NOTE.—This licence may be revoked by the Corporation if on account of misconduct or any other sufficient reason the holder is in the opinion of the Corporation unsuitable to hold it or the space available in the streets specified is insufficient.

Any person aggrieved by a refusal, revocation or variation of or any prescription in the licence may appeal to a petty sessional court under and in accordance with the provisions of Section 103 of the Act.

The holder may employ any other person to assist him in the conduct of his business without any further licence being required, but the licence may not be transferred to any other person nor may it be altered or tampered with in any way.

Any breach of this licence is punishable by a penalty not exceeding five pounds and forty shillings for every day that the offence continues after conviction.
