## ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

## FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1927 (No. 43).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

*Further contraction of Enfield (Middlesex) Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area.*

1.—(1) The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1927 (No. 40) as amended by the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1927 (No. 42), shall be read and have effect as if the Area described in the Schedule to this Order were substituted for the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area described in the Schedule to the last mentioned Order.

(2) This Article shall come into operation on the twenty-sixth day of October, nineteen hundred and twenty-seven.

*Release of Middlesex Area from Restrictions.*

2. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order shall cease to be an Infected Area for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925, as from the second day of November, nineteen hundred and twenty-seven.

*Short Title.*

3. This Order may be cited as the FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1927 (No. 43).

## SCHEDULE.

*Contracted Infected Area.*

An Area comprising:—

*In the administrative counties of Hertford and Middlesex.*

So much of the parishes of Monken Hadley, Hadley, East Barnet, Barnet Vale and Chipping Barnet, in the county of Hertford, and so much of the parishes of South Mimms, Enfield and Southgate, in the county of Middlesex, as lie within the following boundary (and *excluding* the roads forming such boundary), namely:—

Commencing at the junction of Lyonsdown Road with the Great North Road near Greenhill Park, East Barnet, thence in a generally easterly direction via Lyonsdown Road, Long Street and Cat Hill to the point where the last mentioned thoroughfare verges into Cock Fosters Road; thence southerly along the last mentioned road for a short distance until the East Barnet Road is met; thence continuing in a generally easterly direction along the East Barnet Road and Windmill Hill to the point where it is crossed by the London and North Eastern Railway (Enfield Branch) close to Enfield Chase Station; thence northerly along the said railway as far as the point where it is crossed by Cattlegate Road at Crews Hill Station; thence in a north-westerly direction along the last mentioned road to its junction with Cooperslane Road at Cattlegate Wood; thence westerly via Cooperslane Road, Chequers Lane and The Causeway to the point where the last mentioned highway joins the Great North Road near Potters Bar; thence southerly along the Great North Road and High Street, Barnet, to the point of commencement.
