AT PICCADILLY (DOVER STREET), W.

Six Hackney Carriages :

In the centre of roadway, commencing at a point fifteen feet East of refuge at junction of Dover Street, and extending Eastward to refuge West of St. James's Street.

Front of vehicles toward the West.

NOTE.—This Standing will be available only between the hours of 7 p.m. and 5 a.m., except on Sundays, when it may be used throughout the day. It is to be fed exclusively by carriages from the Standing in St. James's Street, at its Junction with Piccadilly.

12th January, 1928 :—

AT ARTILLERY ROW, WESTMINSTER.

Four Hackney Carriages :

On the South-east side of roadway, commencing at lamp post opposite Howick Place, and extending South-westward, by kerb, as far as necessary for four carriages.

Front of vehicles toward the North-east.

Provided that no Hackney Carriage shall be suffered to stand across any street or thoroughfare, or opposite the end of any street or carriageway, or upon any place where foot passengers usually cross the carriageway.

## MERCHANDISE MARKS ACT, 1926.

## REPORTS OF THE STANDING COMMITTEE.

With reference to the notices which were published in certain issues of the London, Edinburgh and Belfast Gazettes regarding references made by the Board of Trade to the Standing Committee under the Merchandise Marks Act, 1926, namely :—

(a) in the issue of the said Gazettes of the 24th June, 1927, in respect of imported Boots, Shoes and Slippers of all descriptions; and

(b) in the issue of the said Gazettes of the 8th July, 1927, in respect of the following descriptions of imported Pottery :—

Tiles—

Floor tiles for tessellated pavements and mosaics.

Glazed and enamelled tiles.

Sanitary Ware—

Sanitary earthenware, white or cane and white.

Enamelled sanitary ware of fireclay.

Other sanitary ware (not including drain pipes).

China and translucent pottery, including all pottery known as china or porcelain.

Electrical ware of all kinds (including insulators).

Door fittings, and runners or castors for bedsteads or other furniture.

General earthenware and semi-porcelain of all descriptions (excluding terra-cotta ware, stoneware, and red and brown pottery).

Jet, Rockingham and Samian.
