(No. 57) or any Order amending that Order for the time being applies, provided that no such licence shall be granted unless the owner of the swine shall sign and give to the Local Authority an undertaking in the form set out in the Schedule to this Order, and also provided that no such licence shall be deemed to authorise the movement of any animals out of the said Area.

Detention and Slaughter.

4. Swine moved to a slaughterhouse or bacon factory with a licence under this Order, shall be there detained until they are slaughtered, and shall be slaughtered within 36 hours after their arrival.

Undertakings to be Transmitted to Ministry.

5. The undertakings when received by the Local Authority shall be forthwith transmitted to the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries.

Conditions of Movement.

6. Swine moved under this Order shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay to the place of destination specified in the licence and not elsewhere, and shall so far as practicable be kept separate from all animals which are not being moved or have not been moved with a licence under this Order.

Licences.

7. Movement licences granted under this Order shall, unless a shorter period is therein specified by the Inspector granting the same, be available for six days including the day of the date thereof and no longer.

Short Title.

8. This Order may be cited as the FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (BIRMINGHAM PIG MARKET) ORDER OF 1927 (No. 2), and shall be read with the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1927 (No. 57) and any Order amending that Order.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Declaration of Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area.

1. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925.

Short Title.

2. This Order may be cited as the FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1927 (No. 57) and shall be read with the Order referred to in Article 1
