The KING has been pleased by Letters Patent under the Great Seal bearing date the 12th day of October, 1927, to appoint Sir Frederick Arthur Greer, one of the Justices of His Majesty's High Court of Justice, to be one of the Lords Justices of Appeal.

### TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

- 1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 21st October, 1927, at 1 o'clock for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £40,000,000.
- 2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 24th October, 1927, to Saturday, the 29th October, 1927, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.
- 3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

- 4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.
- 5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.
- 6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated
- 7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.
- 8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms, which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.
- 9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

### STURBRIDGE FAIR.

BYE-LAWS AND REGULATIONS MADE BY THE MAYOR, ALDERMEN AND BURGESSES OF THE COUNTY BOROUGH OF BURNLEY.

As Promotors under the powers conferred upon them by the Tramways Act, 1870, and the Burnley Corporation Act, 1925, with respect to any omnibuses for the time being belonging to or worked by them.

1. Interpretation.—Throughout these Byelaws the word "Corporation" means the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the County Borough of Burnley; the word "Omnibuses" means the omnibus system for the time being worked by the Corporation within the County Borough of Burnley or any other district; the word "Conductor" means any officer or servant of the Corporation having charge of or helping in the charge of an omnibus, and the

word "Driver" means any officer or servant of the Corporation driving or helping to drive an omnibus. The expression "interior of an omnibus " shall not include the upper deck of covered omnibuses.

2. Entering and Leaving Omnibuses.-Every passenger shall enter or depart from an omnibus by the hindermost or Conductor's platform and not oherwise unless especially so directed by the Conductor.

When an omnibus stops no person shall board the said omnibus until all passengers desiring to alight therefrom shall have done

- 3. Entering or Leaving Omnibus in Motion.—No person shall enter or mount or leave or attempt to enter, mount or leave any omnibus in motion.
- 4. Smoking.—No person shall smoke or carry a lighted pipe or cigar or cigarette in the interior of any omnibus except in a compartment specially set apart for that purpose.
- 5. Musical Instruments.—No passenger or other person whilst travelling in or upon any omnibus shall sing or shout or sound, play or perform upon musical instruments.
- 6. Offensive Language or Conduct.—No person shall swear or use obscene, indecent or offensive language,  $\mathbf{or}$ conduct offensively whilst in or upon any omnibus, or commit any nuisance in or upon or against any omnibus or omnibus station or premises used in connection with the omnibus system or in any way wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger.

No person shall distribute advertisements or tracts of any kind or beg or collect money, alms or subscriptions or sell any article or play any game or gamble or deposit remnants of food or fruit in or upon any omnibus.

- 7. No person shall spit in, on, from or against any omnibus.
- 8. Objectionable Persons.—No person in a state of intoxication or affected with any contagious or infectious disease or unfit from any other cause in the opinion of the Conductor to be a passenger on the omnibus shall enter or mount upon any omnibus and any such person found in or upon any omnibus shall be immediately removed from the omnibus by or under the direction of the Conductor.
  - "Contagious or infectious disease" means any of the following diseases: - Smallpox, Cholera, Diphtheria, Membranous Croup, Erysipelas, the disease known as Scarlatina or Scarlet Fever, and Measles; also the fevers known by any of the following names:—Typhus, Typhoid, Enteric, relapsing, continued, puerperal.
- . Any person whose dress or clothing might in the opinion of the Conductor soil or injure the linings or cushions of the omnibus or the dress or clothing of any passenger or who in the opinion of the Conductor might for any other reason be offensive to any passenger, shall not mount, enter nor remain on or in any omnibus and may be prevented from so doing and if found on or in any omnibus shall on request of the Conductor leave the same upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned. Provided that on omnibuses specially run for artisans, mechanics and daily labourers, no person shall be prevented from

- entering or remaining in or on an omnibus under the provisions in this Bye-law on the ground of the condition of his dress or clothing if such condition is solely due to the nature of his employment.
- 10. DAMAGE TO OMNIBUSES.—No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil or damage the seats, cushions, curtains or linings of any omnibus or remove or deface any number plate, printed, painted or other notice or writing or any advertisement in or on any omnibus, or mark, break or scratch any window of or otherwise damage any omnibus. Any person acting in contravention of this Regulation shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws and Regulations in addition to the liability to pay the amount of any damage done.
- 11. PAYMENT OF FARES.—Each passenger shall upon demand pay to the Conductor or other duly authorised officer of the Corporation the fare legally demandable for the journey and accept a ticket therefor. Such ticket shall not be transferable, and shall be available only for the journey and on the omnibus or omnibuses where more than one, for and on which the same is issued.

Any person leaving an omnibus shall be deemed to have completed his journey unless he leaves such omnibus for the purpose of joining another omnibus of the Corporation in order to complete the journey for which the ticket held by him is available provided that upon any change of vehicle as aforesaid the journey must be completed upon the first available omnibus.

- 12. Tickers.—Each passenger shall show his ticket when required so to do to the Conductor or any duly authorised servant of the Corporation and shall also when required so to do either deliver up his ticket or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.
- 13. A passenger not being an artisan, mechanic or daily labourer within the true intent and meaning of the statutory provisions relating to the Corporation shall not use or attempt to use any ticket intended only for such artisans, mechanics or daily labourers.
- 14. Any person in possession of a workmen's discount ticket issued by the Corporation shall only use the same when legitimately travelling to or from his work from or to his place of residence, and no person other than those authorised by the Corporation to hold such workmen's discount tickets shall at any time use the same when travelling in or upon any omnibus.
- Luggage.—Personal or other luggage (including tools of artisans, mechanics and daily labourers) shall unless otherwise permitted by the Conductor, be placed on the rear or Conductor's platform or in a compartment specially set apart for the conveyance of parcels and not elsewhere on any omnibus.

The Conductor may decline to take into or upon any omnibus any luggage which from its size or otherwise is not suitable for convey-

ance in or upon such omnibus.

16. Travelling on Steps, etc.—No person other than the Driver or Conductor of an omnibus or a servant of the Corporation acting in the performance of his duty shall travel or ride upon the steps or platforms of any omnibus or stand on the upper deck and any person so travelling standing or sitting shall cease to do so immediately on request by the Conductor.

- 17. No person except a passenger or intending passenger shall enter or mount any omnibus and no person shall hold or hang on by or to any part of an omnibus.
- 18. Entering Full Omnibuses.—When any omnibus contains in the interior thereof the full number of passengers for which seating accommodation according to the notice thereof attached to the omnibus, is provided in such interior no person beyond such number shall enter, mount or remain therein except by the express permission of the Conductor first obtained. When any omnibus contains on the outside thereof the full number of passengers for which seating accommodation according to the notice thereof attached to the omnibus is provided on such outside no person beyond such number shall enter, mount or remain
- 19. Dogs.—No dog or other animal shall be allowed in or on any omnibus except by permission of the Conductor nor in any case in which the conveyance of such dog or other animal might be offensive or an annoyance to passengers. No person shall take a dog or other animal into or on any omnibus after having been requested not to do so by the Conductor.

Any dog or other animal taken into or on any omnibus in breach of this Regulation shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the omnibus im-mediately upon request by the Conductor and in default of compliance with such request may be removed by or under the direction of the Conductor.

- 20. Fire Arms.—No person shall travel in or on any omnibus with loaded fire arms or with any article, instrument or implement or any material or substance which may be dangerous or offensive to the passengers. Provided that nothing contained in this Bye-law shall apply to persons in the Naval, Military Reserve or Auxiliary Forces carrying unloaded fire arms.
- 21. DISABLED OMNIBUS.—If at any time an omnibus becomes disabled or in any way damaged or from any cause unable to proceed, the passengers shall upon request of the Conductor leave the same and if such passengers have paid their fares they shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of their fares so paid but on production of their tickets shall be allowed to travel by the next available omnibus on the same day for the remainder of the distance in respect of which they have paid their fares. No person shall except with the leave of the Conductor enter a disabled or damaged omnibus.
- 22. OMNIBUSES PROCEEDING TO GARAGE.-No person other than the Conductor or Driver shall travel upon an omnibus upon or along any siding or approach to an omnibus garage or upon or along any omnibus within an omnibus garage.
- Obstructing Officers.—No passenger shall wilfully obstruct or impede any officer or servant of the Corporation in the execution

of his duty upon or in connection with any omnibus of the Corporation.

24. Interference with Omnibuses, etc.-No person other than the Conductor or Driver shall change or remove the route indicators or destination boards or interfere with the controls, brakes, gears, lights, ventilators or any part of an omnibus or the equipment thereof or signal an omnibus to start.

Any person acting in contravention of this Bye-law shall be liable to pay the amount of any damage done in addition to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws and Regulations.

- BYE-LAWS.—Any 25. Enforcing who shall commit whilst in or on any omnibus any breach of these Bye-laws and Regulations shall if the offence is continued be liable in addition to incurring the penalty hereinafter provided to be immediately removed from the omnibus by or under the direction of the Conductor and if such person shall have paid his fare he shall not be entitled to claim its
- 26. Every Conductor and Driver of an omnibus shall to the best of his ability enforce these Bye-laws and Regulations and prevent the breach thereof and if any such Conductor or Driver fails to enforce the same as aforesaid he shall be deemed to have committed a breach thereof.
- 27. Penalty.—Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of these Byelaws and Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding 40s.
- 28. Copy of Bye-laws to be placed in Omnibuses.—There shall be placed and kept in a conspicuous position inside of each omnibus in use a printed copy of these Bye-laws and Regulations.

These Bye-laws and Regulations shall come

into force on the First day of January, 1928.
