organisation in respect of which a certificate of approval is in force certifying that the organisation fulfils the conditions set out in Part I of the Schedule to these regulations :

“ Conditions of employment ” means in relation to persons other than persons employed by or under the Crown the conditions of employment of persons employed under a contract of service :

“ Established civil servant ” means a person serving in an established capacity in the permanent service of the Crown, and includes any person who, having been granted a certificate by the Civil Service Commissioners, is serving a probationary period preliminary to establishment :

“ Political objects ” means the political objects mentioned in subsection (3) of section 3 of the Trade Union Act, 1913 :

7. These regulations may be cited as the Civil Service (Approved Associations) Regulations, 1927.

SCHEDULE.

PART I.

Conditions which must be fulfilled by Approved Organisations.

1. Membership of the association must be confined to persons employed by or under the Crown.

2. The association must be in all respects independent of and not affiliated to—

(a) any organisation of which the primary object is to influence or affect the remuneration and conditions of employment of its members, the membership of which is not confined to persons employed by or under the Crown ; or

(b) any federation which comprises any such organisation as is mentioned in subparagraph (a) of this paragraph.

3. The objects of the association must not include political objects.

4. The association must not be associated directly or indirectly with any political party or organisation.

LEAD PAINT (PROTECTION AGAINST POISONING) ACT, 1926.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice, in pursuance of Section 86 (1) of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, that on the 6th September, 1927, he made Regulations under Section 1 of the Lead Paint (Protection against Poisoning) Act, 1926, for preventing danger from lead paint to persons employed in or in connection with the painting of buildings. The Regulations, which may be cited as the Lead Paint Regulations, 1927, come into force on 1st October, 1927.

TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918.

RETAIL BESPOKE TAILORING TRADE BOARD (ENGLAND AND WALES).

PROPOSAL TO VARY AND TO FIX MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS IN THE AREA COMPRISING THE URBAN DISTRICT OF OAKHAM AND THE RURAL DISTRICTS OF OAKHAM AND UPPINGHAM IN THE COUNTY OF RUTLANDSHIRE.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909 by the Minister of Labour and dated 21st April, 1927, the Trade Board established under the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, for those Branches of the Trade specified in the Trade Boards (Tailoring) Order, 1919, which are covered by the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour and dated 6th August, 1924, with respect to the Retail Bespoke Section of the Tailoring Trade in England and Wales, **HEREBY GIVE NOTICE** that they **PROPOSE TO VARY** the General Minimum Time-Rates, Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for Male and Female Workers, as set out in the Notices R.B. (22) and R.B. (23) issued by the Retail Bespoke Tailoring Trade Board (Great Britain), and dated 28th February, 1923, in their application to workers employed in the area comprising the Urban District of Oakham and the Rural Districts of Oakham and Uppingham in the County of Rutlandshire, and **TO FIX** General Minimum Piece-Rates for certain classes of Male Workers in such area, as follows, that is to say, by providing that the Minimum Rates applicable to workers employed in the area comprising the Urban District of Oakham and the Civil Parish of Uppingham in the Rural District of Uppingham of the several classes specified in the

Trade Board's Notice R.B. (N.M.) 2, dated 9th July, 1927, shall be the Minimum Rates specified in such Notice R.B. (N.M.) 2, and applicable in Area C, and that the Minimum Rates applicable to workers employed in the area comprising the Rural District of Oakham and the Rural District of Uppingham (except the Civil Parish of Uppingham) of the several classes specified in the Notice R.B. (N.M.) 2 shall be the Minimum Rates specified in such Notice R.B. (N.M.) 2 and applicable to Area D.

Pursuant to Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board will consider any objections to the above Proposal which may be lodged with them within two months from the 16th September, 1927. Such objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary, Retail Bespoke Tailoring Trade Board (England and Wales), 1, Whitehall Gardens, London, S.W. 1.

It is desirable that the objections should state precisely, and so far as possible with reasons, what is objected to.

UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE ACTS, 1920-1926.

DECISION OF THE HIGH COURT ON REFERENCE MADE UNDER SECTION 10 (1) OF THE 1920 ACT.

CONTRIBUTIONS NOT PAYABLE.

On the 29th July, 1927, judgment was given in the High Court on questions referred by the Minister of Labour as to the liability to insurance under the Acts of six persons employed by horticulturists or nurserymen, growers of fruit, tomatoes, plants and flowers, which were sold either to florists or to buyers in Covent Garden or other markets. The employees, one man and five women, were employed in preparing the products of their employers for sale, e.g., by trimming and washing the plants, selecting and bunching cut flowers, grading the fruit and tomatoes, and packing for despatch all these products. The man was employed as a foreman in superintendence over such of these operations as were necessary in the establishment of his particular employers.

The Judge held that the employment of all these persons was employment in horticulture, and was, therefore, excepted from the provisions of the Acts under paragraph (a) of Part II of the First Schedule to the Act of 1920. They were, therefore, not required to be insured.
