UNIVERSITY OF OXFORD.

**STATUTE APPROVED BY CONGREGATION ON
TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 29, 1927.**

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend Sectio I. § 1. cl. 10 of Titulus VII of the Statutes of the University of Oxford so as to remove an inconsistency: NOW THE SAID UNIVERSITY in exercise of the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, and of all other powers enabling it, ENACTS, SUBJECT TO THE APPROVAL OF HIS MAJESTY IN COUNCIL, AS FOLLOWS.

In Statt. Tit. VII. Sect. I. § 1. cl. 10, the words " and of his having passed the Examinations required for the Degree of Bachelor of Arts " shall be struck out.

FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE. (BIRMINGHAM PIG MARKET) ORDER OF 1927 (No. 2).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Market to which this Order applies.

1. The Pig Market at Montague Street in the city of Birmingham is hereby authorised by the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries to be used for the purposes of this Order, provided that whilst being so used no animals shall be kept in or moved into the market other than swine moved with a licence under this Order.

Movement of Swine to Market.

2.—(1) Swine intended for immediate slaughter may, notwithstanding the provisions of any Order made by the Minister restricting the movement of animals into an Infected Area, be moved to the market to which this Order applies with a licence granted by the Local Authority of the city of Birmingham, provided that no such licence shall be granted unless the owner of the swine shall sign and give to the Local Authority an undertaking in the form set out in the Schedule to this Order.

(2) Swine moved to the market to which this Order applies shall either be moved from the market under and in accordance with the conditions of a licence granted under Article 3 of this Order within 36 hours of their arrival at the market, or shall be slaughtered at the Montague Street slaughterhouse, Birmingham, immediately after the expiration of 36 hours from the time of their arrival at the market.

Removal of Swine from Market.

3. Swine moved to the market to which this Order applies with a licence granted under this Order shall not be moved therefrom except with a licence of an Inspector of the Local Authority of the City of Birmingham or to any place other than a slaughterhouse or bacon factory approved by the Inspector and situate in the area to which the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1927

(No. 57) or any Order amending that Order for the time being applies, provided that no such licence shall be granted unless the owner of the swine shall sign and give to the Local Authority an undertaking in the form set out in the Schedule to this Order, and also provided that no such licence shall be deemed to authorise the movement of any animals out of the said Area.

Detention and Slaughter.

4. Swine moved to a slaughterhouse or bacon factory with a licence under this Order, shall be there detained until they are slaughtered, and shall be slaughtered within 36 hours after their arrival.

Undertakings to be Transmitted to Ministry.

5. The undertakings when received by the Local Authority shall be forthwith transmitted to the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries.

Conditions of Movement.

6. Swine moved under this Order shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay to the place of destination specified in the licence and not elsewhere, and shall so far as practicable be kept separate from all animals which are not being moved or have not been moved with a licence under this Order.

Licences.

7. Movement licences granted under this Order shall, unless a shorter period is therein specified by the Inspector granting the same, be available for six days including the day of the date thereof and no longer.

Short Title.

8. This Order may be cited as the FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (BIRMINGHAM PIG MARKET) ORDER OF 1927 (No. 2), and shall be read with the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1927 (No. 57) and any Order amending that Order.

SHEEP SCAB MOVEMENT AREAS.

The following Areas are now "Movement Areas" for the purposes of Part I of the Sheep (Double Dipping) Order of 1920:—

Inverness.—An Area comprising the islands known as the Outer Hebrides (*except the islands of St. Kilda, Dune, Soay and Boreray*), in the county of Inverness.

Ross and Cromarty.—An Area comprising the island of Lewis, including the smaller islands adjacent thereto, in the county of Ross and Cromarty.

In the administrative county of Derby.

The parishes of Hope Woodlands, Derwent, Edale, Dore and Totley, and such parts of the parishes of Charlesworth, Hayfield, Chapel-en-le-Frith, Peak Forest, Castleton, Aston, Thornhill, Bamford, Outseats and Hathersage, as lie to the south, east and north of the following boundary, namely:—

Commencing at the point of intersection of the boundaries of Cheshire, Derbyshire and Yorkshire, near Saltersbrook Bridge, then in a westerly direction along the county boundary of Cheshire and Derby to Crowden Station, thence along the road via Torside, and the Devils Elbow to the point where it reaches the boundary of the borough of Glossop, thence along the eastern boundary of the said boundary, to the point where it meets the main road to Hayfield, thence in a southerly direction along that road via the Grouse Inn to Hayfield, thence continuing in a generally south-easterly

direction via Chinley Head and Bole Hill to Chapel-en-le-Frith, thence in an easterly direction along the road via Laneside to the Inn at Sparrowpit, thence along the road via Perryfoot, Oxlow House and the Winnats to Castleton, thence in an easterly and south-easterly direction along the main road via Hope to Hathersage, thence by the road under the Railway from Hathersage to Grindleford, west of Hathersage Station, to Grindleford Bridge, thence in a north-easterly direction along the road from Grindleford Bridge to Sheffield, to the point where it meets the western boundary of the parish of Totley, near Fox House Inn, thence in a northerly direction along the western boundaries of the parishes of Totley and Dore, to the county boundary, thence in a generally north-easterly and northerly direction to the point of commencement.

In the county of the West Riding of Yorkshire.

The parish of Bradfield; so much of the parish of Langsett as lies to the south and west of the road from Sheffield via Langsett and Crow Edge to Hepworth, and such part of the city and county borough of Sheffield as lies to the west of the following boundary, namely:—

Commencing at the county boundary near Ringinglow, thence via Ringinglow, Andwell Lane, Blackbrook Road, Rails Road, Bingley Lane and Hopwood Lane to the city boundary.

NOTE.—The term "administrative county" used in the description of Areas is the district for which a county council is elected under the Local Government Act, 1888, and includes all boroughs therein which are not county boroughs.
