Marlow to Maidenhead upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Stubbings from the said New Parish of Cookham Dean, and extending thence north westward along the last mentioned boundary (thereby following the middle of the last mentioned road) for a distance of 41 chains or thereabouts to the point at Park Corner where it meets the boundary which divides the Parish of Bisham, in the said County and Diocese from the said New Parish of Cookham Dean, and extending thence north eastward along the last mentioned boundary (thereby following the western boundary of Pinkney's Green) for a distance of 18 chains or thereabouts to a point due west of the junction of the track which leads across Pinkney's Green to Cookham Dean Common with the roadway leading past the western and northern sides of the house and premises known as Hartwells, and extending from the said point on the last mentioned boundary in a straight line due east for a distance of 7 chains or thereabouts to the junction of the last mentioned track and roadway, and extending thence first north eastward, then eastward, then northward and then again eastward along the middle of such roadway for a distance of 10 chains or thereabouts to its eastern end where it meets the footpath leading into Malders Lane, and extending thence south eastward along the middle of the last men-tioned footpath (thereby crossing the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Cookham Dean from the said Parish of Cookham) for a distance of 14 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Malders Lane, and extending thence north eastward along the middle of Malders Lane for a distance of 68 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road leading from Furze Platt to Cookham, and extending thence north eastward to and along the middle of the footpath leading from such junction of roads to Upper Cookham Road for a distance of 201 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Upper Cookham Road, and extending thence in a straight line due east for a distance of 2½ chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the said Wycombe branch line of railway and extending thence southward along the middle of the same line of railway (thereby crossing the boundary which divides the said Parish of Cookham from the said New Parish of Saint Luke, Maidenhead) for a distance of 1 mile and 16 chains or thereahouts to the centre of the bridge which carries such line of railway across Marlow Road, at which point the said imaginary line commenced.'

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Oxford.
