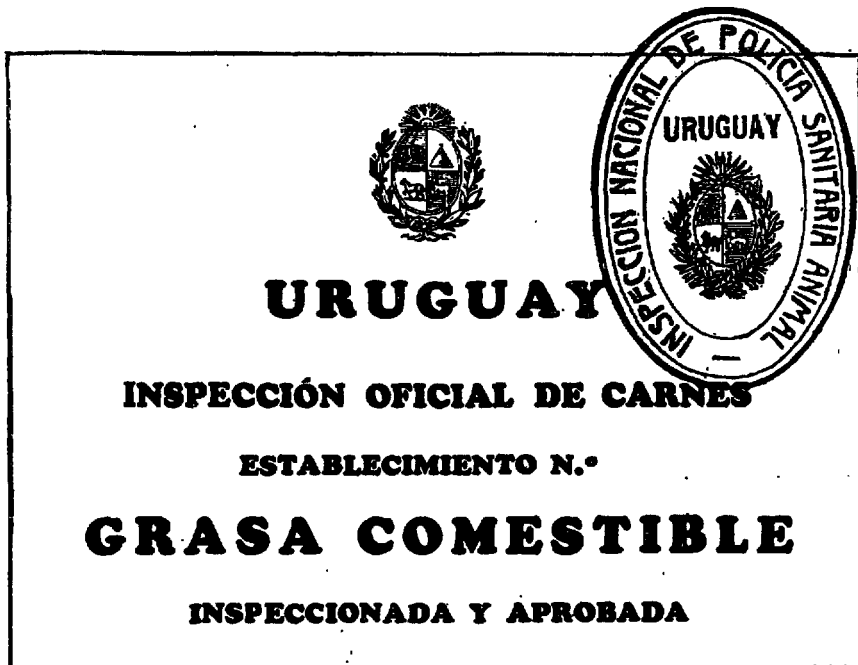


SCHEDULE.

NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE ACT,
1924.

Notice is hereby given under the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that it is proposed by the Minister of Health, after the expiration of at least 40 days from this date, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by the National Health Insurance Act, 1924, to make regulations amending the National Health Insurance (Navy, Army and Air Force) Regulations, 1924.

MEXBOROUGH.

THE PUBLIC HEALTH ACT, 1875.

THE MEXBOROUGH URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL
ACT, 1914.

Whereas the Urban District Council of Mexborough (hereinafter called the Council), have made application to the Minister of Health for the issue of a Provisional Order under Sections 297 and 303 of the Public Health Act, 1875, partially to repeal, alter or amend the Mex-

borough Urban District Council Act, 1914, so as:—

(1) To authorise the Council to acquire by agreement for the purposes of their water undertaking.

(a) The farm known as Barnborough Grange situate in the Parishes of Barnborough and High Melton and containing an area of 246 acres, 2 roods, 9 perches or thereabouts.

(b) Certain pieces or parcels of land situate in the said Parish of Barnborough forming part of the enclosures numbered 255, 249 and 247 on the $\frac{1}{2500}$ Ordnance Map Yorkshire (West Riding) Sheet CCLXXXLV N.W. Second Edition of 1903 and containing in the whole 5.056 acres or thereabouts together with two cottages erected thereon known as the Ludwell Cottages.

(c) The two springs known as "Ludwell Spring" and "Thorntree Spring" together with the rams, engine pumps and sheds and pipes connecting the sheds with the said springs, and the right to take impound use and enjoy all the water flowing and percolating to and issuing and coming from the said springs or either of them and of laying mains or pipes for carrying or conducting water from the said springs and underneath the lands aforesaid to the waterworks of the Council;

(2) To authorise the Council to construct such additional works on the said lands as may be necessary for the utilisation of the said springs;
