

INSTRUMENT substituting the new Church of Saint Andrew, situate within the New Parish of Saint Andrew, Jersey, in the Island of Jersey and in the Diocese of Winchester, for the old Church of Saint Andrew, situate within and hitherto being the parish church of the same new parish.

TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England send greeting:

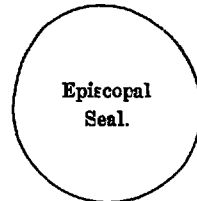
Whereas a new church has lately been built within the New Parish of Saint Andrew, Jersey, in the Island of Jersey and in the Diocese of Winchester, and has been consecrated and is known as the Church of Saint Andrew, Jersey.

And whereas the Right Reverend Frank Theodore, Bishop of Winchester, as Diocesan, the Very Reverend Samuel Falle, Dean of Jersey and Rector or Incumbent of the Rectory of the Parish of Saint Helier, in the said island and diocese, as the Patron in right of his Rectory, of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Jersey, and the Reverend Herbert William Quarrie, as the Vicar or Incumbent of the said Vicarage of Saint Andrew, Jersey, have by an Instrument under their hands, bearing date on or about the twenty-fourth day of September in the year One thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven, certified to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, that it would be for the convenience of the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Jersey, that the said new Church of Saint Andrew, situate within such new parish, should be substituted for the old parish church (also known as the Church of Saint Andrew) of the same new parish.

Now therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in exercise and execution of the power or authority in that behalf contained in the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her late Majesty, Queen Victoria, chapter seventy, and in the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, and of all other powers or authorities in anywise enabling us in the same behalf, do by this Instrument under our Common Seal, with the consent (testified as hereinafter mentioned) of the said Frank Theodore, Bishop of Winchester, and of the said Samuel Falle and of the said Herbert William Quarrie, hereby declare that the said new Church of Saint Andrew, situate within the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Jersey, and duly consecrated as aforesaid, shall be and the same is hereby substituted for the said old parish church of the same new parish, and that such new church shall henceforth be the parish church of the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Jersey, in lieu of the said old parish church of the same new parish as fully in all respects as if the said new Church of Saint Andrew, so hereby substituted, had been originally the parish church of the same new parish; And we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in further pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities aforesaid, and with such consents as aforesaid (testified as hereinafter mentioned), do hereby transfer all the endowments, emoluments, and rights of or belonging to the said old parish church of the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Jersey, or of or

belonging to the Vicar or Incumbent thereof, to the said new Church of Saint Andrew (now being by virtue of these presents the parish church of the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Jersey), and to the Vicar or Incumbent thereof and his successors for ever.

In witness whereof to these presents we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have set our Common Seal, and the said Frank Theodore, Bishop of Winchester, has set his hand and affixed his Episcopal Seal, and the said Samuel Falle and the said Herbert William Quarrie have respectively set their hands and affixed their seals, this thirteenth day of October in the year One thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven.

For telephonic communication between places in the first British zone (including Bedford, Berks, Buckingham, Cambridge, Dorset, Essex, Gloucester, Hampshire, Hertford, Huntingdon, Kent, Leicester, Lincoln, London, Middlesex, Norfolk, Northampton, Nottingham, Oxford, Rutland, Somerset, Suffolk, Surrey, Sussex, Warwick, Wilts, Worcester) and any place in Switzerland—

For telephonic communication between places in the second British zone (including Anglesey, Brecknock, Carnarvon, Cardigan, Carmarthen, Chester, Cornwall, Cumberland, Denbigh, Derby, Devon, Durham, Flint, Glamorgan, Hereford, Lancaster, Merioneth, Montgomery, Monmouth, Northumberland, Pembroke, Radnor, Salop, Stafford, Westmorland, York) and any place in Switzerland—
