In the Matter of BRYANT & MAY Limited, and in the Matter of the Companies (Consolidation) Act, 1908.

NOTICE is hereby given, that a petition was, on the 11th day of January, 1928, presented to His Majesty's High Court of Justice by the above named Company to confirm an alteration and extension of the said Company's objects proposed to be effected by a Special Resolution of the said Company passed and confirmed at Extraordinary General Meetings of the Company, held on the 10th and 25th days of October, 1927, respectively, and which Resolution is in the words and figures following:—

"That the provisions of Clause 3 of the Memorandum of Association of the Company with respect to its objects be altered in manner following, that is to say, by inserting therein the following new paragraphs after paragraph (j), namely:—

"(j1). The entering into partnership or any arrangement for sharing profits, union or fusion of interests, co-operation, joint adventure, reciprocal concession or otherwise, with any person, firm, corporation, or company carrying on or engaged in or about to carry on or engage in, any business or transaction which is capable of being conducted so as directly or indirectly to benefit this Company, and the taking or otherwise acquiring of shares and securities of any such corporation or company, and the selling, holding, re-issuing with or without guarantee of or otherwise dealing with the same.

"(j2). The subscribing for, taking, purchasing or otherwise acquiring and holding of shares in or securities of any other company having objects altogether or in part similar to those of this Company, or carrying on any business capable of being conducted so as directly or indirectly to benefit this Company.

"(j3). The entering into any arrangements with any Governments, or authorities supreme, municipal, local or otherwise that may seem conducive to the Company's objects, or any of them, and the obtaining from any such Government or authority and carrying out exercising and complying with any such arrangements, rights, privileges and concessions.

"(j4). The establishment, provision and support of or aiding in the establishment, provision and support of Associations, Institutions, Funds, Trusts, Clubs, Recreation Grounds, and conveniences calculated to benefit employees or ex-employees of the Company or their connections and dependents, and the granting of pensions and superannuation or other allowances or contribution to funds for such purposes, making payments towards insurance, and the subscribing or guaranteeing money for any charitable or benevolent objects, or for any exhibitions or for any public, general or useful objects.

"(j5). The promotion of any company or companies for the purpose of acquiring all or any part of the property, rights or liabilities of this Company, and for any other purpose which may seem directly or indirectly calculated to benefit or advance directly or indirectly the objects of this Company, or the interests of its members, and paying or contributing to the expenses attending such promotion and the formation and establishment of any such company, and the acquisition by and transfer to any such company of any property to be acquired by it, and underwriting, subscribing, guaranteeing or procuring subscriptions for the whole or any part of the capital or securities of any such company.

"(j6). The construction, maintenance and alteration of any buildings, plant, machinery, fixtures, railways, tramways, waterways, docks, or other works necessary or convenient for the purposes of the Company.
