Whereas We have deemed it expedient that the Commission for which provision is made in Section 84A of the Government of India Act should forthwith be appointed for the purpose of inquiring into the working of the system of government, the growth of education, and the development of representative institutions, in British India, and matters connected therewith, and should report as to whether and to what extent it is desirable to establish the principle of responsible government, or to extend, modify, or restrict the degree of responsible government then existing therein, including the question whether the establishment of second chambers of the local legislatures is or is not desirable:

Now know ye that We, reposing great trust and confidence in your knowledge and ability,

have on the advice of Our Secretary of State for India acting with the concurrence of both Houses of Parliament authorised and appointed, and do by these Presents authorise and appoint you, the said Sir John Allsebrook Simon (Chairman); Harry Lawson Webster, Viscount Burnham; Donald Sterling Palmer, Baron Strathcona and Mount Royal; Edward Cecil George Cadogan; Stephen Walsh; George Richard Lane-Fox and Clement Richard Attlee to be Our Commissioners for the purposes aforesaid.

And for the better effecting the purposes of this Our Commission, We do by these Presents give and grant unto you, or any three or more of you, full power at any place in Our United Kingdom or in India or elsewhere in Our Dominions to call before you such persons as you shall judge likely to afford you any information upon the subject of this Our Commission: and also whether in Our said Kingdom, or in India, or elsewhere in Our Dominions to call for information in writing; to call for, have access to and examine all such books, documents, registers and records as may afford you the fullest information on the subject, and to inquire of and concerning the premises by all other lawful ways and means whatsoever, including the appointment by the Commission with the sanction of Our Secretary of State for India, of any person or persons to make subordinate enquiries and to report the result to the Commission:

And We do by these Presents authorise and empower you or any of you to visit and inspect personally such places as you may deem it expedient so to inspect for the more effectual carrying out of the purposes aforesaid:

And We do by these Presents will and ordain that this Our Commission shall continue in full force and virtue, and that you, Our said Commissioners, or any three or more of you, may from time to time proceed in the execution thereof, and of every matter and thing therein contained, although the same be not continued from time to time by adjournment:

And We do further ordain that you, or any three or more of you, have liberty to report your proceedings under this Our Commission from time to time if you shall judge it expedient so to do:

And Our further will and pleasure is that you do, with as little delay as possible, report to Us under your hands and seals, or under the hands and seals of any three or more of you, your opinion upon the matters herein submitted for your consideration.

THE SAFEGUARDING OF INDUSTRIES (EXEMPTION) No. 5 ORDER, 1927, DATED 24th NOVEMBER, 1927, MADE BY THE TREASURY UNDER SECTION 10 OF THE FINANCE ACT, 1926 (16 & 17 Geo. V, c. 22).

Whereas it is provided by sub-section (5) of Section 10 of the Finance Act, 1926 (16 & 17 Geo. V, c. 22) that the Treasury may by Order exempt from the duty imposed by Section one of the Safeguarding of Industries Act, 1921 (11 & 12 Geo. V, c. 47), as amended by the Finance Act, 1926, for such period as may be specified in the Order, any article in respect of which the Board of Trade are satisfied on a representation made by a consumer of that article that the article is not made in any part of His Majesty's Dominions in quantities which are substantial having regard to the consumption of that article for the time being in the United Kingdom and that there is no reasonable probability that the article will within a reasonable period be made in His Majesty's Dominions in such substantial quantities:

And whereas the Board of Trade are satisfied on representations made by consumers of the articles specified in the Schedule to this Order that those articles are not made in any part of His Majesty's Dominions in quantities

which are substantial having regard to the consumption of those articles for the time being in the United Kingdom and that there is no reasonable probability that those articles will within a reasonable period be made in His Majesty's Dominions in such substantial quantities:

Now therefore we, being two of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury in pursuance of the powers conferred on us by the said Section 10 of the Finance Act, 1926, and of all other powers enabling us in that behalf hereby order as follows:

1. Such of the articles mentioned in the Schedule to this Order as are not entered under the Customs Acts before the 28th day of November, 1927, or which have not been removed from a bonded warehouse before that date, shall be exempt from the duty imposed by Section one of the Safeguarding of Industries Act, 1921, as amended by the Finance Act, 1926, for a period ending on the 31st day of December, 1928.

UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE ACTS 1920 TO 1926.

REFERENCES TO THE HIGH COURT OF JUSTICE UNDER SECTION 10 (1) OF THE UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE ACT, 1920.

Pursuant to paragraph 6 of the Unemployment Insurance (Determination of Questions) Regulations 1920, the Minister of Labour hereby gives notice of his intention to refer to the High Court for decision the following questions that have arisen in applications made to him for his decision under Section 10 of the Unemployment Insurance Act, 1920, namely, whether the employment of a person as a

domestic servant and barmaid (Total working week 54 hours. Employer is licensee of an inn. Employee spends 14½ hours per week in serving customers in the bar, 1½

hours in washing glasses and cleaning up after closing time and the remaining 38 hours on work of a purely domestic nature in the private part of the house);

domestic servant and shop assistant (Total working week 57 hours. Employed approximately 14½ hours in serving customers in the employer's bakery and confectionery business and for 42½ hours in duties of a purely domestic nature in the residential portion of the premises);

domestic servant and shop assistant (Working week approximately 58 hours. Employed for 32½ hours per week as shop assistant in connection with employer's fish and chip business and for 25½ hours per week on private domestic duties such as cleaning bedrooms);

domestic help and shop assistant (Employer is a tobacconist and confectioner. Employee spends approximately half her time upon duties as a shop assistant and the remaining half upon domestic duties in the private part of the employer's premises);

milk roundsman and agricultural labourer (Total working week 49½ hours of which 26½ hours are occupied in employment as milk roundsman and 23½ hours as agricultural labourer. None of the milk sold is produced on the employer's farm, but it is all purchased by the employer for re-sale);

mill hand and farm hand (Employer is a farmer, miller and coal merchant. He purchases grain for sale and also grinds grain for local farmers. Employee spends about one quarter of his time in the mill and the remainder upon work of an agricultural nature. His duties in the mill are not highly skilled; they mainly consist in seeing that a sufficient and regular supply of grain is feeding the mill and that the meal is running into the sacks properly. When the sacks are full he weighs and stores them);

skilled bricklayer employed on a private estate (Responsible for the general maintenance, improvements and repairs of all estate buildings. During the greater part of the year employed exclusively on work of this nature, but during harvest time, for two or three weeks employed solely in assisting in haymaking);

chauffeur, gardener and general domestic help (Total working week of 48 hours. In the summer months employed approximately 16 hours a week in driving his employer, who is a doctor, on his rounds, and the remaining 33 hours per week in duties of a domestic nature in and about the doctor's house and garden. In the winter months employed for approximately 25 hours a week in driving the doctor on his rounds and the remaining 24 hours per week in domestic work);

is or is not employment within the meaning of the Unemployment Insurance Act 1920.

Under the Rules of the Supreme Court, Order LV, B, Rule 28, any person who claims to be affected by the decisions to be given in the above mentioned cases may apply to the Judge for leave to intervene.

The cases have been set down in the High Court, and, it is hoped, will be heard in the near future.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz. :—

REGULATIONS RESPECTING OPEN COMPETITIVE EXAMINATIONS FOR THE SITUATIONS OF ASSISTANT INSPECTOR OF TAXES IN THE INLAND REVENUE DEPARTMENT AND JUNIOR ASSISTANT AUDITOR IN THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH.

These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.

1. The limits of age for this situation are 21 and 24. Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the 1st March or the 1st

September of the year in which they are examined, according as the examination is held in the first or second half of the year.

In reckoning age for competition the following allowances will be made, viz. :—

(a) Candidates who have served or are serving in the Army, Navy, or Air Force may deduct from their actual age any time during which they have so served.

(b) Candidates who have served in any established civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding two years which they may have spent in such service.

2. No person will be eligible who is not a natural-born British subject and the child of a father also a natural-born British subject; provided that exception may be made in the case of persons serving in a civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners and provided that exception may be made as regards the father in the case of candidates who served in His Majesty's Armed Forces during the Great War between the 4th August, 1914, and the 11th November, 1918.

3. Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners as to their health and character. Female candidates must be unmarried or widows, and will be required to resign their appointments on marriage.

4. No person actually serving in the Army, Navy, or Air Force will be eligible for admission to the examination unless he produces to the Civil Service Commissioners, when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to attend the examination, dated before the commencement of the competition, and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued.

Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to attend the Examination before the commencement of the competition.

Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

In Section A candidates take all subjects; in Section B the candidate may offer subjects up to a maximum mark of 600, provided that not more than four of the subjects numbered 11 to 16, or more than two of the subjects numbered 17 to 23, or more than two of the subjects numbered 29 to 33 may be offered.

A candidate desiring to offer any of the subjects 30 to 33 must produce evidence satisfactory to the Civil Service Commissioners of laboratory training in an institution of university rank. For Geography, other equivalent training will be required.

6. Candidates must obtain such an aggregate of marks in the examination as a whole, apart from the *viva voce* marks, as to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners.

7. Candidates whose handwriting is not easily legible will suffer a deduction of marks on that account.

8. When vacancies are offered for competition both for Assistant Inspectors of Taxes and for Junior Assistant Auditors, candidates will be allowed to choose, according to their place on the list, between the two classes, so far as vacancies are available.

9. Applications for permission to attend an Examination must be made at such time and in such manner as the Civil Service Commissioners may appoint.

10. A fee of £6 will be required from every candidate attending an Examination.

The Civil Service Commissioners further give notice that an Open Competitive Examination will be held in London under the foregoing Regulations, the written work commencing on the 10th July, 1928.

Not fewer than 30 vacancies for Assistant Inspectors of Taxes will be filled on the result of this examination, if so many candidates should be found to be qualified in all respects. It cannot yet be stated whether any vacancies for Junior Assistant Auditors will be filled on the result of this competition; an announcement on this point will be made at a later stage.

No person will be admitted to Examination from whom the Secretary of the Civil Service Commission has not received, on or before the 10th May, 1928, an application, in the Candidate's own handwriting, on a prescribed form, which may be obtained from the Secretary at once.

BASINGSTOKE.

Whereas the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Basingstoke (hereinafter called the Corporation), being the Urban Sanitary Authority for the said Borough, have made application to the Minister of Health for the issue of a Provisional Order under Sections 297 and 303 of the Public Health Act, 1875, partially to repeal, alter or amend the Local Act 10. Geo. IV, Cap. xlii, relating to markets in the town of Basingstoke, so as:—

(1) To repeal the said Local Act except the Preamble and sections 1, 33, 34, 67, 69 and 70.

(2) To render applicable to the Markets of the Corporation the provisions of the Public Health Act, 1875, and the enactments incorporated therewith with regard to Markets in addition to or in substitution for the provisions of the said Local Act.

NOTE.—Such an Order if made and confirmed by Parliament would (among other things) remove certain limitations imposed by the Local Act on the charges which the Corporation may make.

(3) For the several purposes of the Application or for purposes connected with, incidental to, or consequent on those purposes to make any such alteration or amendment of the said Local Act, or of any other Local Act or of any Act confirming a Provisional Order made in pursuance of any of the Sanitary Acts or of the Public Health Act, 1875, and in force in the said Borough as may be necessary or desirable.

And whereas it is proposed that a Provisional Order should be issued in compliance with the said Application.
