Schedule IV., Para. 31 ...	<p>For paragraph 31 the following paragraph shall be substituted :—</p> <p>“31. In order to obviate the increased risk of collision which exists on air traffic routes, the following rules shall, so far as it is safe and practicable, be observed when flying on or in the vicinity of such routes :</p> <p>(a) Every aircraft when flying by compass along the straight line (rhumb line) joining two points on an air traffic route in common use, shall keep such line at least 500 yards on its left.</p> <p>(b) Every aircraft following an air traffic route, which has been officially recognized, shall keep such route at least 300 yards on its left.</p> <p>(c) Every aircraft which, in the vicinity of a route frequented by aircraft, is following a line of land marks, such as a road, railway, river, canal or coast-line, etc., shall keep such line of landmarks at least 300 yards on its left.</p> <p>(d) An aircraft shall not fly keeping any of the lines or routes above referred to on its right, except at a distance therefrom sufficient to avoid aircraft following such lines or routes in accordance with these rules.</p> <p>(e) When crossing one of these lines or routes above referred to, an aircraft shall cross it at right angles as rapidly as possible and as high as reasonably practicable.”</p>
„ Para. 33 ...	<p>At the end of paragraph 33 the following words shall be inserted :—</p> <p>“Every aircraft when flying beneath clouds shall always do so, so far as it is safe and practicable, at such a distance below the clouds as will enable it readily to see and be seen.”</p>

**WHEREAS** the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 24th day of November, 1927, in the words and figures following, that is to say :—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Cowley and the Benefice (being an United Benefice) of Coberley with Colesborne, and for effecting an alteration of the boundaries of the Parish of the Benefice of Brimpsfield by the annexation thereto of a portion of the contiguous Parish of the Benefice of Great Witcombe and a portion of the contiguous Parish of the said Benefice of Cowley, all of which Benefices are situate in the County of Gloucester and in the Diocese of Gloucester :

“ Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Arthur Cayley, Bishop of Gloucester, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Cowley and Coberley with Colesborne and upon certain alterations of boundaries affecting

the said Benefices of Cowley, Brimpsfield and Great Witcombe duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Gloucester and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices of Cowley and Coberley with Colesborne and the annexation to the said Parish of Brimpsfield of so much of the hamlet or locality of Birdlip as is at present included in the said Parishes of Cowley and Great Witcombe and also recommended the terms for effecting the said union and alteration of boundaries and the said Bishop of Gloucester signified in writing his approval of the said Report :

“ And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the said union of Benefices and alteration of boundaries based upon the terms recommended in the said Report :

“ And whereas all of the said Benefices of Cowley, Coberley with Colesborne, Brimpsfield and Great Witcombe are now full, the Reverend John Hardinge Leigh Giffard being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Cowley, the Reverend William Bernard Atherton being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Coberley with Colesborne, the Reverend Percy Charles Wyndham Earée being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Brimpsfield and the Reverend George Robert Taylor being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Great Witcombe :

“ Now therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Arthur Cayley, Bishop of Gloucester (in testimony whereof he has
