LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACTS,
1888 AND 1894.

BOROUGH OF EALING.

Whereas in pursuance of Section 54 of the Local Government Act, 1888, a representation has been made to the Minister of Health by the Council of the Borough of Ealing that it is desirable that, by a Provisional Order under the said Act, the boundary of the said Borough should be altered so as to include therein the Parish of Northolt in the Rural District of Uxbridge:

And whereas a Provisional Order for the alteration of the boundary of a Borough may deal with any of the matters mentioned in Sections 54 and 59 of the Local Government Act, 1888, and may also amend any Local and Personal Act or any Provisional Order under the Public Health Act, 1875, or made under the Sanitary Acts:

And whereas by the Ealing (Extension) Order, 1926, which was confirmed by the Ministry of Health Provisional Order Confirmation (Ealing Extension) Act, 1926, the boundaries of the Borough of Ealing were extended so as to include within the Borough the Urban Districts of Greenford and Hanwell:

And whereas in pursuance of the Third Schedule to the Metropolis Water Act, 1902, and the Order of the Local Government Board made thereunder, dated the 9th day of January, 1903, the Borough Council appoint three members of a Joint Committee for the purpose of appointing one Member of the Metropolitan Water Board:

And whereas it is proposed that if a Provisional Order should be made upon the representation of the Borough Council of Ealing
