The KING has been pleased to give and grant unto Edgar John Lewellyn, Esq., His Majesty's Royal licence and authority to wear the Cross of Chevalier of the Legion of Honour, which Decoration has been conferred upon him by the President of the French Republic, in recognition of valuable services rendered by him.

employed in the afternoon shift in consecutive weeks and that a woman or young person shall not be allowed to lift, carry or move anything so heavy as to be likely to cause injury to such woman or young person.

ROADS ACT, 1920.
COUNTY OF DEVON.

Notice is hereby given that on the 28th day of September, 1927, the Minister of Transport made an Order under Section 7 (4) of the Roads Act, 1920, in respect of certain highways in the County of Devon.

The Order will come into force on the 17th day of October, 1927, and is to the following effect:—

During the period of five years from the date on which this Order comes into force, no person shall drive or cause to be driven on the highways or portions of highways specified in the Schedule hereto (hereinafter referred to as "the said roads") any locomotive, any heavy motor car (as defined by Article II of the Heavy Motor Car Order, 1904) or any motor car with seats for more than fourteen persons exclusive of the driver:

Nothing in this Order contained shall prevent the driving on the said roads of:—

(1) Any vehicle which is being used for the purposes of agriculture in connection with land adjoining or lying near to the said roads or for the conveyance or haulage of timber felled upon such land;

(2) Any vehicle which is being used for the conveyance of goods or merchandise to or from any house, building or other premises situate on or adjacent to the said roads; or

(3) Any vehicle which is being used in connection with the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said roads, or the laying, alteration or repair in or near to the said roads of any sewer or of any main pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or any telegraph or telephone wires, cables, posts or supports.

AGRICULTURAL WAGES (REGULATION) ACT, 1924.

Whereas the Agricultural Wages Committee for the Area comprising the administrative counties of Southampton and Isle of Wight which, for the purposes of the Agricultural Wages (Regulation) Act, 1924, shall be deemed to include the county boroughs of Bournemouth, Portsmouth and Southampton, have, in pursuance of the above Act, duly fixed minimum and overtime rates of wages for workers employed in agriculture for time work in that area, and the said rates are set out in the Schedule to this Order. Now the Agricultural Wages Board, in pursuance of the said Act, and for the purpose of carrying out the decision of the said Committee, hereby order that the provisions contained in the Schedule to this Order shall become effective from the 12th day of October, 1927.

Where a whole time male worker is employed by the week or any longer period and the hours of work agreed between the worker and the employer in any week (excluding hours of overtime employment) are less than 51 in summer or 48 in winter the rate of wages applicable to that worker shall be such as to secure to the worker the wages which would have been payable if the agreed hours had been 51 in summer or 48 in winter, as the case may be.

3. For the purpose of the above rates employment in summer shall be deemed to be employment during the period commencing on the first Monday in March and terminating on the first Sunday in November, and employment in winter shall be deemed to be employment during the rest of the year.

4. For the purpose of the above rates the hours of work shall not include meal times but shall include any time during which by reason of weather conditions an employer has prevented from working a worker who was present at the place of employment and ready to work.

3. Where a whole-time male worker is employed by the week or any longer period and the hours of work agreed between the worker and the employer in any week (excluding hours of overtime employment) are less than 50 the rate of wages applicable to that worker shall be such as to secure to the worker the wages which would have been payable if the agreed hours had been 50.

4. For the purpose of the above rates, the hours of work shall not include meal times, but shall include any time during which by reason of weather conditions, an employer has prevented from working a worker who was present at the place of employment and ready to work.

5. These rates shall continue in operation until 13th October, 1928.

6. For the purpose of the application of the above differential rates of wages for overtime employment, the Wiltshire Agricultural Wages Committee have by Order dated the 11th February, 1925, defined the following employment as the employment which is to be treated as overtime employment:—

(a) All employment in excess of 6 hours on a Saturday or on such other day (not being Sunday) in every week as may be

agreed between the employer and the worker.

(b) All employment on a Sunday.

(c) All employment in excess of 50 hours in any week (excluding all hours which are to be treated as hours of overtime employment).
