FOOT - AND - MOUTH DISEASE (IN-
FECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1928
(No. 13).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

PART I.

Contraction of Certain Infected Areas.

1.—(1) The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1928 (No. 7) shall be read and have effect as if the Areas described in the Schedule to this Order were respectively substituted for the Infected Areas (numbered 1, 3 and 10) described in the Schedule to that Order.

(4) The Areas (numbered 3 and 10) described in the Schedule to this Order shall cease to be Infected Areas for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925, as from the third day of February, nineteen hundred and twenty-eight.

Short Title.

3. This Order may be cited as the FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1928 (No. 13).
