The following Statute made by the University of Oxford, on the 1st day of November, 1927, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923."

UNIVERSITY OF OXFORD.

STATUTE APPROVED BY CONGREGATION ON
TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 1, 1927.

WHEREAS it is expedient to limit the number of Women Students who may be admitted to the University of Oxford: NOW THE SAID UNIVERSITY, in exercise of the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, and of all other powers enabling it, ENACTS, SUBJECT TO THE APPROVAL OF HIS MAJESTY IN COUNCIL, AS FOLLOWS.

1. In Statt. Tit. XXIII. Sect. II. § 1, after cl. 1 (*Statuta*, ed. 1926, p. 398) the following new clause shall be inserted:—

"The number of undergraduate students in residence from time to time at each of the Societies named in the Schedule annexed to this sub-section shall not exceed in the case of each of the said Societies the respective numbers following, that is to say:

In the case of Lady Margaret Hall, one hundred and sixty;

In the case of Somerville College, one hundred and fifty;

In the case of St. Hugh's College, one hundred and sixty;

In the case of St. Hilda's College, one hundred and fifty;

and the number of undergraduate students in residence from time to time at any Society hereafter added to the Schedule by vote of Convocation shall not exceed one hundred and sixty."

2. *Ibid.* cl. 2 (p. 399), at the end of the clause the following words shall be added:—

"Provided that no application for the admission of a new Society to the privileges of this Statute shall be entertained unless the average number of women undergraduates in residence in the University during the three academic years immediately preceding the application for the admission of the Society to the privileges of this Statute shall have been less than one-fourth of the average number of men undergraduates in residence during the same period by not less than one hundred and sixty."
